HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 336

A bill to prescribe the blue alert of Michigan as the official response to reports of serious injury or death of a law enforcement officer in certain circumstances; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "Michigan blue alert act".
- 3 Sec. 3. As used in this act, "law enforcement officer" means
- 4 that term as defined in section 2 of the commission on law
- 5 enforcement standards act, 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.602.
- 6 Sec. 5. (1) The department of state police shall establish and
- 7 maintain the Michigan blue alert plan.

- 1 (2) The Michigan blue alert plan shall be designed to rapidly
- 2 disseminate useful information in a predetermined manner to radio
- 3 and television stations within this state.
- 4 Sec. 7. A Michigan blue alert shall be activated only in
- 5 accordance with policies established by the department of state
- 6 police and if all of the following conditions apply:
- 7 (a) A law enforcement officer has been killed or seriously
- 8 injured and the law enforcement agency investigating the incident
- 9 has information identifying an individual as a suspect connected to
- 10 the incident.
- 11 (b) The law enforcement agency that is investigating the
- 12 suspect determines that the suspect poses a serious risk or threat
- 13 to the public and other law enforcement personnel.
- 14 (c) The law enforcement agency investigating the suspect has
- 15 obtained the suspect's name or can provide a detailed physical
- 16 description of the suspect, or the suspect's vehicle, vehicle
- 17 registration plate numbers or letters, or partial registration
- 18 plate numbers or letters to be made available for broadcast to the
- 19 public.
- 20 (d) The law enforcement agency investigating the suspect
- 21 recommends that the state police activate the blue alert.
- 22 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 23 date it is enacted into law.
