HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 516

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled

"An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,"

- 21 an individual authorized on a voluntary or irregular basis by a
- 22 duly authorized police agency of this state or a political

- 23 subsection (2) nevertheless may elect to have the firearm not be

- 25 this subsection shall notify the department of state police of the

- 27 Sec. 5b. (1) Until November 30, 2015, to obtain a license to

- 1 carry a concealed pistol, an individual shall apply to the
- 2 concealed weapon licensing board in the county in which that
- 3 individual resides. Beginning December 1, 2015, to obtain a license
- 4 to carry a concealed pistol, an individual shall apply to the
- 5 county clerk in the county in which the individual resides. The
- 6 applicant shall file the application with the county clerk in the
- 7 county in which the applicant resides during the county clerk's
- 8 normal business hours. The application shall be on a form provided
- 9 by the director of the department of state police. Until November
- 10 30, 2015, the application shall allow the applicant to designate

- 14 number. Until November 30, 2015, if the applicant resides in a
- 15 city, village, or township that has a police department, the name
- 16 of the police department.
- 17 (b) A statement by the applicant that the applicant meets the
- 18 criteria for a license under this act to carry a concealed pistol.
- 19 (c) Until November 30, 2015, a statement by the applicant
- 20 authorizing the concealed weapon licensing board to access any
- 21 record, including any medical record, pertaining to the applicant's
- 22 qualifications for a license to carry a concealed pistol under this
- 23 act. The applicant may request that information received by the
- 24 concealed weapon licensing board under this subdivision be reviewed
- 25 in a closed session. If the applicant requests that the session be
- 26 closed, the concealed weapon licensing board shall close the
- 27 session only for purposes of this subdivision. The applicant and

- 1 his or her representative have the right to be present in the
- 2 closed session. Beginning December 1, 2015, a statement by the
- 3 applicant authorizing the department of state police to access any
- 4 record needed to perform the verification in subsection (6).
- 5 (d) A statement by the applicant regarding whether he or she

- 15 5x. Beginning December 1, 2015, the county treasurer shall deposit

- 19 balance remaining to the state treasurer. The state treasurer shall
- 20 deposit the balance of the fee in the general fund to the credit of

- 23 fingerprints and to reimburse the Federal Bureau of Investigation
- 24 for the costs associated with processing fingerprints submitted

- 1 the concealed weapon licensing board shall verify the requirements

- 3 through the law enforcement information network and report his or
- 4 her finding to the concealed weapon licensing board. Beginning
- 5 December 1, 2015, the department of state police shall verify the
- 6 requirements of subsection (7)(d), (e), (f), (h), (i), (j), (k),
- 7 and (m) through the law enforcement information network and the
- 8 national instant criminal background check system and shall report
- 9 to the county clerk all statutory disqualifications, if any, under

- 23 (7) Until November 30, 2015, the concealed weapon licensing
- 24 board and, beginning December 1, 2015, the county clerk shall issue
- 25 and shall send by first-class mail a license to an applicant to
- 26 carry a concealed pistol within the period required under this act
- 27 if the concealed weapon licensing board or county clerk determines

- 1 that all of the following circumstances exist:
- 2 (a) The applicant is 21 years of age or older.
- 3 (b) The applicant is a citizen of the United States or is an
- 4 alien lawfully admitted into the United States, is a legal resident
- 5 of this state, and has resided in this state for not less than the
- 6 6 months immediately preceding the date of application. Until
- 7 November 30, 2015, the concealed weapon licensing board may waive
- 8 the 6-month residency requirement for a temporary license under
- 9 section 5a(8) if the concealed weapon licensing board determines
- 10 that there is probable cause to believe that the safety of the
- 11 applicant or the safety of a member of the applicant's family is
- 12 endangered by the applicant's inability to immediately obtain a
- 13 license to carry a concealed pistol. Until November 30, 2015, if
- 14 the applicant holds a valid concealed pistol license issued by
- 15 another state at the time the applicant's residency in this state
- 16 is established, the concealed weapon licensing board may waive the
- 17 6-month waiting period and the applicant may apply for a concealed
- 18 pistol license at the time the applicant's residency in this state
- 19 is established. Until November 30, 2015, the concealed weapon
- 20 licensing board shall immediately issue a temporary license to that
- 21 applicant. Until November 30, 2015, the temporary license is valid
- 22 until the concealed weapon licensing board decides whether to grant
- 23 or deny the application. Beginning December 1, 2015, the county
- 24 clerk shall waive the 6-month residency requirement for an
- 25 emergency license under section 5a(4) if the applicant is a
- 26 petitioner for a personal protection order issued under section
- 27 2950 or 2950a of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236,

