## SUBSTITUTE FOR

## SENATE BILL NO. 538

A bill to amend 1995 PA 29, entitled "Uniform unclaimed property act," by amending sections 2, 30, and 31 (MCL 567.222, 567.250, and 567.251), section 2 as amended by 2008 PA 208, section 30 as amended by 2012 PA 292, and section 31 as amended by 2013 PA 148, and by adding sections 4a and 31b.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 2. As used in this act, unless the context otherwise
  requires:
- 3 (a) "Administrator" means the state treasurer.
- 4 (b) "Apparent owner" means the person whose name appears on
- 5 the records of the holder as the person entitled to property held,
- 6 issued, or owing by the holder.
- 7 (c) "Attorney general" means the department of attorney

- 1 general.
- 2 (d) "Banking organization" means a bank, trust company,
- 3 savings bank, industrial bank, land bank, safe deposit company,
- 4 private banker, or any organization defined by law as a bank or
- 5 banking organization.
- 6 (e) "Business association" means a nonpublic corporation,
- 7 joint stock company, investment company, business trust,
- 8 partnership, or association for business purposes of 2 or more
- 9 individuals, whether or not for profit, including a banking
- 10 organization, financial organization, insurance company, or
- 11 utility.
- 12 (f) "Domicile" means the state of incorporation of a
- 13 corporation and the state of the principal place of business of an
- 14 unincorporated person.
- 15 (G) "ELIGIBLE HOLDER" MEANS A HOLDER THAT MEETS 1 OR MORE OF
- 16 THE FOLLOWING:
- 17 (i) IS A CORPORATION WHOSE PARENT CORPORATION IS INCORPORATED
- 18 IN THIS STATE.
- 19 (ii) IS A CORPORATION THAT HAS A SUBSIDIARY INCORPORATED IN
- 20 THIS STATE.
- 21 (iii) IS A CORPORATION THAT IS NOT INCORPORATED IN THIS STATE
- 22 BUT IS WHOLLY OWNED BY A CORPORATION THAT IS INCORPORATED IN THIS
- 23 STATE.
- 24 (H) (g) "Financial organization" means a savings and loan
- 25 association, cooperative bank, building and loan association,
- 26 savings bank, or credit union.
- 27 (I) (h)—"Holder" means a person, wherever organized or

- 1 domiciled, who is 1 or more of the following:
- 2 (i) In possession of property belonging to another.
- (ii) A trustee.
- 4 (iii) Indebted to another on an obligation.
- 5 (J) (i) "Insurance company" means an individual, association,
- 6 corporation, fraternal or mutual benefit organization, or any other
- 7 legal entity, whether or not for profit, that is engaged or
- 8 attempting to engage in the business of making insurance or surety
- 9 contracts.
- 10 (K) (<del>j)</del> "Intangible property" includes all of the following:
- 11 (i) Money, checks, drafts, deposits, interest, dividends, and
- 12 income.
- 13 (ii) Credit balances, customer overpayments, security
- 14 deposits, refunds, credit memos, unpaid wages, unused airline
- 15 tickets, and unidentified remittances.
- 16 (iii) Except as provided in sections 15(4) and 30(1), gift
- 17 certificates and gift cards.
- 18 (iv) Stocks and other intangible ownership interests in
- 19 business associations.
- 20 (v) Money deposited to redeem stocks, bonds, coupons, and
- 21 other securities, or to make distributions.
- (vi) Amounts due and payable under the terms of insurance
- 23 policies.
- 24 (vii) Amounts distributable from a trust or custodial fund
- 25 established under a plan to provide health, welfare, pension,
- 26 vacation, severance, retirement, death, stock purchase, profit
- 27 sharing, employee savings, supplemental unemployment insurance, or

