SENATE BILL No. 876

March 13, 2014, Introduced by Senators HANSEN, MOOLENAAR, CASPERSON, MEEKHOF, KOWALL, GREEN and BOOHER and referred to the Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
by amending sections 72105, 72105a, and 72106 (MCL 324.72105,
324.72105a, and 324.72106), sections 72105 and 72106 as added by
1995 PA 58 and section 72105a as amended by 2010 PA 46.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 72105. The department may operate and maintain a Michigan trailway TRAIL that is located on state owned land or may enter into an agreement with a council or 1 or more governmental agencies to provide for the operation and maintenance of the Michigan trailway. TRAIL. An agreement entered into under this subsection may include provisions for any of the following:
- (a) Construction, maintenance, and operation of the trailway.TRAIL.
- (b) Enforcement of trailway TRAIL rules and regulations

- 1 including permitted uses of the trailway.TRAIL.
- 2 (c) Other provisions consistent with this part.
- 3 Sec. 72105a. (1) The department shall establish an "adopt-a-
- 4 trail" program that will allow volunteer groups to assist in
- 5 maintaining and enhancing Michigan trailways, pack and saddle
- 6 trailways, and rail-trails.TRAILS ON STATE OWNED LAND.
- 7 (2) Subject to subsection (3), volunteer groups in the adopt-
- 8 a-trail program may adopt any available Michigan trailway, pack and
- 9 saddle trailway, or rail-trail or Michigan trailway, pack and
- 10 saddle trailway, or rail-trail TRAIL OR TRAIL segment and may
- 11 choose any 1 or more of the following volunteer activities:
- 12 (a) Spring cleanups.
- 13 (b) Environmental activities.
- 14 (c) Accessibility projects.
- 15 (d) Special events.
- 16 (e) Trailway TRAIL maintenance and development.
- 17 (f) Public information and assistance.
- 18 (g) Training.
- 19 (3) The department shall designate the activities to be
- 20 performed by a volunteer group in the adopt-a-trail program. The
- 21 department may provide for more than 1 volunteer group to adopt a
- 22 Michigan trailway, pack and saddle trailway, or rail-trail or
- 23 Michigan trailway, pack and saddle trailway, or rail trail AN
- 24 ELIGIBLE TRAIL OR TRAIL segment. IF THE DEPARTMENT OPERATES OTHER
- 25 PROGRAMS IN THE VICINITY OF THE TRAIL THAT ALLOWS VOLUNTEERS TO
- 26 ADOPT A PARK OR OTHER RESOURCE, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL COORDINATE
- 27 THESE PROGRAMS TO PROVIDE FOR EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE VOLUNTEER

- 2 (4) A volunteer group that wishes to participate in the adopt-
- 3 a-trail program shall submit an application to the department on a
- 4 form provided by the department. Additionally, volunteer groups
- 5 shall agree to the following:
- 6 (a) Volunteer groups shall participate in the program for at
- 7 least a 2-year period.
- 8 (b) Volunteer groups shall consist of at least 6 people who
- 9 are 18 years of age or older, unless the volunteer group is a
- 10 school or scout organization, in which case the volunteers may be
- 11 under 18 years of age.
- 12 (c) Volunteer groups shall contribute a total of at least 400
- 13 service hours over a 2-year period.
- 14 (d) Volunteer groups shall comply with other reasonable
- 15 requirements of the department.
- 16 (5) A state park manager or a district forest manager may
- 17 issue to volunteers who are actively working on adopt-a-trail
- 18 projects that last more than 1 day free camping permits if
- 19 campsites are available. A state park manager or a district forest
- 20 manager may waive state park entry fees for volunteers entering
- 21 state parks to work on adopt-a-trail projects.
- 22 (6) While a volunteer is working on an adopt-a-trail project,
- 23 the volunteer has the same immunity from civil liability as a
- 24 department employee and shall be treated in the same manner as an
- 25 employee under section 8 of 1964 PA 170, MCL 691.1408.
- 26 (7) The department shall design and erect near the entrance of
- 27 each Michigan trailway, pack and saddle trailway, or rail-trail in

- 1 the adopt-a-trail program or along the trailway ADOPTED TRAIL OR
- 2 TRAIL SEGMENT an adopt-a-trail program sign with the name of the
- 3 volunteer group's sponsoring organization listed for each volunteer
- 4 group that has contributed at least 100 service hours by
- 5 volunteers.
- 6 Sec. 72106. (1) Two or more governmental agencies may
- 7 establish a Michigan trailway TRAIL management council for the
- 8 development and management of a Michigan trailway TRAIL pursuant to
- 9 the urban cooperation act of 1967, Act No. 7 of the Public Acts of
- 10 the Extra Session of 1967, being section 124.501 to 124.512 of the
- 11 Michigan Compiled Laws. 1967 (EX SESS) PA 7, MCL 124.501 TO 124.512.
- 12 (2) Upon formation, a council shall adopt operating procedures
- 13 and shall elect officers as the council considers appropriate.
- 14 (3) A council may do 1 or more of the following as authorized
- 15 in an interlocal agreement entered into pursuant to Act No. 7 of
- 16 the Public Acts of the Extra Session of 1967: THE URBAN COOPERATION
- 17 ACT OF 1967, 1967 (EX SESS) PA 7, MCL 124.501 TO 124.512:
- 18 (a) Operate and maintain that portion of 1 or more Michigan
- 19 trailways TRAILS that is ARE owned or under the control of the
- 20 governmental agencies establishing the council.
- 21 (b) Pursuant to an agreement under section 72105, operate and
- 22 maintain that portion of 1 or more Michigan trailways TRAILS that
- 23 is ARE located on state owned land.
- 24 (c) Coordinate the enforcement of trailway TRAIL rules and
- 25 regulations and other applicable laws and ordinances, including
- 26 permitted uses of the trailway TRAIL on trailways TRAILS owned or
- 27 under the control of the governmental agencies establishing the

- 1 council or, pursuant to an agreement under section 72105, trailways

- 3 (d) Receive any grant made from the fund or other funding
- 4 related to that portion of a Michigan trailway TRAIL within its

- 6 (e) Acquire or hold real property for the purpose of operating
- 7 a Michigan trailway.TRAIL.
- 8 (f) Perform other functions consistent with this part.
- 9 (4) A council may be dissolved by the governmental agencies
- 10 that participated in creating the council. However, if a council
- 11 has entered into an agreement with the department under section
- 12 72105, the agreement shall specify how the council may be
- 13 dissolved.
