THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 141c. (1) The legislative body of a city, village, or township may establish a board of appeals to hear all of the cases and carry out all of the duties of the legislative body described in section 141(3) and (4).
 - (2) The A board of appeals shall be CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, appointed by the legislative body of the city, village, or township: and shall consist of the following members:
 - (a) A building contractor.

(b) A registered AN architect or PROFESSIONAL engineer WHO IS LICENSED UNDER ARTICLE 20 OF THE OCCUPATIONAL CODE, 1980 PA 299,
