SENATE BILL No. 390

May 23, 2013, Introduced by Senators MOOLENAAR, BOOHER, BIEDA, CASPERSON, EMMONS, SCHUITMAKER, WALKER, BRANDENBURG, HANSEN, KOWALL and PAVLOV and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code," by amending sections 312a and 312b (MCL 257.312a and 257.312b), section 312b as amended by 2004 PA 362.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 312a. (1) A person, before operating a motorcycle, OTHER

THAN AN AUTOCYCLE, upon a public street or highway in this state,

shall procure a motorcycle indorsement on the HIS OR HER operator's

or chauffeur's license. The license shall be issued, suspended,

revoked, canceled, or renewed in accordance with and governed by

this act.

(2) A person, before operating a moped upon a highway shall procure a special restricted license to operate a moped unless the person has a valid operator's or chauffeur's license. A special

- 1 restricted license to operate a moped may be issued to a person 15
- 2 years of age or older if the person satisfies the secretary of
- 3 state that he is competent to operate a moped with safety. The
- 4 secretary of state shall not require a road test before issuance of
- 5 a special restricted license to operate a moped.
- 6 (3) A special restricted license to operate a moped shall
- 7 expire on the birthday of the person to whom it is issued in the
- 8 fourth year following the date of issuance. A license shall not be
- 9 issued for a period longer than 4 years. A person issued a license
- 10 to operate a moped shall pay \$7.50 for an original license and
- 11 \$6.00 for a renewal license. The money received and collected under
- 12 this subsection shall be deposited in the state treasury to the
- 13 credit of the general fund. The secretary of state shall refund out
- 14 of the fees collected to each county or municipality, acting as an
- 15 examining officer, \$2.50 for each applicant examined for an
- 16 original license and \$1.00 for a renewal license.
- Sec. 312b. (1) Before a person who is less than 18 years of
- 18 age is issued an original motorcycle endorsement on an operator's
- 19 or chauffeur's license, the person shall pass an examination as
- 20 required by this section and a motorcycle safety course as provided
- 21 in section 811a or 811b.
- 22 (2) Before a person who is 18 years of age or older is issued
- 23 an original motorcycle endorsement on an operator's or chauffeur's
- 24 license, the person shall pass an examination as required by this
- 25 section. A person who fails this examination 2 or more times is
- 26 required to successfully complete a motorcycle safety course as
- 27 provided in section 811a or 811b. Each written examination given an

- 1 applicant for a motorcycle endorsement on an operator's or
- 2 chauffeur's license as provided in section 309 shall also include
- 3 subjects designed to cover a motorcycle. A person shall pass an
- 4 examination that shall include a driving test designed to test the
- 5 competency of the applicant for the first motorcycle endorsement on
- 6 an operator's or chauffeur's license to operate a motorcycle upon
- 7 the roads and highways of this state with safety to himself or
- 8 herself and other persons and property. All examinations shall be
- 9 administered as provided in this act. The requirement of a
- 10 motorcycle driving skills test shall be waived for an applicant who
- 11 has successfully completed a motorcycle safety course conducted by
- 12 a school or business enterprise as provided in section 811a or
- 13 811b. The motorcycle safety course skills test shall meet or exceed
- 14 the motorcycle skills test from the secretary of state. The
- 15 requirement of a motorcycle driving skills test may be waived if
- 16 the applicant has a valid license or endorsement to operate a
- 17 motorcycle from another state.
- 18 (3) A motorcycle endorsement issued to a person who operates a
- 19 3-wheeled motorcycle or an OTHER THAN AN autocycle shall be IS
- 20 restricted to operation of that type of motorcycle and does not
- 21 permit operation of a 2-wheeled motorcycle. The secretary of state
- 22 shall develop a driving test specifically pertaining to an
- 23 autocycle or TO a 3-wheeled motorcycle OTHER THAN AN AUTOCYCLE.
- 24 (4) The secretary of state is responsible for establishing and
- 25 conducting the motorcycle operator driving skills test and shall
- 26 promulgate rules under the administrative procedures act of 1969,
- 27 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, for purposes of this subsection.

- 1 An audit of the motorcycle safety fund shall be conducted by the
- 2 office of the auditor general to determine compliance with the
- 3 requirement that funds are being withdrawn only in relation to this
- 4 act. A copy of the audit shall be transmitted to the legislature
- 5 upon completion.
- 6 (5) The secretary of state may enter into an agreement with
- 7 another public or private corporation or agency to conduct a
- 8 driving skills test required under this section. Before the
- 9 secretary of state authorizes a person to administer a
- 10 corporation's or agency's driver skills testing operations or
- 11 authorizes an examiner to conduct a driving skills test, that
- 12 person or examiner must complete both a state and federal bureau of
- 13 investigation fingerprint based criminal history check through the
- 14 department of state police. In an agreement with another public or
- 15 private corporation or agency to conduct a driving skills test
- 16 under this section, the secretary of state shall prescribe the
- 17 method and examination criteria to be followed by the corporation,
- 18 agency, or examiner when conducting the driving skills test and the
- 19 form of the certification to be issued to a person who
- 20 satisfactorily completes a driving skills test. For administering
- 21 and overseeing a third party motorcycle testing program, the
- 22 secretary of state shall be reimbursed from the motorcycle safety
- 23 fund a total amount that does not exceed 50% of the department's
- 24 1995-1996 fiscal year appropriation for motorcycle testing under
- 25 this section.
- 26 (6) A person who corrupts or attempts to corrupt a
- 27 corporation, agency, or examiner that conducts a driving skills

- 1 test under an agreement entered into with the secretary of state
- 2 under this section by giving, offering, or promising any gift or
- 3 gratuity with the intent to influence the opinion or decision of
- 4 the corporation, agency, or examiner conducting the driving skills
- 5 test is guilty of a felony.
- 6 (7) A designated examining officer appointed or designated by
- 7 the secretary of state who conducts a driving skills test under an
- 8 agreement entered into under this section and who varies from,
- 9 shortens, or in any other way changes the method or examination
- 10 criteria prescribed to be followed under that agreement in
- 11 conducting a driving skills test under this section is guilty of a
- 12 felony.
- 13 (8) A person who forges, counterfeits, or alters a
- 14 satisfactorily completed driving skills test certification issued
- 15 by a designated examining officer appointed or designated by the
- 16 secretary of state under this section is guilty of a felony.

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
