## SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4521

A bill to provide for the voluntary issuance of identification and patches for service animals; and to provide for certain powers and duties of the department of civil rights.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Department" means the department of civil rights.
- 3 (b) "Person with a disability" means a person who has a
- 4 disability as defined in section 12102 of the Americans with
- 5 disabilities act of 1990, 42 USC 12102, and 28 CFR 36.104.
- 6 (c) As used in subdivision (b), "person with a disability"
- 7 includes a veteran who has been diagnosed with 1 or more of the
- 8 following:
- 9 (i) Post-traumatic stress disorder.

- 1 (ii) Traumatic brain injury.
- 2 (iii) Other service-related disabilities.
- 3 (d) "Service animal" means all of the following:
- 4 (i) That term as defined in 28 CFR 36.104.
- (ii) A miniature horse that has been individually trained to
- 6 do work or perform tasks as described in 28 CFR 36.104 for the
- 7 benefit of a person with a disability.
- 8 (e) "Veteran" means any of the following:
- 9 (i) A person who performed military service in the armed
- 10 forces for a period of more than 90 days and separated from the
- 11 armed forces in a manner other than a dishonorable discharge.
- 12 (ii) A person discharged or released from military service
- 13 because of a service-related disability.
- 14 (iii) A member of a reserve branch of the armed forces at the
- 15 time he or she was ordered to military service during a period of
- 16 war, or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign badge is
- 17 authorized, and was released from military service in a manner
- 18 other than a dishonorable discharge.
- 19 Sec. 3. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the department shall
- 20 develop and make available upon request a voluntary identification
- 21 and patch for a service animal for a person with a disability.
- 22 (2) To be eligible to receive the voluntary identification and
- 23 patch described in subsection (1), the person seeking the materials
- 24 shall provide all of the following:
- 25 (a) An affidavit signed by the person seeking the
- 26 identification and patch attesting that the service animal for
- 27 which the identification and patch are being sought has been

- 1 trained to be a service animal for use by a person with a
- 2 disability.
- 3 (b) Documentation from an appropriate health care or
- 4 rehabilitation professional that the individual requires the
- 5 assistance of a service animal due to a disability.
- 6 Sec. 5. The department shall use its existing telephone
- 7 complaint hotline to receive reports of problems encountered by a
- 8 person with a disability using a service animal and to receive
- 9 reports of a person impersonating a person with a disability and
- 10 using a service animal. The department may refer an alleged
- 11 violation of section 3(2)(a) to the appropriate law enforcement
- 12 agency for investigation.
- Sec. 7. A person who knowingly or willingly submits a false or
- 14 fraudulent affidavit under section 3(2)(a) is guilty of a
- 15 misdemeanor punishable by 1 or more of the following:
- 16 (a) Imprisonment for not more than 90 days.
- 17 (b) A fine of not more than \$500.00.
- (c) Community service for not more than 30 days.
- 19 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 20 date it is enacted into law.
- 21 Enacting section 2. This act does not take effect unless all
- 22 of the following bills of the 98th Legislature are enacted into
- 23 law:
