A bill to prescribe the blue alert of Michigan as the official response to reports of serious injury or death of a law enforcement officer in certain circumstances; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
"Michigan blue alert act".

- Sec. 3. (1) The department of state police shall establish and maintain the Michigan blue alert plan.
- (2) The Michigan blue alert plan shall be designed to rapidly disseminate useful information in a predetermined manner to radio and television stations within this state.
 - Sec. 5. A Michigan blue alert shall be activated only in

- 1 accordance with policies established by the department of state
- 2 police and if all of the following conditions apply:
- 3 (a) A law enforcement officer has been killed or seriously
- 4 injured by an offender.
- 5 (b) The law enforcement agency that is investigating the

- 7 threat to the public and other law enforcement personnel.
- 8 (c) The law enforcement agency investigating the offender has
- 9 obtained and can provide a detailed description of the offender's
