HOUSE BILL No. 4915

September 29, 2015, Introduced by Reps. McCready, Kosowski, Vaupel, Rendon, Kesto, Tedder, Love and Goike and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1969 PA 287, entitled

"An act to regulate pet shops, animal control shelters, and animal protection shelters; to establish uniform procedures and minimum requirements for adoption of dogs, cats, and ferrets; and to prescribe penalties and civil fines and to provide remedies,"

by amending sections 1, 2, 6, and 9a (MCL 287.331, 287.332, 287.336, and 287.339a), sections 1 and 6 as amended and section 9a as added by 1997 PA 7, and by adding sections 8b, 8c, and 9c.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:

(a) "Adoption" means a transfer of ownership, with or without remuneration, of a dog, cat, or ferret from an animal control shelter or animal protection shelter to an individual for the purpose of being a companion animal for that individual. As used in this subdivision, a companion animal includes but is not limited to a dog that is used for hunting or as a guard dog.

- 1 (b) "Alteration" means a professional sterilization procedure
- 2 performed by a veterinarian that renders a dog, cat, or ferret
- 3 incapable of reproducing.
- 4 (c) "Altered", in reference to a dog, cat, or ferret, means
- 5 having undergone alteration.
- 6 (d) "Animal" means a mammal except livestock as THAT TERM IS
- 7 defined in **SECTION 1 OF** 1937 PA 284, MCL 287.121, to 287.131, and
- 8 rodents.
- 9 (e) "Animal control shelter" means a facility operated by a
- 10 municipality for the impoundment and care of animals that are found
- 11 in the streets or at large, animals that are otherwise held due to
- 12 the violation of a municipal ordinance or state law, or animals
- 13 that are surrendered to the animal control shelter.
- 14 (f) "Animal protection shelter" means a facility operated by a
- 15 person, humane society, society for the prevention of cruelty to
- 16 animals, or any other nonprofit organization for the care of
- 17 homeless animals.
- 18 (g) "Cat" means a domestic cat of any age of the species felis
- 19 FELIS catus.
- (h) "Department" means the state department of agriculture AND
- 21 RURAL DEVELOPMENT.
- (i) "Director" means the director of the department or his or
- 23 her authorized representative.
- 24 (j) "Dog" means a domestic dog of any age of the species canis
- 25 CANIS familiaris.
- 26 (k) "Ferret" means an animal of any age of the species mustela
- 27 MUSTELA furo.

- 1 (l) "Health certificate" means a certificate in a form
- 2 prescribed by the department in which a veterinarian attests to the
- 3 age, sex, breed, and description of an animal, and to the fact that
- 4 at the time of preparation of the certificate, the veterinarian
- 5 examined the animal and found the animal free from visual evidence
- 6 of communicable disease.
- 7 (M) "HOLDING PERIOD" MEANS THE MINIMUM PERIOD OF TIME, IN
- 8 DAYS, AFTER AN ANIMAL'S INTAKE INTO AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER'S OR
- 9 ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER'S INVENTORY FOR WHICH THE ANIMAL MUST BE
- 10 HELD PRIOR TO BEING MADE AVAILABLE FOR ADOPTION, EUTHANASIA,
- 11 TRANSFER, SALE, OR OTHER DISPOSITION. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS
- 12 SUBDIVISION, A DAY IS A TIME PERIOD OF 24 HOURS DURING WHICH AN
- 13 ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER OR ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER IS OPEN FOR
- 14 BUSINESS OR AVAILABLE BY APPOINTMENT AND ACCESSIBLE TO THE OWNER OF
- 15 AN ANIMAL FOR ANY PORTION OF THAT 24-HOUR PERIOD FOR THE PURPOSE OF
- 16 RECLAIMING HIS OR HER ANIMAL FROM THE ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER OR
- 17 ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER. IF AN ANIMAL IS HELD AT AN ANIMAL
- 18 CONTROL SHELTER, THE HOLDING PERIOD BEGINS AT THE TIME THE ANIMAL
- 19 IS ADMITTED TO THE ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER. ALL OF THE FOLLOWING
- 20 APPLY TO THE HOLDING PERIOD FOR AN ANIMAL HELD AT AN ANIMAL
- 21 PROTECTION SHELTER:
- 22 (i) IF THE ANIMAL IS A DOG, AND IF THE ANIMAL PROTECTION
- 23 SHELTER HAS A CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP WITH A GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY
- 24 AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 8B, THE HOLDING PERIOD BEGINS AT THE TIME
- 25 THE ANIMAL IS ADMITTED TO THE ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER.
- 26 (ii) IF THE ANIMAL IS A CAT, THE HOLDING PERIOD BEGINS AT THE
- 27 TIME THE ANIMAL IS ADMITTED TO THE ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER.

