## SUBSTITUTE FOR

## HOUSE BILL NO. 4537

A bill to prohibit an employer from discriminating against, disciplining, or discharging an employee who is absent from work to respond to an emergency as a civil air patrol volunteer; and to provide remedies for a violation of this act.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "civil air patrol employment protection act".
- 3 (2) As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Civil air patrol" means the civilian auxiliary of the
- 5 United States Air Force.
- 6 (b) "Employee" means an individual who receives wages or
- 7 remuneration for providing services to an employer.
- 8 (c) "Employer" means a person that provides wages or

- 1 remuneration to 1 or more individuals who perform services for the
- 2 employer under an express or implied contract of hire.
- 3 (3) Subject to subsection (4), an employer shall not
- 4 discriminate against, discipline, or discharge an employee for any
- 5 of the following reasons:
- 6 (a) The employee is a member of the civil air patrol.
- 7 (b) The employee is absent from work if all of the following
- 8 conditions are met:
- 9 (i) The employee is absent for the purpose of responding as a
- 10 member of the civil air patrol to an emergency declared by the
- 11 governor or the president of the United States.
- 12 (ii) The employee gives his or her employer as much notice as
- 13 possible of the dates the employee will be absent to serve with the
- 14 civil air patrol during the emergency.
- 15 (iii) The employee provides the employer with verification
- 16 from the civil air patrol of the emergency need for the employee's
- 17 volunteer service.
- 18 (4) This act does not do any of the following:
- 19 (a) Prohibit an employer from treating the time the employee
- 20 is absent because of emergency civil air patrol service as unpaid
- 21 time off.
- 22 (b) Prohibit an employer from complying with a collective
- 23 bargaining agreement or employee benefit plan entered into before
- 24 the effective date of this act.
- 25 (5) By 30 days after the effective date of this act, the date
- 26 of employment, or the date of joining the civil air patrol,
- 27 whichever is latest, an employee who is a member of the civil air

- 1 patrol and is trained and qualified to provide emergency services
- 2 shall notify his or her employer that the employee may be called to
- 3 an emergency.
- 4 (6) An employee or former employee may bring a civil action
- 5 for damages or equitable relief to enforce this act.
- 6 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 7 date it is enacted into law.
