A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 5101 (MCL 333.5101), as amended by 2010 PA 119.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5101. (1) As used in this article:
- (a) "Care" includes treatment, control, transportation,confinement, and isolation in a facility or other location.
 - (b) "Communicable disease" means an illness due to a specific infectious agent or its toxic products that results from transmission of that infectious agent or its products from a reservoir to a susceptible host, directly as from an infected individual or animal, or indirectly through the agency of an

- 3 (c) "HIV" means human immunodeficiency virus.

- 21 acquired immunodeficiency syndrome, venereal disease, SEXUALLY
- 22 TRANSMITTED INFECTION, and tuberculosis.
- 23 (h) "Venereal disease" "SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTION" means
- 24 syphilis, gonorrhea, chancroid, lymphogranuloma venereum, granuloma
- 25 inquinale, and other sexually transmitted diseases—INFECTIONS that
- 26 the department may designate and require to be reported under
- **27** section 5111.
