## **HOUSE BILL No. 4793**

August 18, 2015, Introduced by Rep. Lucido and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1974 PA 258, entitled "Mental health code,"

by amending section 434 (MCL 330.1434), as amended by 1995 PA 290.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 434. (1) Any individual 18 years of age or over may file with the court a petition that asserts that an individual is a person requiring treatment as defined in section 401.
- 4 (2) The petition shall contain the facts that are the basis 5 for the assertion, the names and addresses, if known, of any 6 witnesses to the facts, and, if known, the name and address of the 7 nearest relative or guardian, or, if none, a friend, if known, of 8 the individual.
  - (3) The petition shall be accompanied by the clinical certificate of a physician or a licensed psychologist, unless after reasonable effort the petitioner could not secure an examination.

- 1 If a clinical certificate does not accompany the petition, an
- 2 affidavit setting forth the reasons an examination could not be
- 3 secured shall also be filed. The petition may also be accompanied
- 4 by a second clinical certificate. If 2 clinical certificates
- 5 accompany the petition, at least 1 clinical certificate shall have
- 6 been executed by a psychiatrist.
- 7 (4) Except as otherwise provided in section 455, a clinical
- 8 certificate that accompanies a petition shall have been executed
- 9 within 72 hours before the filing of the petition, and after
- 10 personal examination of the individual.
- 11 (5) A PETITION AND ANY CLINICAL CERTIFICATE FILED UNDER THIS
- 12 SECTION SHALL BE MAINTAINED BY THE COURT AS A CONFIDENTIAL RECORD
- 13 AND IN A MANNER TO PREVENT DISCLOSURE OF THE FILING AND CONTENT OF
- 14 THE PETITION OR CLINICAL CERTIFICATE TO THE PUBLIC OR ANY PERSON
- 15 NOT SPECIFICALLY AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS CHAPTER TO RECEIVE NOTICE OF
- 16 THE PETITION OR CLINICAL CERTIFICATE.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 18 after the date it is enacted into law.
