HOUSE BILL No. 4442

April 14, 2015, Introduced by Rep. Muxlow and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1986 PA 102, entitled

"An act to establish a grant program for certain part-time, independent students in this state; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and institutions of higher education, "

by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 (MCL 390.1281, 390.1282, 390.1283, 390.1284, 390.1285, 390.1286, 390.1287, and 390.1288), section 3 as amended by 2004 PA 180.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. As used in this act: 2
 - (a) "Authority" means the Michigan higher education assistance authority created by Act No. 77 of the Public Acts of 1960, being sections 390.951 to 390.961 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
 - (A) "COMMUNITY COLLEGE" MEANS A COMMUNITY COLLEGE ORGANIZED UNDER THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE ACT OF 1966, 1966 PA 331, MCL 389.1 TO 389.195, OR UNDER PART 25 OF THE REVISED SCHOOL CODE, 1976 PA 451,

- 1 MCL 380.1601 TO 380.1607, OR A FEDERAL TRIBALLY CONTROLLED
- 2 COMMUNITY COLLEGE LOCATED IN THIS STATE THAT IS RECOGNIZED UNDER

- 4 1978, 25 USC 1801 TO 1852, AND IS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF

- 22 Sec. 2. A grant program is established by the state to foster
- 23 the pursuit of postsecondary education by part-time, independent
- 24 students who have financial need ELIGIBLE STUDENTS.
- 25 Sec. 3. A person AN INDIVIDUAL is eligible to participate in
- 26 the grant program if he or she meets all of the following:
- 27 (a) Is a part-time student.

- 2 (c) Has not been enrolled in a high school diploma program
- 3 other than general educational development (GED) or adult education
- 4 for at least the 2 preceding years.
- 5 (d) Is enrolled or accepted for enrollment in an undergraduate
- 6 A program of not less than 9 months duration leading to a degree or
- 7 certificate from a Michigan degree granting educational institution
- 8 that is approved by the department of labor and economic
- 9 growth.COMMUNITY COLLEGE.
- (e) Has resided continuously in this state for the immediately
- 11 preceding 12 months and is not considered a resident of any other
- 12 state.
- 13 (f) Is not incarcerated in a corrections institution.
- 14 (g) Has complied with this act and the rules promulgated under
- 15 this act by the authority. DEPARTMENT.
- 16 (h) Is a United States citizen or permanent resident.
- 17 (i) Is not enrolled in an institution whose primary purpose is
- 18 to prepare students for ordination or appointment as a member of
- 19 the clergy of a church, denomination, or religious association,
- 20 order, or sect.
- 21 (I) $\frac{(j)}{(j)}$ Is not in default on a loan guaranteed by the
- 22 authority.DEPARTMENT.
- 23 (J) (k)—Is shown by the school—COMMUNITY COLLEGE to be making
- 24 satisfactory academic progress.
- 25 (K) IS SHOWN BY THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE TO HAVE FINANCIAL NEED.
- 26 Sec. 4. The total of the amount granted to an educational
- 27 institution A COMMUNITY COLLEGE shall be proportionate to the

- 2 ELIGIBLE STUDENTS enrolled at the institution COMMUNITY COLLEGE for
- 3 the most recent year for which statistics are available. Funds
- 4 provided to eligible schools THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE shall be used
- 5 USE THOSE FUNDS for awards to ELIGIBLE students, not for
- 6 administration of the program.
- 7 Sec. 5. (1) Upon application of an eligible student, an
- 8 educational institution A COMMUNITY COLLEGE shall grant to the
- 9 student an amount of not more than \$600.00 per NOT EXCEEDING A
- 10 MAXIMUM GRANT AMOUNT ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR AN academic
- 11 year for not more than 2-3 12-month periods at any given
- 12 educational institution. THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE.
- 13 (2) If the number of eligible applicants STUDENTS exceeds the
- 14 money available, priority shall be given to persons ELIGIBLE

- 16 HOWEVER, IF THAT ACT DOES NOT PROVIDE THAT DIRECTION, THEN PRIORITY

- 20 (3) A-SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 3, A student who

- 9 the social welfare act, Act No. 280 of the Public Acts of 1939,
- 10 being sections 400.1 to 400.121 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.1939
- 11 PA 280, MCL 400.1 TO 400.119B.
- 12 Sec. 7. The authority DEPARTMENT may accept gifts, grants,
- 13 bequests, donations, and devises, from whatever sources, of real,
- 14 personal, or mixed property and money for the purposes described in
- 15 this act. The authority DEPARTMENT shall prepare an annual report
- 16 of all gifts, grants, bequests, donations, and devises for the
- 17 governor and the legislature.
- 18 Sec. 8. The authority DEPARTMENT shall promulgate rules to
- 19 implement this act pursuant to the administrative procedures act of
- 20 1969, Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, being sections 24.201
- 21 to 24.328 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 TO
- 22 24.328.
