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## **HOUSE BILL No. 4911**

September 29, 2015, Introduced by Reps. Crawford, Webber, Jacobsen and Brett Roberts and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1939 PA 288, entitled

"Probate code of 1939,"

by amending sections 36 and 56 of chapter X (MCL 710.36 and 710.56), section 36 as amended by 1996 PA 409 and section 56 as amended by 2014 PA 118.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 CHAPTER X

Sec. 36. (1) If a child is claimed to be born out of wedlock and the mother executes or proposes to execute a release or consent relinquishing her rights to the child or joins in a petition for adoption filed by her husband, SPOUSE, and the release or consent of the natural father cannot be obtained, the judge shall hold a hearing as soon as practical to determine whether the child was born out of wedlock, to determine the identity of the father, and

- 1 to determine or terminate the rights of the father as provided in
- 2 this section and sections 37 and 39 of this chapter.
- 3 (2) Proof of service of a notice of intent to release or
- 4 consent or the putative father's verified acknowledgment of notice
- 5 of intent to release or consent shall be filed with the court, if
- 6 the notice was given to the putative father. The court shall
- 7 request the vital records division of the department of public
- 8 health to send to the court a copy of any notice of intent to claim
- 9 paternity of the particular child which THAT the division has
- 10 received.
- 11 (3) Notice of the hearing shall be served upon the following:
- 12 (a) A putative father who has timely filed a notice of intent
- 13 to claim paternity as provided in section 33 or 34 of this chapter.
- 14 (b) A putative father who was not served a notice of intent to
- 15 release or consent at least 30 days before the expected date of
- 16 confinement specified in the notice of intent to release or
- 17 consent.
- 18 (c) Any other male who was not served pursuant ACCORDING to
- 19 section 34(1) of this chapter with a notice of intent to release or
- 20 consent and who the court has reason to believe may be the CHILD'S
- 21 father. of the child.
- 22 (4) The notice of hearing shall inform the putative father
- 23 that his failure to appear at the hearing shall constitute
- 24 CONSTITUTES a denial of his interest in custody of the child, which
- 25 denial shall result in the court's termination of his rights to the
- 26 child.
- 27 (5) Proof of service of the notice of hearing required by

- 1 subsection (3) shall be filed with the court. A verified
- 2 acknowledgment of service by the party to be served is proof of
- 3 personal service. Notice of the hearing shall—IS not be—required if
- 4 the putative father is present at the hearing. A waiver of notice
- 5 of hearing by a person entitled to receive it is sufficient.
- 6 (6) The court shall receive evidence as to the identity of the
- 7 father of the child. IN LIEU OF THE MOTHER'S LIVE TESTIMONY, THE
- 8 COURT SHALL RECEIVE AN AFFIDAVIT OR A VERIFIED WRITTEN DECLARATION
- 9 FROM THE MOTHER AS EVIDENCE OF THE IDENTITY AND WHEREABOUTS OF THE
- 10 CHILD'S FATHER. IF THE COURT DETERMINES THAT THE AFFIDAVIT OR
- 11 VERIFIED WRITTEN DECLARATION IS INSUFFICIENT, THE COURT SHALL ALLOW
- 12 AMENDMENT OF THE AFFIDAVIT OR VERIFIED WRITTEN DECLARATION. Based
- 13 upon the evidence received, the court shall enter a finding
- 14 identifying the father or declaring that the identity of the father
- 15 cannot be determined.
- 16 (7) If the court finds that the CHILD'S father of the child is
- 17 a person who did not receive either a timely notice of intent to
- 18 release or consent pursuant—ACCORDING to section 34(1) of this
- 19 chapter or a notice required pursuant to UNDER subsection (3) and
- 20 who has neither waived his right to notice of hearing nor is
- 21 present at the hearing, the court shall adjourn further proceedings
- 22 until that person is served with a notice of hearing.
- 23 Sec. 56. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection,
- 24 6 months after formal placement under section 51 of this chapter,
- 25 unless the court determines that circumstances have arisen that
- 26 make adoption undesirable, the court may enter an order of
- 27 adoption. Upon the motion of the petitioner, the court may waive

- 1 the 6-month period, or any portion of that period, if the waiver is
- 2 in the adoptee's best interests. If, after a hearing, the court
- 3 finds that the adoptee's best interests will be served, it may
- 4 extend the 6-month period for an additional period of time not
- 5 exceeding 18 months from the time of formal placement for adoption.
- 6 In an adoption proceeding for which an adoption order is not
- 7 entered within 18 months after formal placement, the court shall
- 8 hold a hearing and determine whether an order of adoption shall be
- 9 entered or the petition denied. If a child is formally placed
- 10 according to section 41(2) of this chapter, the court may extend
- 11 the 6-month period for an additional period, that may exceed 18
- 12 months from the time of formal placement, until an order for
- 13 adoption may be entered under subsection (2). For an adoptee who is
- 14 less than 1 year old at the time of filing, 3 months after formal
- 15 placement under section 51 of this chapter, unless the court
- 16 determines that circumstances have arisen that make adoption
- 17 undesirable, the court may enter an order of adoption. UPON THE
- 18 MOTION OF THE PETITIONER, THE COURT MAY WAIVE THE 3-MONTH PERIOD,
- 19 OR ANY PORTION OF THAT PERIOD, IF THE WAIVER IS IN THE ADOPTEE'S
- 20 BEST INTERESTS.
- 21 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3), if a petition for
- 22 rehearing or an appeal as of right from an order terminating
- 23 parental rights has been filed, the court shall not order an
- 24 adoption until 1 of the following occurs:
- 25 (a) The petition for rehearing is granted, and at the
- 26 rehearing the order terminating parental rights is not modified or
- 27 set aside, and subsequently the period for appeal as of right to

- 1 the court of appeals has expired without an appeal being filed.
- 2 (b) The petition for rehearing is denied and the period for
- 3 appeal as of right to the court of appeals has expired without an
- 4 appeal being filed.
- 5 (c) The court of appeals affirms the order terminating
- 6 parental rights.
- 7 (3) If an application for leave to appeal has been filed with
- 8 the supreme court, the court shall not order an adoption until 1 or
- 9 more of the following occurs:
- (a) The application for leave to appeal is denied.
- 11 (b) The supreme court affirms the order terminating parental
- 12 rights.
- 13 (4) If a motion brought under section 45 of this chapter has
- 14 been filed, the court shall not order an adoption until 1 of the
- 15 following occurs:
- 16 (a) The motion is decided and subsequently the period for
- 17 appeal as of right to the court of appeals has expired without an
- 18 appeal being filed.
- 19 (b) The motion is decided, an appeal as of right to the court
- 20 of appeals has been filed, the court of appeals issues an opinion,
- 21 and subsequently the period for filing an application for leave to
- 22 the supreme court has expired without an application being filed.
- 23 (c) The supreme court denies an application for leave or, if
- 24 an application is granted, the supreme court issues an opinion.
- 25 (5) If the person to be adopted is an adult, the court may
- 26 enter an order of adoption after all of the following occur:
- 27 (a) The person to be adopted consents to the adoption

- 1 according to section 43(3) of this chapter.
- 2 (b) The written report of investigation required by section
- **3** 46(2) of this chapter is filed.
- 4 (c) Notice has been served upon interested parties described
- 5 in section 24a of this chapter.
- 6 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 7 after the date it is enacted into law.