- 1 (iii) IF THE ANIMAL IS A DOG, AND IF THE ANIMAL PROTECTION
- 2 SHELTER DOES NOT HAVE A CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP WITH A
- 3 GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 8B, THE HOLDING PERIOD
- 4 BEGINS AT THE TIME THE ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER NOTIFIES THE LAW
- 5 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY THAT HAS JURISDICTION OVER ANIMAL CONTROL WITHIN
- 6 THE MUNICIPALITY IN WHICH THE DOG WAS RECOVERED THAT THE ANIMAL
- 7 PROTECTION SHELTER IS HOLDING THE DOG.
- 8 (N) (m) "Municipality" "LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT" means a
- 9 county, city, village, or township.
- 10 (0) (n) "Person" means an individual, partnership,
- 11 corporation, association, governmental entity, or other legal
- 12 entity.
- (P) (o) "Pet shop" means a place where animals are sold or
- 14 offered for sale, exchange, or transfer.
- 15 (O) "STERILIZATION RELEASE PROGRAM" MEANS A PROGRAM UNDER
- 16 WHICH A DOMESTIC CAT THAT DOES NOT HAVE CURRENT, TRACEABLE EVIDENCE
- 17 OF OWNERSHIP IS ALTERED AND RETURNED TO ITS COMMUNITY OF ORIGIN.
- 18 (R) (p) "Veterinarian" means a person licensed to practice
- 19 veterinary medicine under article 15 of the public health code,
- 20 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16101 to 333.18838.
- 21 Sec. 2. The agriculture department shall issue MAY PROMULGATE
- 22 rules to accomplish the purposes of this act and to establish
- 23 minimum standards for THE housing, care, and handling of animals to
- 24 insure the humane care and handling of animals. The IF THE
- 25 DEPARTMENT PROMULGATES RULES UNDER THIS SECTION, THE rules shall be
- 26 promulgated in accordance with the provisions of Act No. 88 of the
- 27 Public Acts of 1943, as amended, being sections 24.71 to 24.80 of

- 1 the Compiled Laws of 1948, and subject to Act No. 197 of the Public
- 2 Acts of 1952, as amended, being sections 24.101 to 24.110 of the
- 3 Compiled Laws of 1948. THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969,
- 4 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 TO 24.328.
- 5 Sec. 6. (1) A municipality LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT shall not
- 6 operate an animal control shelter unless the animal control shelter
- 7 is registered with the department.
- 8 (2) A society for the prevention of cruelty to animals —or
- 9 any other person —shall not operate an animal protection shelter
- 10 unless the shelter is registered with the department.
- 11 SEC. 8B. A GOVERNMENT AGENCY THAT HAS JURISDICTION OVER ANIMAL
- 12 CONTROL WITHIN A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT AND AN ANIMAL PROTECTION
- 13 SHELTER MAY ENTER INTO A CONTRACT UNDER WHICH THE ANIMAL PROTECTION
- 14 SHELTER AGREES TO PROVIDE HOUSING AND CARE FOR ANIMALS UNDER THE
- 15 JURISDICTION OF THAT GOVERNMENT AGENCY.
- 16 SEC. 8C. (1) AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER OR AN ANIMAL PROTECTION
- 17 SHELTER SHALL OBSERVE A 7-DAY MINIMUM HOLDING PERIOD FOR AN ANIMAL
- 18 WITH CURRENT, TRACEABLE EVIDENCE OF OWNERSHIP. THE ANIMAL CONTROL
- 19 SHELTER OR AN ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER SHALL USE ALL REASONABLE
- 20 METHODS TO IDENTIFY THE OWNER OF THE ANIMAL, INCLUDING UNIVERSAL
- 21 MICROCHIP SCANNING EQUIPMENT AND ANY OTHER METHODS PRESCRIBED BY
- 22 THE DIRECTOR. THE ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER OR ANIMAL PROTECTION
- 23 SHELTER SHALL NOTIFY THE OWNER OF AN ANIMAL USING THE MEANS
- 24 PROVIDED FOR IN THE IDENTIFICATION AND SHALL NOT DISPOSE OF THE
- 25 ANIMAL FOR AT LEAST 7 DAYS AFTER THE DATE AND TIME OF THE
- 26 DOCUMENTED NOTIFICATION.
- 27 (2) AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER OR AN ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER

- 1 SHALL OBSERVE A 4-DAY MINIMUM HOLDING PERIOD FOR A DOG THAT DOES
- 2 NOT HAVE CURRENT, TRACEABLE EVIDENCE OF OWNERSHIP.
- 3 (3) AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER OR AN ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER
- 4 SHALL OBSERVE A 4-DAY MINIMUM HOLDING PERIOD FOR A CAT THAT DOES
- 5 NOT HAVE CURRENT, TRACEABLE EVIDENCE OF OWNERSHIP AND IS NOT A
- 6 CANDIDATE FOR ADOPTION OR A STERILIZATION RELEASE PROGRAM.
- 7 (4) AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER OR AN ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER
- 8 MAY OBSERVE A ZERO-DAY HOLDING PERIOD FOR A CAT THAT DOES NOT HAVE
- 9 CURRENT, TRACEABLE EVIDENCE OF OWNERSHIP IF THAT CAT IS A CANDIDATE
- 10 FOR ADOPTION OR A STERILIZATION RELEASE PROGRAM.
- 11 (5) ONCE THE APPLICABLE HOLDING PERIOD AS PROVIDED IN
- 12 SUBSECTIONS (1) TO (4) HAS BEEN FULFILLED, OWNERSHIP OF THE ANIMAL
- 13 TRANSFERS TO THE ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER OR ANIMAL PROTECTION
- 14 SHELTER IN POSSESSION OF THE ANIMAL DURING THE HOLDING PERIOD.
- 15 (6) A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT SHALL NOT ADOPT AN ORDINANCE,
- 16 POLICY, OR REQUIREMENT THAT PROVIDES FOR LONGER HOLDING PERIODS
- 17 THAN THE HOLDING PERIODS PROVIDED FOR IN THIS SECTION.
- 18 (7) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 19 (A) AN ANIMAL THAT WOULD BE SUBJECTED TO UNDUE SUFFERING IF
- 20 THE REQUIRED HOLDING PERIOD WAS OBSERVED.
- 21 (B) AN ANIMAL WHOSE OWNER REQUESTS IMMEDIATE DISPOSITION OF
- 22 THE ANIMAL.
- 23 (C) AN ANIMAL THAT WAS RELINQUISHED TO THE ANIMAL CONTROL
- 24 SHELTER OR ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER BY ITS OWNER.
- 25 Sec. 9a. (1) AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER, AN ANIMAL PROTECTION
- 26 SHELTER, OR A PET SHOP SHALL MAINTAIN CURRENT VERIFIABLE RECORDS
- 27 FOR A PERIOD OF AT LEAST 2 YEARS. THE RECORDS SHALL INCLUDE ALL OF

- 1 THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- 2 (A) HOW THE ANIMAL WAS ACQUIRED, THE LOCATION WHERE THE ANIMAL
- 3 WAS FOUND OR OBTAINED, AND THE DATE AND TIME OF ACQUISITION.
- 4 (B) IF THE ANIMAL WAS ACQUIRED FROM A PERSON, THE VERIFIED
- 5 NAME AND ADDRESS OF THE PERSON FROM WHOM THE ANIMAL WAS ACQUIRED
- 6 AND THE PERSON'S RELATIONSHIP TO THE ANIMAL.
- 7 (C) IF THE ANIMAL WAS ACQUIRED BY ANIMAL CONTROL OR LAW
- 8 ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL, THE NAME OF THE OFFICER, THE VERIFIED NAME
- 9 AND ADDRESS OF THE PERSON FROM WHOM THE ANIMAL WAS OBTAINED OR THE
- 10 LOCATION WHERE THE ANIMAL WAS OBTAINED, AND, IF APPLICABLE, THE
- 11 PERSON'S RELATIONSHIP TO THE ANIMAL.
- 12 (D) THE METHOD OR METHODS USED TO IDENTIFY THE OWNER OF THE
- 13 ANIMAL.
- 14 (E) A DESCRIPTION AND IDENTIFICATION OF THE ANIMAL, INCLUDING
- 15 THE ANIMAL'S IDENTIFICATION INFORMATION, SPECIES, COLOR, BREED,
- 16 SEX, ALTERATION STATUS, AND APPROXIMATE WEIGHT AND AGE.
- 17 (F) THE DATE, TIME, NATURE, AND METHOD OF DISPOSITION OF THE
- 18 ANIMAL.
- 19 (G) IF THE ANIMAL IS ADOPTED, TRANSFERRED, OR SOLD, THE
- 20 VERIFIED NAME AND ADDRESS OF THE PERSON TO WHOM THE ANIMAL IS
- 21 ADOPTED, TRANSFERRED, OR SOLD.
- 22 (2) An animal control shelter or AN animal protection shelter
- 23 shall maintain written records on the ANNUALLY REPORT THE FOLLOWING
- 24 STATISTICS TO THE DEPARTMENT ON A FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE DIRECTOR
- 25 NO LATER THAN MARCH 31 OF THE YEAR FOLLOWING THE YEAR FOR WHICH THE
- 26 STATISTICS WERE COMPILED:
- 27 (A) THE total number of dogs AND cats and ferrets under 6

- 1 months of age. , the
- 2 (B) THE total number of dogs AND cats and ferrets 6 months
- 3 of age and older. , and all
- 4 (C) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF ALL other animals OTHER THAN WILDLIFE
- 5 THAT ARE received, returned to owners, adopted to new owners, sold,
- 6 or transferred with or without remuneration to any person. , the
- 7 (D) THE TOTAL number of adopted dogs AND cats and ferrets
- 8 that were altered ,—AND the TOTAL number of adopted dogs ,—AND cats
- 9 , and ferrets that were not altered. , and the
- 10 (E) THE TOTAL number of dogs AND cats and ferrets
- 11 euthanized annually. , and shall annually provide a copy of these
- 12 statistics to the department, by March 31 of the year following the
- 13 year for which the statistics were compiled.
- 14 SEC. 9C. A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT SHALL NOT ADOPT AN
- 15 ORDINANCE, RULE, OR POLICY THAT PROHIBITS A STERILIZATION RELEASE
- 16 PROGRAM, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE STERILIZATION RELEASE PROGRAM
- 17 INCLUDES THE LIVE TRAPPING OF CATS.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 19 after the date it is enacted into law.