- 1 MCL 600.2950 and 600.2950a, or if the county sheriff determines
- 2 that there is clear and convincing evidence to believe that the
- 3 safety of the applicant or the safety of a member of the
- 4 applicant's family or household is endangered by the applicant's
- 5 inability to immediately obtain a license to carry a concealed
- 6 pistol. Beginning December 1, 2015, if the applicant holds a valid
- 7 concealed pistol license issued by another state at the time the
- 8 applicant's residency in this state is established, the county
- 9 clerk shall waive the 6-month waiting period and the applicant may
- 10 apply for a concealed pistol license at the time the applicant's
- 11 residency in this state is established. For the purposes of this
- 12 section, a person is considered a legal resident of this state if
- any of the following apply:
- 14 (i) The person has a valid, lawfully obtained driver license
- issued under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to
- 16 257.923, or official state personal identification card issued

- 23 States armed forces and is permanently stationed in this state, but
- 24 the person's home of record is in another state.
- 25 (c) The applicant has knowledge and has had training in the
- 26 safe use and handling of a pistol by the successful completion of a
- 27 pistol safety training course or class that meets the requirements

- 2 (d) The applicant is not the subject of an order or
- 3 disposition under any of the following:

- (e) The applicant is not prohibited from possessing, using,

- 20 (f) The applicant has never been convicted of a felony in this
- 21 state or elsewhere, and a felony charge against the applicant is
- 22 not pending in this state or elsewhere at the time he or she
- 23 applies for a license described in this section.
- 24 (g) The applicant has not been dishonorably discharged from
- 25 the United States armed forces.
- 26 (h) The applicant has not been convicted of a misdemeanor
- 27 violation of any of the following in the 8 years immediately

- 1 preceding the date of application and a charge for a misdemeanor
- 2 violation of any of the following is not pending against the
- 3 applicant in this state or elsewhere at the time he or she applies
- 4 for a license described in this section:

- 17 a concealed pistol was issued to suspend the individual's license
- 18 until there is a final disposition of the charge for that offense.
- 19 The court shall notify the county clerk of each statutory provision
- 20 with which the individual has been charged. The county clerk shall
- 21 send notice by first-class mail in a sealed envelope of that
- 22 suspension to the individual's last known address as indicated in
- 23 the records of the county clerk. The notice shall include the
- 24 statutory reason for the suspension, the source of the record
- 25 supporting that suspension, the length of the suspension, and whom
- 26 to contact for reinstating the license on expiration of the
- 27 suspension, correcting errors in the record, or appealing the

