SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5650

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 7404 (MCL 333.7404), as amended by 2015 PA 220.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 7404. (1) A person shall not use a controlled substance
- 2 or controlled substance analogue unless the substance was obtained
- 3 directly from, or pursuant to, a valid prescription or order of a
- 4 practitioner while acting in the course of the practitioner's
- 5 professional practice, or except as otherwise authorized by this
- 6 article.
- 7 (2) A person who violates this section as to:
- 8 (a) A controlled substance classified in schedule 1 or 2 as a
- 9 narcotic drug or a drug described in section 7212(1)(h) or
- 10 7214(a) (iv) or (c) (ii) is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by

- 1 imprisonment for not more than 1 year or a fine of not more than
- 2 \$2,000.00, or both.
- 3 (b) A controlled substance classified in schedule 1, 2, 3, or
- 4 4, except a controlled substance for which a penalty is prescribed
- 5 in subdivision (a), (c), or (d), or a controlled substance
- 6 analogue, is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for
- 7 not more than 1 year or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both.
- 8 (c) Lysergic acid diethylamide, peyote, mescaline,
- 9 dimethyltryptamine, psilocyn, psilocybin, or a controlled substance
- 10 classified in schedule 5 is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by
- 11 imprisonment for not more than 6 months or a fine of not more than
- 12 \$500.00, or both.
- 13 (d) Marihuana, catha edulis, salvia divinorum, or a substance
- 14 described in section $\frac{7212(1)}{7212(1)}$ (D) OR (i) is guilty of a
- 15 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or
- 16 a fine of not more than \$100.00, or both.
- 17 (3) The following individuals are not in violation of this
- 18 section:
- 19 (a) An individual who is less than 21 years of age and who
- 20 seeks medical assistance for himself or herself or who requires
- 21 medical assistance and is presented for assistance by another
- 22 individual if he or she is incapacitated because of a drug overdose
- 23 or other perceived medical emergency arising from the use of a
- 24 prescription drug that is a controlled substance or prescription
- 25 drug that is a controlled substance analogue that he or she
- 26 possesses or possessed in an amount sufficient only for personal
- 27 use and the evidence of his or her violation of this section is

- 1 obtained as a result of the individual's seeking or being presented
- 2 for medical assistance.
- 3 (b) An individual who is less than 21 years of age and who in
- 4 good faith attempts to procure medical assistance for another
- 5 individual or who accompanies another individual who requires
- 6 medical assistance for a drug overdose or other perceived medical
- 7 emergency arising from the use of a prescription drug that is a
- 8 controlled substance or a prescription drug that is a controlled
- 9 substance analogue that he or she possesses or possessed in an
- 10 amount sufficient only for personal use and the evidence of his or
- 11 her violation of this section is obtained as a result of the
- 12 individual's attempting to procure medical assistance for another
- 13 individual or as a result of the individual's accompanying another
- 14 individual who requires medical assistance to a health facility or
- 15 agency.
- 16 (4) A health facility or agency shall develop a process for
- 17 notification of the parent or parents, guardian, or custodian of a
- 18 minor under the age of 18 who is not emancipated under 1968 PA 293,
- 19 MCL 722.1 to 722.6, and who voluntarily presents himself or
- 20 herself, or is presented by another individual if he or she is
- 21 incapacitated, to a health facility or agency for emergency medical
- 22 treatment as provided in subsection (3). A health facility or
- 23 agency shall not provide notification to a parent or parents,
- 24 quardian, or custodian under this subsection for nonemergency
- 25 treatment without obtaining the minor's consent.
- 26 (5) The exemption from prosecution under this section provided
- 27 in subsection (3) shall DOES not prevent the investigation, arrest,

- 1 charging, or prosecution of an individual for any other violation
- 2 of the laws of this state, or be grounds for suppression of
- 3 evidence in the prosecution of any other criminal charges.
- **4** (6) As used in this section:
- 5 (a) "Drug overdose" means a condition including, but not
- 6 limited to, extreme physical illness, decreased level of
- 7 consciousness, respiratory depression, coma, mania, or death, that
- 8 is the result of consumption or use of a controlled substance or a
- 9 controlled substance analogue or a substance with which the
- 10 controlled substance or controlled substance analogue was combined,
- 11 or that a layperson would reasonably believe to be a drug overdose
- 12 that requires medical assistance.
- 13 (b) "Seeks medical assistance" includes, but is not limited
- 14 to, MEANS reporting a drug overdose or other medical emergency to
- 15 law enforcement, the 9-1-1 system, a poison control center, or a
- 16 medical provider, or assisting someone in reporting a drug overdose
- 17 or other medical emergency.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 19 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 20 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 21 unless House Bill No. 5649 of the 98th Legislature is enacted into
- 22 law.
