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SENATE BILL No. 553

September 25, 2013, Introduced by Senator KAHN and referred to the Committee on Economic Development.

A bill to amend 1996 PA 376, entitled "Michigan renaissance zone act,"

by amending section 4 (MCL 125.2684), as amended by 2008 PA 116.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. (1) One or more qualified local governmental units may
- 2 apply to the review board to designate the qualified local
- 3 governmental unit or units as a renaissance zone if all of the
- 4 following criteria are met:
 - (a) The geographic area of the proposed renaissance zone is
 - located within the boundaries of the qualified local governmental
- 7 unit or units that apply.
 - (b) The application includes a development plan.
- (c) The proposed renaissance zone is not more than 5,000 acres

- 1 in size.
- 2 (d) The renaissance zone does not contain more than 10
- 3 distinct geographic areas. Except as otherwise provided in this
- 4 subdivision, the minimum size of a distinct geographic area is not
- 5 less than 5 acres. A qualified local governmental unit or units may
- 6 designate not more than 8 distinct geographic areas in each
- 7 renaissance zone to have no minimum size requirement.
- 8 (e) The application includes the proposed duration of
- 9 renaissance zone status, not to exceed 15 years, except as
- 10 otherwise provided in this section.
- 11 (f) If the qualified local governmental unit has an elected
- 12 county executive, the county executive's written approval of the
- 13 application.
- 14 (g) If the qualified local governmental unit is a city, that
- 15 city's mayor's written approval of the application.
- 16 (2) A qualified local governmental unit may submit not more
- 17 than 1 application to the review board for designation as a
- 18 renaissance zone. A resolution provided by a city, village, or
- 19 township under section 7(2) does not constitute an application of a
- 20 city, village, or township for a renaissance zone under this act.
- 21 (3) For a distinct geographic area described in subsection
- 22 (1)(d), a village may include publicly owned land within the
- 23 boundaries of any distinct geographic area.
- 24 (4) Beginning December 1, 2006 through December 31, 2011, a
- 25 qualified local governmental unit or units in which a renaissance
- 26 zone was designated under section 8 or 8a(1) or (3) may designate
- 27 additional distinct geographic areas not to exceed a total of 10

- 1 distinct geographic areas upon application to and approval by the
- 2 board of the Michigan strategic fund if the distinct geographic
- 3 area is located in an eligible distressed area as defined in
- 4 section 11 of the state housing development authority act of 1966,
- 5 1966 PA 346, MCL 125.1411, or is contiguous to an eligible
- 6 distressed area, and if the additional distinct geographic area
- 7 will increase capital investment or job creation. The duration of
- 8 renaissance zone status for the additional distinct geographic
- 9 areas shall not exceed 15 years.
- 10 (5) Through December 31, 2002, if a qualified local
- 11 governmental unit or units designate additional distinct geographic
- 12 areas in a renaissance zone under subsection (4), the qualified
- 13 local governmental unit or units may extend the duration of the
- 14 renaissance zone status of 1 or more distinct geographic areas in
- 15 that renaissance zone until 2017 upon application to and approval
- 16 by the board.
- 17 (6) Through December 31, 2002, a qualified local governmental
- 18 unit or units in which a renaissance zone was designated under
- 19 section 8 or 8a may, upon application to and approval by the board,
- 20 seek to extend the duration of renaissance zone status until 2017.
- 21 Upon application, the board may extend the duration of renaissance
- 22 zone status.
- 23 (7) Through December 31, 2011, a qualified local governmental
- 24 unit or units in which a renaissance zone was designated under
- 25 section 8 or 8a(1) or (3) may, upon application to and approval by
- 26 the board of the Michigan strategic fund, seek to extend the
- 27 duration of renaissance zone status for 1 or more portions of the

- 1 renaissance zone if that zone or portion of a zone is in existence
- 2 as of March 15, 2008, if the extension will increase capital
- 3 investment or job creation, and the county in which the portion or
- 4 portions of the renaissance zone are located consents to extend the
- 5 duration of renaissance zone status. The board of the Michigan
- 6 strategic fund may extend renaissance zone status for 1 or more
- 7 portions of the renaissance zone under this subsection for a period
- 8 of time not to exceed 15 years from the date of the application to
- 9 the board of the Michigan strategic fund under this subsection.
- 10 However, beginning on the effective date of the amendatory act that
- 11 added this sentence, APRIL 29, 2008, if the board of the Michigan
- 12 strategic fund extends the duration of 1 or more portions of a
- 13 renaissance zone under this subsection, the board of the Michigan
- 14 strategic fund may revoke that extension if the board determines
- 15 that increased capital investment or job creation will not begin
- 16 within 1 year of the granting of the extension or otherwise
- 17 violates the terms of the written development agreement between the
- 18 owner of the real property and the board of the Michigan strategic
- 19 fund. Only the qualified local governmental unit that is requesting
- 20 the extension of time may submit the application. If the board of
- 21 the Michigan strategic fund extends the duration of 1 or more
- 22 portions of a renaissance zone, the board of the Michigan strategic
- 23 fund shall enter into a written development agreement with the
- 24 owner of all real property located within the boundaries of the
- 25 portions of the renaissance zone whose duration has been extended.
- 26 The written development agreement shall include, but is not limited
- 27 to, all of the following:

- 1 (a) The duration of the extension.
- 2 (b) The conditions under which the extension is granted.
- 3 (c) The amount of capital investment.
- 4 (d) The number of jobs to be created.
- 5 (e) Any other conditions or requirements reasonably required
- 6 by the board of the Michigan strategic fund.
- 7 (8) IF A QUALIFIED LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNIT IN WHICH A
- 8 RENAISSANCE ZONE WAS DESIGNATED UNDER SECTION 8 RECEIVED APPROVAL
- 9 BY THE MICHIGAN STRATEGIC FUND TO EXTEND THE DURATION OF
- 10 RENAISSANCE ZONE STATUS UNDER SUBSECTION (7) FOR A PERIOD OF 7
- 11 YEARS AND THAT RENAISSANCE ZONE IS LOCATED IN A COUNTY WITH A
- 12 POPULATION OF MORE THAN 190,000 AND LESS THAN 240,000 ACCORDING TO
- 13 THE MOST RECENT DECENNIAL CENSUS, THAT QUALIFIED LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL
- 14 UNIT MAY RESUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE MICHIGAN STRATEGIC FUND
- 15 BEFORE JUNE 30, 2014 TO EXTEND THE DURATION OF RENAISSANCE ZONE
- 16 STATUS FOR AN ADDITIONAL 8 YEARS, NOT TO EXCEED 15 YEARS' TOTAL
- 17 EXTENSION. THE MICHIGAN STRATEGIC FUND MAY GRANT THE EXTENSION IF
- 18 THE EXTENSION SHALL INCREASE CAPITAL INVESTMENT OR JOB CREATION IN
- 19 THIS STATE AND THE OWNER IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE WRITTEN
- 20 AGREEMENT DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (7).
