## **HOUSE BILL No. 4558**

May 5, 2015, Introduced by Rep. Townsend and referred to the Committee on Tax Policy.

A bill to amend 1937 PA 94, entitled "Use tax act,"

by amending section 3 (MCL 205.93), as amended by 2014 PA 80.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) There is levied upon and there shall be collected
- 2 from every person in this state a specific tax, including both the
- 3 local community stabilization share and the state share, for the
- 4 privilege of using, storing, or consuming tangible personal
- 5 property in this state at a total combined rate equal to 6% of the
- 6 price of the property or services specified in section 3a or 3b.
- 7 The tax levied under this act applies to a person who acquires
- 8 tangible personal property or services that are subject to the tax
- 9 levied under this act for any tax-exempt use who subsequently
- 10 converts the tangible personal property or service to a taxable
- 11 use, including an interim taxable use. If tangible personal

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- 1 property or services are converted to a taxable use, the tax levied
- 2 under this act shall be imposed without regard to any subsequent
- 3 tax-exempt use. Penalties and interest shall be added to the tax if
- 4 applicable as provided in this act. For the purpose of the proper
- 5 administration of this act and to prevent the evasion of the tax,
- 6 all of the following shall be presumed:
- 7 (a) That tangible personal property purchased is subject to
- 8 the tax if brought into this state within 90 days of the purchase
- 9 date and is considered as acquired for storage, use, or other
- 10 consumption in this state.
- 11 (b) That tangible personal property used solely for personal,
- 12 nonbusiness purposes that is purchased outside of this state and
- 13 that is not an aircraft is exempt from the tax levied under this
- 14 act if 1 or more of the following conditions are satisfied:
- (i) The property is purchased by a person who is not a resident
- 16 of this state at the time of purchase and is brought into this
- 17 state more than 90 days after the date of purchase.
- 18 (ii) The property is purchased by a person who is a resident of
- 19 this state at the time of purchase and is brought into this state
- 20 more than 360 days after the date of purchase.
- 21 (2) The tax imposed by this section for the privilege of
- 22 using, storing, or consuming a vehicle, ORV, manufactured housing,
- 23 aircraft, snowmobile, or watercraft shall be collected before the
- 24 transfer of the vehicle, ORV, manufactured housing, aircraft,
- 25 snowmobile, or watercraft, except a transfer to a licensed dealer
- 26 or retailer for purposes of resale that arises by reason of a
- 27 transaction made by a person who does not transfer vehicles, ORVs,

- 1 manufactured housing, aircraft, snowmobiles, or watercraft in the
- 2 ordinary course of his or her business done in this state. The tax
- 3 on a vehicle, ORV, snowmobile, and watercraft shall be collected by
- 4 the secretary of state before the transfer of the vehicle, ORV,
- 5 snowmobile, or watercraft registration. The tax on manufactured
- 6 housing shall be collected by the department of licensing and
- 7 regulatory affairs, mobile home commission, or its agent before the
- 8 transfer of the certificate of title. The tax on an aircraft shall
- 9 be collected by the department of treasury. The price tax base of a
- 10 new or previously owned car or truck held for resale by a dealer
- 11 and that is not exempt under section 4(1)(c) is the purchase price
- 12 of the car or truck multiplied by 2.5% plus \$30.00 per month
- 13 beginning with the month that the dealer uses the car or truck in a
- 14 nonexempt manner.
- 15 (3) The following transfers or purchases are not subject to
- 16 use tax:
- 17 (a) A transaction or a portion of a transaction if the
- 18 transferee or purchaser is the spouse, mother, father, brother,
- 19 sister, child, stepparent, stepchild, stepbrother, stepsister,
- 20 grandparent, grandchild, legal ward, or a legally appointed
- 21 guardian with a certified letter of guardianship, of the
- 22 transferor.
- 23 (b) A transaction or a portion of a transaction if the
- 24 transfer is a gift to a beneficiary in the administration of an
- 25 estate.
- 26 (c) If a vehicle, ORV, manufactured housing, aircraft,
- 27 snowmobile, or watercraft that has once been subjected to the

- 1 Michigan sales or use tax is transferred in connection with the
- 2 organization, reorganization, dissolution, or partial liquidation
- 3 of an incorporated or unincorporated business and the beneficial
- 4 ownership is not changed.
- 5 (d) If an insurance company licensed to conduct business in
- 6 this state acquires ownership of a late model distressed vehicle as
- 7 defined in section 12a of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300,
- 8 MCL 257.12a, through payment of damages in response to a claim or
- 9 when the person who owned the vehicle before the insurance company
- 10 reacquires ownership from the company as part of the settlement of
- 11 a claim.
- 12 (4) The department may utilize the services, information, or
- 13 records of any other department or agency of state government or of
- 14 the authority in the performance of its duties under this act, and
- 15 other departments or agencies of state government and the authority
- 16 are required to furnish those services, information, or records
- 17 upon the request of the department.
- 18 (5) Beginning on October 1, 2015, the specific tax levied
- 19 under subsection (1) includes both a state share tax levied by this
- 20 state and a local community stabilization share tax authorized by
- 21 the amendatory act that added section 2c 2014 PA 80 and levied by
- 22 the authority, which replaces the reduced state share at the
- 23 following rates in each of the following state fiscal years:
- 24 (a) For fiscal year 2015-2016, the local community
- 25 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 26 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 27 authority sufficient to generate \$96,100,000.00 \$96,400,000.00 in

