Senate Bill 502 (Substitute S-1) Sponsor: Senator Jim Marleau Committee: Health Policy

CONTENT

The bill would amend the Health Care False Claim Act to revise an exemption to a prohibition against kickbacks, bribes, and rebates for furnishing health care goods, services, and benefits.

Under Section 4 of the Act, it is a felony to solicit, offer, pay, or receive a kickback or bribe in connection with the furnishing of goods or services for which payment is or may be made wholly or partly by a health care corporation or health care insurer, or to receive a rebate of a fee or charge for referring an individual to another person for the furnishing of health care benefits. The felony is punishable by imprisonment for up to four years and/or a maximum fine of \$50,000.

The Act provides that a rebate or discount from a drug manufacturer or a company that licenses or distributes a manufacturer's drugs to a consumer for that consumer's use of the drug does not violate Section 4. Under the bill, this exception would apply to a rebate, discount, or similar payment to a consumer or other person on the consumer's behalf for the consumer's use of the drug or for health care items or services related to that use.

The bill specifies that "other person on the consumer's behalf" would not include a physician or other individual prescribing the drug or a person with a financial relationship to the physician or other individual.

The bill would take effect 90 days after it was enacted.
