## **SENATE BILL No. 619**

October 15, 2013, Introduced by Senator HILDENBRAND and referred to the Committee on Economic Development.

A bill to amend 1968 PA 330, entitled
"Private security business and security alarm act,"
by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 14, 16,
17, 19, 22, 25, and 26 (MCL 338.1051, 338.1052, 338.1053, 338.1054,
338.1055, 338.1056, 338.1058, 338.1059, 338.1064, 338.1066,
338.1067, 338.1069, 338.1072, 338.1075, and 338.1076), the title
and sections 3, 4, 8, 9, 14, 17, 19, and 25 as amended by 2010 PA
68, sections 1 and 22 as amended by 2000 PA 411, section 2 as
amended by 2012 PA 581, and section 6 as amended by 2012 PA 419;
and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

An act to license and regulate private security quards,

- 1 private security police, private security guard agencies, AND
- 2 private college security forces; , and security alarm systems
- 3 servicing, installing, operating, and monitoring; to provide
- 4 penalties for violations; to protect the general public against
- 5 unauthorized, unlicensed, and unethical operations by individuals
- 6 engaged in private security activity; or security alarm systems
- 7 sales, installations, service, maintenance, and operations; to
- 8 establish minimum qualifications for individuals as well as AND

- 14 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 15 "private security business and security alarm act".
- Sec. 2. (1) As used in this act:
- 17 (a) "Commission" means the commission on law enforcement
- 18 standards created under section 3 of the commission on law
- 19 enforcement standards act, 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.603.
- 20 (b) "Department" means the department of licensing and
- 21 regulatory affairs, except that in reference to the regulation of
- 22 private security police and private college security forces,
- 23 department means the department of state police.
- 24 (c) "Governing board" means a board of regents, board of
- 25 trustees, board of governors, board of control, or other governing
- 26 body of an institution of higher education.
- 27 (d) "Licensee" means a person licensed under this act.

- (e) "Person" means an individual, limited liability company,
   corporation, PARTNERSHIP, or other legal entity.
- 3 (f) "Private college security force" means a security force4 authorized under section 37.
- (g) "Private security guard" means an individual or an
  employee of an employer who offers, for hire, to provide protection
  of property on the premises of another, and includes an employee of
  a private college security force.

  10 organization or educational institution primarily responsible for
  11 the protection of property on the premises of the business
  12 organization, but does not include a private college security

- 14 (i) "Security alarm system" means a detection device or an

  15 assembly of equipment and devices that is arranged to signal the

  16 presence of a hazard that requires urgent attention and is remotely

  17 monitored by a central monitoring system. Security alarm system

  18 includes any system that can electronically cause an expected

  19 response by a law enforcement agency to a premises by means of the
- 21 notification, or video signal, or any combination of these signals,
- 22 to a remote monitoring location on or off the premises. Security

- 23 alarm system does not include any of the following:

- 27 (iii) An alarm system that monitors temperature, humidity, or

- 5 station and does not set off an audible alarm.
- 6 (j) "Security alarm system agent" means an individual employed
- 7 by a security alarm system contractor whose duties include the
- 8 altering, installing, maintaining, moving, repairing, replacing,
- 9 selling, servicing, monitoring, responding to, or causing others to
- 10 respond to a security alarm system.
- 11 (k) "Security alarm system contractor" means a person engaged
- 12 in the installation, maintenance, alteration, monitoring, or
- 13 servicing of security alarm systems or who responds to a security
- 14 alarm system. Security alarm system contractor does not include a
- 15 business that only sells or manufactures security alarm systems
- 16 unless the business services security alarm systems, installs
- 17 security alarm systems, monitors or arranges for the monitoring of
- 18 a security alarm system, or responds to security alarm systems at a
- 19 protected premises.
- 20 (I) (l) "Security business" means a person engaged in offering,
- 21 arranging, or providing 1 or more of the following services:
- 22 (i) Security alarm system installation, service, maintenance,
- 23 alteration, or monitoring.