- 1 revenue and the state share tax rate is that rate determined by
- 2 subtracting the local community stabilization share tax rate from
- **3** 6%.
- 4 (b) For fiscal year 2016-2017, the local community
- 5 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 6 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 7 authority sufficient to generate \$380,600,000.00 \$380,900,000.00 in
- 8 revenue and the state share tax rate is that rate determined by
- 9 subtracting the local community stabilization share tax rate from
- **10** 6%.
- 11 (c) For fiscal year 2017-2018, the local community
- 12 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 13 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 14 authority sufficient to generate \$410,500,000.00 \$410,800,000.00 in
- 15 revenue and the state share tax rate is that rate determined by
- 16 subtracting the local community stabilization share tax rate from
- **17** 6%.
- 18 (d) For fiscal year 2018-2019, the local community
- 19 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 20 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 21 authority sufficient to generate \$437,700,000.00 \$438,000,000.00 in
- 22 revenue and the state share tax rate is that rate determined by
- 23 subtracting the local community stabilization share tax rate from
- 24 6%.
- (e) For fiscal year 2019-2020, the local community
- 26 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 27 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the

- 1 authority sufficient to generate \$465,900,000.00 in revenue and the
- 2 state share tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the
- 3 local community stabilization share tax rate from 6%.
- 4 (f) For fiscal year 2020-2021, the local community
- 5 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 6 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 7 authority sufficient to generate \$491,500,000.00 in revenue and the
- 8 state share tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the
- 9 local community stabilization share tax rate from 6%.
- 10 (g) For fiscal year 2021-2022, the local community
- 11 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 12 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 13 authority sufficient to generate \$521,300,000.00 in revenue and the
- 14 state share tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the
- 15 local community stabilization share tax rate from 6%.
- 16 (h) For fiscal year 2022-2023, the local community
- 17 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 18 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 19 authority sufficient to generate \$548,000,000.00 in revenue and the
- 20 state share tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the
- 21 local community stabilization share tax rate from 6%.
- (i) For fiscal year 2023-2024, the local community
- 23 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 24 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 25 authority sufficient to generate \$561,700,000.00 in revenue and the
- 26 state share tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the
- 27 local community stabilization share tax rate from 6%.

- 1 (j) For fiscal year 2024-2025, the local community
- 2 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 3 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 4 authority sufficient to generate \$569,800,000.00 in revenue and the
- 5 state share tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the
- 6 local community stabilization share tax rate from 6%.
- 7 (k) For fiscal year 2025-2026, the local community
- 8 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 9 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 10 authority sufficient to generate \$571,400,000.00 in revenue and the
- 11 state share tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the
- 12 local community stabilization share tax rate from 6%.
- (1) For fiscal year 2026-2027, the local community
- 14 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 15 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- 16 authority sufficient to generate \$572,200,000.00 in revenue and the
- 17 state share tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the
- 18 local community stabilization share tax rate from 6%.
- 19 (m) For fiscal year 2027-2028, the local community
- 20 stabilization share tax rate to be levied by the authority is that
- 21 rate calculated by the department of treasury on behalf of the
- authority sufficient to generate \$572,600,000.00 in revenue and the
- 23 state share tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the
- 24 local community stabilization share tax rate from 6%.
- 25 (n) For fiscal year 2028-2029 and each fiscal year thereafter,
- 26 the local community stabilization share tax rate to be levied by
- 27 the authority is that rate calculated by the department of treasury

- 1 on behalf of the authority sufficient to generate the amount
- 2 distributed under this section in the immediately preceding year
- 3 adjusted by the personal property growth factor and the state share
- 4 tax rate is that rate determined by subtracting the local community
- 5 stabilization share tax rate from 6%.
- 6 (6) The state share includes the portion of the use tax
- 7 imposed at the additional rate of 2% approved by the electors of
- 8 this state on March 15, 1994 and dedicated for aid to schools under
- 9 section 21(2). The local community stabilization share does not
- 10 include the portion of the use tax imposed at the additional rate
- 11 of 2% approved by the electors of this state on March 15, 1994.
- 12 (7) The total combined rate of the tax levied by this state
- 13 and the authority under this act, including both the state share,
- 14 as reduced by the amendatory act that added this subsection, 2014
- 15 PA 80, and the local community stabilization share, shall not
- 16 exceed the constitutional limit of 6% under section 8 of article IX
- 17 of the state constitution of 1963. The authority shall not increase
- 18 any tax or tax rate, but is authorized to and shall levy the local
- 19 community stabilization share at the rate provided in subsection
- **20** (5).
