A bill to require employers to post information concerning equal pay requirements; and to provide sanctions.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. (1) This act shall be known and may be cited as the
  "workplace equality laws posting act".
  - (2) An employer employing 50 or more individuals at any time during the calendar year at a single work site in this state shall inform employees of, and keep posted at the work site in a conspicuous place where employees may conveniently read it, a notice with all of the following information:
  - (a) A statement that it is illegal under federal law and the law of this state to pay employees different wages for the same work based solely on sex.
    - (b) A statement that an employee who believes his or her