- 26 (2) All businesses that provide security alarm systems for the

- 2 pursuit of their duties are subject to this act.
- 3 (3) A communications common carrier that provides
- 4 communications channels under tariffs for the transmission of
- 5 signals in connection with an alarm system is not subject to this
- 6 act.
- 7 (2) (4) A railroad policeman who is appointed and commissioned
- 8 under the railroad code of 1993, 1993 PA 354, MCL 462.101 to
- 9 462.451, is not subject to this act.
- 10 (5) A system provider, as defined in section 2 of the security
- 11 alarm systems act, that is registered under the security alarm
- 12 systems act, is not subject to this act.
- Sec. 3. (1) Unless licensed under this act, a sole
- 14 proprietorship, firm, company, partnership, limited liability
- 15 company, or corporation PERSON shall not engage in the business of
- 16 security alarm system contractor, private security guard, private
- 17 security police, private college security force, OR patrol service
- 18 or AS an agency furnishing ANY OF those services. A person  $\tau$
- 19 firm, company, partnership, limited liability company, or
- 20 corporation—shall not advertise its business to be that of security
- 21 alarm system contractor, security alarm system agent, private
- 22 security guard agency , or an agency furnishing those services
- 23 without having first obtained from the department a license to do

- 25 conducted, managed, or maintained for the conduct of that business.
- 26 (2) A person shall not sell, install, operate, adjust, arrange
- 27 for, or contract to provide a device which upon activation, either

- 1 mechanically, electronically, or by any other means, initiates the
- 2 automatic calling or dialing of, or makes a connection directly to,
- 3 a telephone assigned to a public service, utility, or police
- 4 agency, for the purpose of delivering a recorded message, without
- 5 first receiving written permission from that service, utility, or
- 6 agency.
- 7 (2) (3) A person who THAT violates this section is guilty of a
- 8 felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a
- 9 fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both.
- 10 Sec. 4. The department may issue separate licenses to security
- 11 alarm system contractors, private college security forces, private
- 12 security police, and private security guard agencies. This section
- 13 does not prevent a private detective or private investigator
- 14 licensed under the professional investigator licensure act, 1965 PA
- 15 285, MCL 338.821 to 338.851, from performing the services of a
- 16 private security guard or private security police except that a
- 17 private security guard or private security police may not perform
- 18 the services of a private detective or private investigator without
- 19 obtaining a private detective or private investigator license.
- Sec. 5. The department, upon IF IT RECEIVES A proper
- 21 application and upon being IS satisfied that the applicant is
- 22 qualified, THE DEPARTMENT shall issue the applicant a license to
- 23 conduct business as an alarm system contractor or a private
- 24 security guard or agency for a period of 2 years from date of
- 25 issuance. Upon the issuance of AN APPLICANT THAT IS ISSUED a
- 26 license to conduct business as an alarm system contractor or a
- 27 private security guard or agency , the applicant shall not be UNDER

- 3 Sec. 6. (1) The department shall issue a license to conduct
- 4 business as a security alarm system contractor or a private

- 8 principal license holder of the applicant if the applicant is not
- 9 an individual, meets all of the following qualifications:

- 21 (f) Has not been WAS NOT dishonorably discharged from a branch
- 22 of the United States military service.
- 23 (g) If the applicant is applying for a private security guard
- 24 or agency license, meets any of the following:
- 25 (i) Was engaged in the private security guard or agency
- 26 business on his or her own account in another state for a period of
- 27 at least 3 years.

- 1 (ii) Was engaged in the private security guard or agency
- 2 business for a period of at least 4 years as an employee of the
- 3 holder of a certificate of authority to conduct a private security
- 4 guard or agency business and has experience reasonably equivalent
- 5 to at least 4 years of full-time guard work in a supervisory
- 6 capacity with rank above that of patrolman.
- 7 (iii) Was employed in law enforcement as a certified police
- 8 officer on a full-time basis for at least 4 years for a city,
- 9 county, or state government or for the United States government.
- 10 (iv) Was engaged in the private security guard or agency
- 11 business as an employee or on his or her own account or as a
- 12 security administrator in private business for at least 2 years on
- 13 a full-time basis, and is a graduate with a baccalaureate degree or
- 14 its equivalent in the field of police administration or industrial
- 15 security from an accredited college or university.
- 16 (v) While on active duty as a member of the armed forces,
- 17 served as a military police officer or in an equivalent job
- 18 classification for at least 2 years; was honorably discharged from
- 19 that military service; and has, and provides with his or her
- 20 application an affidavit signed by a commanding officer,
- 21 supervisor, or military superior with direct knowledge of the
- 22 applicant's service that he or she has, entry-level experience in
- 23 or basic knowledge of each of the following:
- 24 (A) Enforcing rules, regulations, and guidelines.
- 25 (B) Providing security and physical protection.
- 26 (C) Area and site security operations.
- 27 (D) Overseeing prisoners and correctional facilities.

- 1 (E) Reconnaissance and surveillance.
- 2 (h) If the applicant is applying for a security alarm system
- 3 contractor license, has been lawfully engaged in either or both of
- 4 the following:
- 5 (i) A security alarm system contractor business on his or her
- 6 own account for a period of not less than 3 years.
- 8 of not less than 4 years as an employee of the holder of a
- 9 certificate of authority to conduct a security alarm system
- 10 contractor business, and has experience reasonably equivalent to at
- 11 least 4 years of full-time work in a supervisory capacity or passes
- 12 a written exam administered by the department designed to measure
- 13 his or her knowledge and training in security alarm systems.
- 14 (H) (i) Provided the department the bond or surety required
- 15 under section 9.
- 16 (I) (j) Has not been adjudged insane, unless he or she has
- 17 been adjudged restored to sanity by court order.
- 18 (J) (k)—Is not subject to any outstanding warrants for his or
- 19 her arrest.
- 20 (2) If a person now doing or seeking to do business in this
- 21 state is applying for a license under this section, the resident
- 22 manager shall comply with the applicable qualifications of this
- 23 section.
- 24 (3) As used in this section, "armed forces" means that term as
- 25 defined in section 2 of the veteran right to employment services
- 26 act, 1994 PA 39, MCL 35.1092.
- 27 Sec. 8. (1) Each applicant shall sign and verify the AN

- 1 application FOR A LICENSE UNDER THIS ACT. Each application shall
- 2 contain at least all of the following INFORMATION:
- 3 (a) The name and principal address where the individual or
- 4 business entity PERSON is located in this state.
- 5 (b) The address and location of any branch office of the
- 6 business.
- 7 (c) The certificate of incorporation of the business, if
- 8 applicable.
- 9 (2) Each applicant WHO IS AN INDIVIDUAL shall submit 2
- 10 passport-quality photographs of the applicant with the application.
- 11 If the applicant is a business entity, NOT AN INDIVIDUAL the

- 19 integrity of the 1 OF THE FOLLOWING, AS APPLICABLE:

- 21 (B) IF the applicant is a firm, company, partnership, limited

- 10 (3) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT ISSUE A LICENSE UNDER THIS ACT
- 11 UNLESS THE APPLICANT PAYS THE DEPARTMENT 1 OF THE FOLLOWING FEES,
- 12 AS APPROPRIATE:
- 13 (A) IF THE APPLICANT IS AN INDIVIDUAL, \$200.00.
- 14 (B) IF THE APPLICANT IS NOT AN INDIVIDUAL, \$300.00.
- 15 (4) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT ISSUE A LICENSE TO A SECURITY
- 16 ALARM SYSTEM CONTRACTOR UNDER THIS ACT UNLESS THE APPLICANT
- 17 PROVIDES the department a bond in the sum-PRINCIPAL AMOUNT of
- 18 \$25,000.00. The bond shall be conditioned upon ON the faithful and
- 19 honest conduct of the business by the applicant and shall be
- 20 approved by the department. In lieu of a bond, the AN applicant may
- 21 furnish a policy of insurance issued by an insurer authorized to do
- 22 business in this state naming THAT NAMES the licensee and the state
- 23 as coinsureds in the amount of \$25,000.00 for property damages,

- 25 agency. , or any of those persons as listed, in section 2. A person
- 26 shall not display OFFER for sale a badge, shield, identification
- 27 card, or certificate of license THAT, by which—IF USED BY the

- 1 holder, might mislead A MEMBER OF the public into thinking that the
- 2 holder is a licensed alarm system contractor, alarm system agent,
- 3 or private security guard , or agency.
- 4 (2) A person , firm, company, partnership, or corporation
- 5 shall not distribute an identification card or certificate of
- 6 license in this state except as provided by UNDER this act.
- 7 (3) A person shall not knowingly buy or receive from a source
- 8 a form of spurious identification as an alarm system contractor,
- 9 alarm system agent, or a private security guard or agency.
- 10 (4) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor, and IF A LAW
- 11 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THIS STATE SEES an unauthorized
- 12 identification card or certificate of license, shall be confiscated
- 13 by a law enforcement officer of the state. HE OR SHE SHALL
- 14 CONFISCATE IT. Each day the A violation OF THIS SECTION continues
- 15 shall constitute CONSTITUTES a separate offense.
- Sec. 17. (1) A licensee may employ as many persons as he or
- 17 she INDIVIDUALS AS THE LICENSEE considers necessary to assist him
- 18 or her in his or her THE LICENSEE IN ITS work of security alarm
- 19 system contractor, private security police, private college
- 20 security force, or private security guard and in the conduct of his