- 1 similar benefits.
- 2 (1) (k) "Last known address" means a description of the
- 3 location of the apparent owner sufficient for the purpose of the
- 4 delivery of mail.
- 5 (M) (l) "Owner" means a depositor, in the case of a deposit; a
- 6 beneficiary, in case of a trust other than a deposit in trust; a
- 7 creditor, claimant, or payee, in the case of other intangible
- 8 property; or a person having a legal or equitable interest in
- 9 property subject to this act. Owner includes the legal
- 10 representative of the person defined as an owner in this
- 11 subdivision.
- 12 (N) (m) "Person" means an individual, business association,
- 13 state or other government, governmental subdivision or agency,
- 14 public corporation, public authority, estate, trust, 2 or more
- 15 persons having a joint or common interest, or any other legal or
- 16 commercial entity.
- 17 (0) (n) "Property" means tangible or intangible personal
- 18 property owned by a person.
- (P) (O) "State" means any state, district, commonwealth,
- 20 territory, insular possession, or any other area subject to the
- 21 legislative authority of the United States.
- 22 (Q) <del>(p)</del> "Utility" means a person who owns or operates for
- 23 public use any plant, equipment, property, franchise, or license
- 24 for the transmission of communications or the production, storage,
- 25 transmission, sale, delivery, or furnishing of electricity, water,
- 26 steam, or gas.
- SEC. 4A. (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2), PROPERTY IS

- 1 NOT SUBJECT TO THE CUSTODY OF THIS STATE AS UNCLAIMED PROPERTY IF
- 2 ITS VALUE IS \$50.00 OR LESS.
- 3 (2) SUBSECTION (1) DOES NOT APPLY TO PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN
- 4 SECTION 11A OR DIVIDENDS.
- 5 Sec. 30. (1) The expiration, before or after the effective
- 6 date of this act, of any period of time specified by contract,
- 7 statute, or court order, during which a claim for money or property
- 8 can be made or during which an action or proceeding may be
- 9 commenced or enforced to obtain payment of a claim for money or to
- 10 recover property, does not prevent the money or property from being
- 11 presumed abandoned or affect any duty to file a report or to pay or
- 12 deliver abandoned property to the administrator as required by this
- 13 act. This subsection does not apply to gift cards or gift
- 14 certificates.
- 15 (2) An EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (3), AN
- 16 action or proceeding shall not be commenced by the administrator
- 17 with respect to any duty of a holder under this act more than 10
- 18 years, or, for the holder of records of transactions between 2 or
- 19 more associations as defined under section 37(a)(2), more than 5
- 20 years, after the duty arose.
- 21 (3) FOR ELIGIBLE HOLDERS ELECTING TO PARTICIPATE IN THE
- 22 STREAMLINED AUDIT PROCESS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 31B, AN ACTION OR
- 23 PROCEEDING SHALL NOT BE COMMENCED BY THE ADMINISTRATOR WITH RESPECT
- 24 TO ANY DUTY OF A HOLDER UNDER THIS ACT MORE THAN 4 YEARS AFTER THE
- 25 DUTY AROSE.
- 26 Sec. 31. (1) The administrator may require a person who has
- 27 not filed a report under this act or a person who the administrator

- 1 believes has filed an inactive, incomplete, or false report, to
- 2 file a verified report in a form specified by the administrator.
- 3 The report shall state whether the person is holding any unclaimed
- 4 property reportable or deliverable under this act, describe
- 5 unclaimed property not previously reported or as to which the
- 6 administrator has made inquiry, and specifically identify and state
- 7 the amounts of property that may be in issue.
- 8 (2) The administrator, at reasonable times and upon reasonable
- 9 notice, may examine the records of a person to determine whether
- 10 the person has complied with this act. The administrator may
- 11 conduct the examination even if the person believes he or she is
- 12 not in possession of any property reportable or deliverable under
- 13 this act. The administrator may contract with any other person to
- 14 conduct the examination on behalf of the administrator.
- 15 (3) If a person is treated under section 13 as the holder of
- 16 the property only insofar as the interest of the business
- 17 association in the property is concerned, the administrator,
- 18 pursuant to subsection (2), may examine the records of the person
- 19 if the administrator has given the notice required by subsection
- 20 (2) to both the person and the business association at least 90
- 21 days before the examination.
- 22 (4) Any examination performed by the administrator or his or
- 23 her duly authorized agents must be performed in accordance with the
- 24 generally accepted auditing standards to the extent applicable to
- 25 unclaimed property examinations. A person who has been audited by
- 26 the administrator or his or her duly authorized agents or a person
- 27 whose books, records, and papers have been examined by the