- 1 suspension. The requirements of subsection (2) do not apply to this
- 2 subsection. If a court ordered a license COUNTY CLERK suspended A
- 3 LICENSE under this subsection and the individual is acquitted of
- 4 the charge or the charge is dismissed, the court INDIVIDUAL shall
- 5 notify the county clerk who shall automatically reinstate the
- 6 license if the license is not expired and the individual is
- 7 otherwise qualified to receive a license to carry a concealed
- 8 pistol, as verified by the department of state police. A county
- 9 clerk shall not charge a fee for the reinstatement of a license
- 10 under this subsection.
- 11 (3) (4)—The department of state police shall notify the county
- 12 clerk in the county in which a license was issued to an individual
- 13 to carry a concealed pistol if the department of state police
- 14 determines that there has been a change in the individual's
- 15 eligibility under this act to receive a license to carry a
- 16 concealed pistol. The county clerk shall suspend, revoke, or
- 17 reinstate the license as required under this act and immediately
- 18 send notice of the suspension, revocation, or reinstatement under
- 19 this subsection by first-class mail in a sealed envelope to the
- 20 individual's last known address as indicated on the records of the
- 21 county clerk. The notice shall include the statutory reason for the
- 22 suspension, revocation, or reinstatement, the source of the record
- 23 supporting the suspension, revocation, or reinstatement, the length
- 24 of the suspension or revocation, and whom to contact for correcting
- 25 errors in the record, appealing the suspension or revocation, and
- 26 reapplying for that individual's license. The department of state
- 27 police shall immediately enter that suspension, revocation, or

- 1 reinstatement into the law enforcement information network. The
- 2 requirements of subsection (2) do not apply to this subsection.
- 3 (4) (5)—If a suspension is imposed under this section, the
- 4 suspension shall be for a period stated in years, months, or days,
- 5 or until the final disposition of the charge, and shall state the
- 6 date the suspension will end, if applicable. The licensee shall
- 7 promptly surrender his or her license to the county clerk after
- 8 being notified that his or her license has been revoked or
- 9 suspended. An individual who fails to surrender a license as
- 10 required under this subsection after he or she was notified that
- 11 his or her license was suspended or revoked is guilty of a
- 12 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or
- a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.
- 14 (5) $\frac{(6)}{(6)}$ Except as otherwise provided in subsections $\frac{(3)}{(2)}$
- and $\frac{7}{7}$, $\frac{6}{7}$, if a license is suspended under this section and that
- 16 license was surrendered by the licensee, upon expiration of the
- 17 suspension period, the applicant may apply for a renewal license in
- 18 the same manner as provided under section 5l. The county clerk or
- 19 department of state police, as applicable, shall issue the
- 20 applicant a receipt for his or her application at the time the
- 21 application is submitted. The receipt shall contain all of the
- 22 following:
- 23 (a) The name of the applicant.
- 24 (b) The date and time the receipt is issued.
- 25 (c) The amount paid.
- 26 (d) The applicant's state-issued driver license or personal
- 27 identification card number.

- 1 (e) The statement, "This receipt was issued for the purpose of
- 2 applying for a renewal of a concealed pistol license following a
- 3 period of suspension or revocation. This receipt does not authorize
- 4 an individual to carry a concealed pistol in this state.".
- 5 (f) The name of the county in which the receipt is issued, if
- 6 applicable.
- 7 (g) An impression of the county seal, if applicable.
- 8 (6) (7)—If a license is suspended because of an order under
- 9 section 5b(7)(d)(iii) and that license was surrendered by the
- 10 licensee, upon expiration of the order and notification to the
- 11 county clerk, the county clerk shall automatically reinstate the
- 12 license if the license is not expired and the department of state
- 13 police has completed the verification required under section 5b(6).
- 14 The county clerk shall not charge a fee for the reinstatement of a
- 15 license under this subsection.
- 16 (7) (8) If the court orders a county clerk to suspend, revoke,
- 17 or reinstate a license under this section or amends a suspension,
- 18 revocation, or reinstatement order, the county clerk shall
- 19 immediately notify the department of state police in a manner
- 20 prescribed by the department of state police. The department of
- 21 state police shall enter the order or amended order into the law
- 22 enforcement information network.
- 23 (8) (9) A suspension or revocation order or amended order
- 24 issued under this section is immediately effective. However, an
- 25 individual is not criminally liable for violating the order or
- 26 amended order unless he or she has received notice of the order or
- 27 amended order.

- 1 (9) (10) If an individual is carrying a pistol in violation of
- 2 a suspension or revocation order or amended order issued under this
- 3 section but has not previously received notice of the order or
- 4 amended order, the individual shall be informed of the order or
- 5 amended order and be given an opportunity to properly store the
- 6 pistol or otherwise comply with the order or amended order before
- 7 an arrest is made for carrying the pistol in violation of this act.
- 8 (10) (11) If a law enforcement agency or officer notifies an
- 9 individual of a suspension or revocation order or amended order
- 10 issued under this section who has not previously received notice of
- 11 the order or amended order, the law enforcement agency or officer
- 12 shall enter a statement into the law enforcement information
- 13 network that the individual has received notice of the order or
- 14 amended order under this section.
- 15 Sec. 12a. (1) The requirements of this act for obtaining a
- 16 license to carry a concealed pistol do not apply to any of the
- 17 following:
- 18 (a) A peace officer of a duly authorized police agency of the
- 19 United States or of this state or a political subdivision of this
- 20 state, who is regularly employed and paid by the United States or
- 21 this state or a subdivision of this state, except a township
- 22 constable.
- 23 (b) A constable who is trained and certified under the
- 24 commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA 203, MCL
- 25 28.601 to 28.616, while engaged in his or her official duties or
- 26 going to or coming from his or her official duties, and who is
- 27 regularly employed and paid by a political subdivision of this

- 1 state.
- 2 (c) A person AN INDIVIDUAL regularly employed by the
- 3 department of corrections and authorized in writing by the director
- 4 of the department of corrections to carry a concealed pistol during
- 5 the performance of his or her duties or while going to or returning
- 6 from his or her duties.
- 7 (d) A person AN INDIVIDUAL regularly employed as a local
- 8 corrections officer by a county sheriff, who is trained in the use
- 9 of force and is authorized in writing by the county sheriff to
- 10 carry a concealed pistol during the performance of his or her
- 11 duties.
- 12 (e) A person AN INDIVIDUAL regularly employed in a city jail
- 13 or lockup who has custody of persons INDIVIDUALS detained or
- 14 incarcerated in the jail or lockup, is trained in the use of force,
- 15 and is authorized in writing by the chief of police or the county
- 16 sheriff to carry a concealed pistol during the performance of his
- 17 or her duties.
- 18 (f) A member of the United States army, air force, navy, or
- 19 marine corps ARMY, AIR FORCE, NAVY, OR MARINE CORPS while carrying
- 20 a concealed pistol in the line of duty.
- 21 (q) A member of the national quard, NATIONAL GUARD, armed
- 22 forces reserves, or other duly authorized military organization
- 23 while on duty or drill or while going to or returning from his or
- 24 her place of assembly or practice or while carrying a concealed
- 25 pistol for purposes of that military organization.
- 26 (h) A resident of another state who is licensed by that state
- 27 to carry a concealed pistol.

- 1 (i) The regular and ordinary transportation of a pistol as
- 2 merchandise by an authorized agent of a person licensed to
- 3 manufacture firearms.
- 4 (j) A person AN INDIVIDUAL while carrying a pistol unloaded in
- 5 a wrapper or container in the trunk of his or her vehicle or, if
- 6 the vehicle does not have a trunk, from transporting that pistol
- 7 unloaded in a locked compartment or container that is separated
- 8 from the ammunition for that pistol from the place of purchase to
- 9 his or her home or place of business or to a place of repair or
- 10 back to his or her home or place of business, or in moving goods
- 11 from 1 place of abode or business to another place of abode or
- 12 business.
- 13 (k) A peace officer or law enforcement officer from Canada.
- 14 (2) As used in this act, "local corrections officer" means
- 15 that term as defined in section 2 of the local corrections officers
- 16 training act, 2003 PA 125, MCL 791.532.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect December
- **18** 1, 2015.
- 19 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 20 unless House Bill No. 4159 of the 98th Legislature is enacted into
- 21 law.
