## **SENATE BILL No. 867**

March 24, 2016, Introduced by Senators SCHUITMAKER and JONES and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1996 PA 195, entitled
"Police officer's and fire fighter's survivor tuition grant act,"
by amending section 2 (MCL 390.1242), as amended by 2012 PA 470.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- (a) "Academic year" means the period from September 1 of acalendar year to August 31 of the next calendar year.
- 4 (b) "Child" means an individual who is a natural or adopted
  5 child of a deceased Michigan police officer or deceased Michigan
  6 fire fighter and who was under the age of 21 at the time of the
- 7 Michigan police officer's or Michigan fire fighter's death.
- 8 (c) "Department" means the department of treasury.

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- 1 (d) "Eligible student" means a child or surviving spouse of a
- 2 Michigan police officer or Michigan fire fighter who was or is
- 3 killed in the line of duty.
- 4 (e) "Eligible tuition" means the tuition charged by a state
- 5 institution of higher education for an undergraduate class.
- **6** (f) "Killed" means that the Michigan police officer's or
- 7 Michigan fire fighter's death is the direct and proximate result of
- 8 a traumatic injury incurred in the line of duty.
- 9 (g) "Line of duty" means an action that a Michigan police
- 10 officer or Michigan fire fighter is obligated or authorized to
- 11 perform by rule, regulation, condition of employment or service, or
- 12 law, including, but not limited to, a social, ceremonial, or
- 13 athletic function that the Michigan police officer or Michigan fire
- 14 fighter is assigned to or compensated for by the public agency he
- 15 or she serves.
- 16 (h) "Michigan police officer" means a sheriff or sheriff's
- 17 deputy of a sheriff's department in this state; village or township
- 18 marshal of a village or township in this state; officer of the
- 19 police department of any city, village, or township in this state;
- 20 officer of the Michigan state police; or any other police officer
- 21 or law enforcement officer trained and LICENSED OR certified under
- 22 the MICHIGAN commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA
- 23 203, MCL 28.601 to 28.616.28.615.
- 24 (i) "Michigan fire fighter" means a member including volunteer
- 25 members and members paid on call of a fire department, or other
- 26 organization that provides fire suppression and other fire-related
- 27 services, of a city, township, village, or county who is

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- 1 responsible for or is in a capacity that includes responsibility
- 2 for the extinguishment of fires. Michigan fire fighter does not
- 3 include a person whose job description, duties, or responsibilities
- 4 do not include direct involvement in fire suppression.
- 5 (j) "Occupational disease" means a disease that routinely
- 6 constitutes a special hazard in, or is commonly regarded as
- 7 concomitant of, the Michigan police officer's or Michigan fire
- 8 fighter's occupation.
- 9 (k) "State institution of higher education" means a public
- 10 community or junior college established under section 7 of article
- 11 VIII of the state constitution of 1963 or part 25 of the revised
- 12 school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1601 to 380.1607, or a state
- 13 university described in section 4, 5, or 6 of article VIII of the
- 14 state constitution of 1963.
- 15 (l) "Survivor's tuition grant" means a tuition grant awarded
- 16 to an eligible student under this act.
- 17 (m) "Traumatic injury" means a wound or the condition of the
- 18 body caused by external force, including, but not limited to, an
- 19 injury inflicted by bullet, explosive, sharp instrument, blunt
- 20 object or other physical blow, fire, smoke, chemical, electricity,
- 21 climatic condition, infectious disease, radiation, or bacteria, but
- 22 excluding an injury resulting from stress, strain, or occupational
- 23 disease.
- 24 (n) "Undergraduate class" means a class or course that
- 25 provides a student with academic credit applicable toward a
- 26 bachelor or associate degree from a state institution of higher
- 27 education.

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- 1 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 2 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 3 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 4 unless Senate Bill No. 92 or House Bill No.\_\_\_\_ (request no.
- 5 00913'15 \*) of the 98th Legislature is enacted into law.

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