- 1 administrator or his or her duly authorized agents shall be
- 2 provided a complete copy in printed or electronic format of the
- 3 audit report, which shall identify in detail the work performed,
- 4 the property types reviewed, any estimation techniques employed,
- 5 calculations showing the potential amount of property due, and a
- 6 statement of findings as well as all other correspondence and
- 7 documentation which formed a basis for the findings. Not later than
- 8 6 months after the effective date of the amendatory act that added
- 9 this subsection, the administrator shall electronically file a
- 10 request for rule-making with the office of regulatory reinvention
- 11 pursuant to the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306,
- 12 MCL 24.201 to 24.328, to initiate rules on auditing standards.
- 13 (5) When the person being examined does not have substantially
- 14 complete records, the administrator or his or her duly authorized
- 15 agents may determine the amount of any abandoned or unclaimed
- 16 property due and owing based upon a reasonable method of estimation
- 17 consistent with the standards described in subsection (4). If the
- 18 person being examined has filed all the required reports and has
- 19 maintained substantially complete records, then all of the
- 20 following apply to the examination:
- 21 (a) The examination shall include a review of the person's
- 22 books and records.
- 23 (b) The examination shall not be based on an estimate.
- 24 (c) The administrator or his or her duly authorized agents
- 25 shall consider all evidence presented by the holder to remediate
- 26 the findings.
- 27 (6) If an examination of the records of a person results in

- 1 the disclosure of property reportable and deliverable under this
- 2 act, the administrator may assess the cost of the examination
- 3 against the holder at the rate of \$50.00 a day for each examiner;
- 4 however, the charges shall not exceed the value of the property
- 5 actually found to be reportable and deliverable. The cost of
- 6 examination made pursuant to subsection (3) shall be imposed only
- 7 against the business association.
- 8 (7) If a holder fails after the effective date of this act to
- 9 maintain the records required by section 32 and the records of the
- 10 holder available for the periods subject to this act are
- 11 insufficient to permit the preparation of a report, the
- 12 administrator may require the holder to report and pay an amount as
- 13 may reasonably be estimated from any available records.
- 14 (8) FOR AN ELIGIBLE HOLDER THAT HAS ELECTED TO FOLLOW THE
- 15 STREAMLINED PROCESS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 31B, EXAMINATIONS SHALL
- 16 NOT INCLUDE CHECKS VOIDED WITHIN 180 DAYS FROM THE DATE OF ISSUANCE
- 17 OF THE CHECK.
- 18 (9) <del>(8)</del> As used in this section, "substantially complete
- 19 records" means at least 90% of the records necessary for unclaimed
- 20 property examination purposes as defined under the principles of
- 21 internal controls. The determination of substantially complete
- 22 records shall not be made solely as a percentage of the total
- 23 overall individual records to be examined, but also on a
- 24 materiality level of value of the records. The lack of greater than
- 25 10% of records in 1 particular property class to be examined does
- 26 not result in the extrapolation of error in those areas in which a
- 27 person has filed all the required reports and has maintained at

- 1 least 90% of the overall records for that particular property
- 2 class. Substantially complete records are not meant to be an
- 3 absolute measurement of all available records.
- 4 SEC. 31B. (1) ELIGIBLE HOLDERS BEING EXAMINED BY THE
- 5 ADMINISTRATOR UNDER SECTION 31(2) MAY ELECT TO FOLLOW THE
- 6 STREAMLINED AUDIT PROCESS DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION. ELIGIBLE
- 7 HOLDERS MAY ELECT THE STREAMLINED AUDIT PROCESS BY EXECUTING A
- 8 NONDISCLOSURE AGREEMENT ACCEPTABLE TO THE ADMINISTRATOR WITHIN 30
- 9 DAYS FROM THE RECEIPT OF THE AUDIT NOTICE.
- 10 (2) AN AUDIT CONDUCTED UNDER THE STREAMLINED AUDIT PROCESS
- 11 DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION SHALL MEET BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 12 (A) BE COMPLETED WITHIN A TIME FRAME JOINTLY DEVELOPED BY THE
- 13 HOLDER AND THE ADMINISTRATOR, WITH THE GOAL OF COMPLETING THE AUDIT
- 14 WITHIN 18 MONTHS FROM THE RECEIPT OF THE AUDIT NOTICE.
- 15 (B) BE CONDUCTED ACCORDING TO STANDARDS SET FORTH IN RULES AND
- 16 REGULATIONS PROMULGATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 31(4).
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act is retroactive and
- 18 applies to audits in progress as of August 15, 2015, but does not
- 19 retroactively apply to contested determinations in litigation
- 20 before the date of enactment of this amendatory act.
