## **HOUSE BILL No. 4527**

April 28, 2015, Introduced by Reps. Rutledge, Hughes, Moss, Kelly, LaVoy, Driskell, Darany, Dianda, Pscholka, Glenn, Lyons, Singh, Townsend, Barrett, Faris and Potvin and referred to the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs.

A bill to amend 1981 PA 82, entitled

"An act to prohibit the use of certain collars or harnesses and leashes on dogs in public places, except by deaf, audibly impaired, or otherwise physically limited persons; and to prescribe penalties,"

by amending the title and sections 1, 2, and 3 (MCL 752.61, 752.62, and 752.63), the title and sections 1 and 2 as amended by 1984 PA 111.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

An act to prohibit the use of certain collars or harnesses and leashes on dogs A PERSON FROM REPRESENTING THAT HE OR SHE IS IN POSSESSION OF A SERVICE ANIMAL in public places, except by deaf, audibly impaired, or otherwise physically limited persons; UNLESS THAT PERSON IS A PERSON WITH A DISABILITY; and to prescribe penalties.

- 2 (a) "Audibly impaired" means the inability to hear air
- 3 conduction thresholds at an average of 40 decibels or greater in

- 18 SUBPARAGRAPH (i).
- 19 (iii) IS PERCEIVED BY OTHER PERSONS AS HAVING AN IMPAIRMENT
- 20 DESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (i).
- 21 (B) AS USED IN SUBDIVISION (A), "PERSON WITH A DISABILITY"
- 22 INCLUDES A VETERAN WHO HAS BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH 1 OR MORE OF THE

- 24 (i) POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER.

- 4 Sec. 2. A person, except a person who is deaf, audibly

- 10 Sec. 3. A person who knowingly violates this act is guilty of
- 11 a misdemeanor punishable by a 1 OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 12 (A) IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 90 DAYS.
- 13 (B) A fine of not more than \$10.00.\$500.00.
- 14 (C) COMMUNITY SERVICE FOR NOT MORE THAN 30 DAYS.
