## **SENATE BILL No. 670**

December 15, 2015, Introduced by Senators WARREN, SCHUITMAKER, PROOS, BOOHER, MARLEAU, KNEZEK, GREGORY and HERTEL and referred to the Committee on Veterans, Military Affairs and Homeland Security.

A bill to create a commission to commemorate the centennial of World War I; to prescribe the powers and duties of the commission; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "World
  War I centennial commission act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
  - (a) "Commission" means the World War I centennial commission created in section 3.
  - (b) "Department" means the department of military and veterans affairs.
    - (c) "Veteran" means that term as it is defined in section 1 of

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- 1 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61.
- 2 Sec. 3. (1) The World War I centennial commission is created
- 3 within the department.
- 4 (2) The commission shall consist of the director of the
- 5 department and 13 members, appointed by the governor with the
- 6 advice and consent of the senate.
- 7 (3) The members first appointed to the commission shall be
- 8 appointed within 90 days after the effective date of this act.
- 9 (4) If a vacancy occurs on the commission, the governor shall
- 10 make an appointment in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 11 (5) The governor may remove a member of the commission for
- 12 incompetence, dereliction of duty, malfeasance, misfeasance, or
- 13 nonfeasance in office, or any other good cause.
- 14 (6) The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the
- 15 director of the department. At the first meeting, the commission
- 16 shall elect from among its members a chairperson and other officers
- 17 as it considers necessary or appropriate. After the first meeting,
- 18 the commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at
- 19 the call of the chairperson or if requested by 7 or more members.
- 20 (7) A majority of the members of the commission constitute a
- 21 quorum for the transaction of business at a meeting of the
- 22 commission. A majority of the members present and serving are
- 23 required for official action of the commission.
- 24 (8) The business that the commission may perform shall be
- 25 conducted at a public meeting of the commission held in compliance
- 26 with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 27 (9) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or

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- 1 retained by the commission in the performance of an official
- 2 function is subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,
- **3** MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 4 (10) Members of the commission shall serve without
- 5 compensation. However, members of the commission may be reimbursed
- 6 for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance
- 7 of their official duties as members of the commission.
- 8 Sec. 4. The commission shall do all of the following:
- 9 (a) Plan, develop, and execute programs, projects, and
- 10 activities to commemorate the centennial of World War I.
- 11 (b) Encourage private organizations and state and local
- 12 governments to organize and participate in activities organized by
- 13 the commission.
- 14 (c) Facilitate and coordinate World War I centennial
- 15 activities throughout this state.
- 16 (d) Serve as a clearinghouse for the collection and
- 17 dissemination of information about World War I centennial events
- 18 and plans.
- 19 (e) Develop recommendations on ways to commemorate the World
- 20 War I centennial in this state and provide a report on these
- 21 recommendations to the director, the governor, and the legislature.
- Sec. 5. The department shall assist the commission in carrying
- 23 out its duties under this act.
- 24 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 25 date it is enacted into law.
