## **HOUSE BILL No. 4159**

February 5, 2015, Introduced by Reps. Johnson and Franz and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled

"An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,"

by amending section 50 (MCL 28.4250), as amended by 2014 PA 206.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 50. (1) Subject to subsection (5), an individual licensed
- under this act to carry a concealed pistol, or who is exempt from
  - licensure under section 12a(1)(h), shall not carry a concealed
- 4 pistol on the premises of any of the following:

- 1 (a) A school or school property except that a parent or legal
- 2 guardian of a student of the school is not precluded from carrying
- 3 a concealed pistol while in a vehicle on school property, if he or
- 4 she is dropping the student off at the school or picking up the
- 5 student from the school. As used in this section, "school" and
- 6 "school property" mean those terms as defined in section 237a of
- 7 the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.237a.
- 8 (b) A public or private child care center or day care center,
- 9 public or private child caring institution, or public or private
- 10 child placing agency.
- 11 (c) A sports arena or stadium.
- 12 (d) A bar or tavern licensed under the Michigan liquor control
- 13 code of 1998, 1998 PA 58, MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303, where the
- 14 primary source of income of the business is the sale of alcoholic
- 15 liquor by the glass and consumed on the premises. This subdivision
- 16 does not apply to an owner or employee of the business. The
- 17 Michigan liquor control commission shall develop and make available
- 18 to holders of licenses under the Michigan liquor control code of
- 19 1998, 1998 PA 58, MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303, an appropriate sign
- 20 stating that "This establishment prohibits patrons from carrying
- 21 concealed weapons". The owner or operator of an establishment
- 22 licensed under the Michigan liquor control code of 1998, 1998 PA
- 23 58, MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303, may, but is not required to, post the
- 24 sign developed under this subdivision.
- 25 (e) Any property or facility owned or operated by a church,
- 26 synagogue, mosque, temple, or other place of worship, unless the
- 27 presiding official or officials of the church, synagogue, mosque,

- 1 temple, or other place of worship permit the carrying of concealed
- 2 pistol on that property or facility.
- 3 (f) An entertainment facility with a seating capacity of 2,500
- 4 or more individuals that the individual knows or should know has a
- 5 seating capacity of 2,500 or more individuals or that has a sign
- 6 above each public entrance stating in letters not less than 1-inch
- 7 high a seating capacity of 2,500 or more individuals.
- 8 (g) A hospital.
- 9 (h) A dormitory or classroom of a community college, college,
- 10 or university.
- 11 (2) Subject to subsection (5), an individual shall not carry a
- 12 portable device that uses electro-muscular disruption technology on
- 13 any of the premises described in subsection (1).
- 14 (3) An individual licensed under this act to carry a concealed
- 15 pistol, or who is exempt from licensure under section 12a(1)(h),
- 16 shall not carry a concealed pistol in violation of R 432.1212 or a
- 17 successor rule of the Michigan administrative code promulgated
- 18 under the Michigan gaming control and revenue act, 1996 IL 1, MCL
- **19** 432.201 to 432.226.
- 20 (4) As used in subsection (1), "premises" does not include
- 21 parking areas of the places identified under subsection (1).
- 22 (5) Subsections (1) and (2) do not apply to any of the
- 23 following:
- 24 (a) An individual licensed under this act who is a retired
- 25 police officer or retired law enforcement officer. The concealed
- 26 weapon licensing board may require a letter from the law
- 27 enforcement agency stating that the retired police officer or law

- 1 enforcement officer retired in good standing.
- 2 (b) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is
- 3 employed or contracted by an entity described under subsection (1)
- 4 to provide security services and is required by his or her employer
- 5 or the terms of a contract to carry a concealed firearm on the
- 6 premises of the employing or contracting entity.
- 7 (c) An individual who is licensed as a private investigator or
- 8 private detective under the professional investigator licensure
- 9 act, 1965 PA 285, MCL 338.821 to 338.851.
- 10 (d) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 11 corrections officer of a county sheriff's department OR WHO IS
- 12 LICENSED UNDER THIS ACT AND IS A RETIRED CORRECTIONS OFFICER OF A
- 13 COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT. THE CONCEALED WEAPON LICENSING BOARD
- 14 MAY REQUIRE A LETTER FROM THE COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT STATING
- 15 THAT THE RETIRED CORRECTIONS OFFICER RETIRED IN GOOD STANDING.
- 16 (e) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 17 motor carrier officer or capitol security officer of the department
- 18 of state police.
- 19 (f) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 20 member of a sheriff's posse.
- 21 (q) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is an
- 22 auxiliary officer or reserve officer of a police or sheriff's
- 23 department.
- 24 (h) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 25 parole or probation officer of the department of corrections. ANY OF
- 26 THE FOLLOWING:
- 27 (i) A PAROLE, PROBATION, OR CORRECTIONS OFFICER OR ABSCONDER

- 1 RECOVERY UNIT MEMBER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS.
- 2 (ii) A RETIRED PAROLE, PROBATION, OR CORRECTIONS OFFICER OR
- 3 RETIRED ABSCONDER RECOVERY UNIT MEMBER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 4 CORRECTIONS. THE CONCEALED WEAPON LICENSING BOARD MAY REQUIRE A
- 5 LETTER FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS STATING THAT THE RETIRED
- 6 PAROLE, PROBATION, OR CORRECTIONS OFFICER OR RETIRED ABSCONDER
- 7 RECOVERY UNIT MEMBER RETIRED IN GOOD STANDING.
- 8 (i) A state court judge or state court retired judge who is
- 9 licensed under this act. The concealed weapon licensing board may
- 10 require a state court retired judge to obtain and carry a letter
- 11 from the judicial tenure commission stating that the state court
- 12 retired judge is in good standing as authorized under section 30 of
- 13 article VI of the state constitution of 1963, and rules promulgated
- 14 under that section, in order to qualify under this subdivision.
- 15 (j) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 16 court officer.
- 17 (6) An individual who violates this section is responsible for
- 18 a state civil infraction or guilty of a crime as follows:
- 19 (a) Except as provided in subdivisions (b) and (c), the
- 20 individual is responsible for a state civil infraction and may be
- 21 fined not more than \$500.00. The court shall order the individual's
- 22 license to carry a concealed pistol suspended for 6 months.
- 23 (b) For a second violation, the individual is guilty of a
- 24 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00. The
- 25 court shall order the individual's license to carry a concealed
- 26 pistol revoked.
- (c) For a third or subsequent violation, the individual is

- 1 guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4
- 2 years or a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, or both. The court
- 3 shall order the individual's license to carry a concealed pistol
- 4 revoked.

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
