October 13, 2015, Introduced by Reps. Glardon, Kelly, Hughes, Vaupel, Johnson, Canfield, Victory, Sheppard, Brett Roberts and Pagel and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 399, entitled "Safe drinking water act,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 325.1002), as amended by 1998 PA 56.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Bottled drinking water" means water that is ultimately
- 3 sold, provided, or offered for human consumption in a closed
- 4 container.
- 5 (b) "Capacity assessment" means an evaluation of the
- 6 technical, financial, and managerial capability of a community
- 7 supply or nontransient noncommunity water supply to comply and
 - maintain compliance with all requirements of this act and the rules
 - promulgated under this act.

- 1 (c) "Community supply" means a public water supply that
- 2 provides year-round service to not fewer than 15 living units or
- 3 which THAT regularly provides year-round service to not fewer than
- 4 25 residents.
- 5 (d) "Contaminant" means a physical, chemical, biological, or
- 6 radiological substance or matter in water.
- 7 (e) "Customer service connection" means the pipe between a
- 8 water main and customer site piping or building plumbing system.
- 9 (f) "Customer site piping" means an underground piping system
- 10 owned or controlled by the customer that conveys water from the
- 11 customer service connection to building plumbing systems and other
- 12 points of use on lands owned or controlled by the customer.
- 13 Customer site piping does not include any system that incorporates
- 14 treatment to protect public health.
- 15 (g) "Department" means the department of environmental quality
- 16 or its authorized agent or representative.
- 17 (h) "Director" means the director of the department of
- 18 environmental quality or his or her authorized agent or
- 19 representative.
- (i) "Imminent hazard" means that in the judgment of the
- 21 director there is a violation, or a condition that may cause a
- violation, of the state drinking water standards at a public water
- 23 supply requiring immediate action to prevent endangering the health
- 24 of people.
- 25 (j) "Living unit" means a house, apartment, or other domicile
- 26 occupied or intended to be occupied on a day to day basis by an
- 27 individual, family group, or equivalent.

- 1 (k) "Noncommunity supply" means a public water supply that is
- 2 not a community supply, but that has not less than 15 service
- 3 connections or that serves not fewer than 25 individuals on an
- 4 average daily basis for not less than 60 days per year.
- 5 (1) "Nontransient noncommunity water supply" means a
- 6 noncommunity public water supply that serves not fewer than 25 of
- 7 the same individuals on an average daily basis over 6 months per
- 8 year. This definition includes water supplies in places of
- 9 employment, schools, and day-care centers.
- 10 (m) "Person" means an individual, partnership, copartnership,
- 11 cooperative, firm, company, public or private association or
- 12 corporation, political subdivision, agency of the state, agency of
- 13 the federal government, trust, estate, joint structure company, or
- 14 any other legal entity, or their legal representative, agent, or
- 15 assigns.
- 16 (n) "Plans and specifications" means drawings, data, and a
- 17 true description or representation of an entire waterworks system
- 18 or parts of the system as it exists or is to be constructed, and a
- 19 statement on how a waterworks system is to be operated.
- 20 (o) "Political subdivision" means a city, village, township,
- 21 charter township, county, district, authority or portion or
- 22 combination thereof.
- (p) "Public water supply" means a waterworks system that
- 24 provides water for drinking or household purposes to persons other
- 25 than the supplier of the water, and does not include either ANY of
- 26 the following:
- (i) A waterworks system that supplies water to only 1 living

- 1 unit.
- 2 (ii) A waterworks system that consists solely of customer site
- 3 piping.
- 4 (iii) A WATERWORKS SYSTEM THAT PROVIDES WATER FOR AGRICULTURAL
- 5 PURPOSES ONLY AND IS NOT INTENDED FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION, IF THE
- 6 WATERWORKS SYSTEM IS ANNUALLY TESTED OR, IF APPLICABLE, TESTED IN
- 7 ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 71 OF THE MANUFACTURING MILK LAW OF 2001,
- 8 2001 PA 267, MCL 288.631. THE QUALITY OF WATER TESTED SHALL MEET
- 9 THE CHEMICAL, PHYSICAL, AND BIOLOGICAL STANDARDS REQUIRED UNDER
- 10 SECTION 70 OF THE MANUFACTURING MILK LAW OF 2001, 2001 PA 267, MCL
- 11 288.630.
- 12 (q) "State drinking water standards" means quality standards
- 13 setting limits for contaminant levels or establishing treatment
- 14 techniques to meet standards necessary to protect the public
- 15 health.
- 16 (r) "Service connection" means a direct connection from a
- 17 distribution water main to a living unit or other site to provide
- 18 water for drinking or household purposes.
- 19 (s) "Source water assessment" means a state program to
- 20 delineate the boundaries of areas in the state from which 1 or more
- 21 public water supplies receive supplies of drinking water, to
- 22 identify contaminants regulated under this act for which monitoring
- 23 is required because the state has determined they may present a
- 24 threat to public health, and, to the extent practical, to determine
- 25 the susceptibility of the public water supply in the delineated
- 26 area to these contaminants.
- 27 (t) "Supplier of water" or "supplier" means a person who owns

- 1 or operates a public water supply, and includes a water hauler.
- 2 (u) "Transient noncommunity water supply" means a noncommunity
- 3 supply that does not meet the definition of nontransient
- 4 noncommunity water supply.
- 5 (v) "Water hauler" means a person engaged in bulk vehicular
- 6 transportation of water to other than the water hauler's own
- 7 household which is intended for use or used for drinking or
- 8 household purposes. Excluded from this definition are those persons
- 9 providing water solely for employee use.
- 10 (w) "Water main" means a pipe owned or controlled by a
- 11 supplier that may convey water to a customer service connection or
- 12 to a fire hydrant.
- 13 (x) "Waterworks system" or "system" means a system of pipes
- 14 and structures through which water is obtained and distributed,
- 15 including but not limited to wells and well structures, intakes and
- 16 cribs, pumping stations, treatment plants, storage tanks, pipelines
- 17 and appurtenances, or a combination thereof, actually used or
- 18 intended for use for the purpose of furnishing water for drinking
- 19 or household purposes.
- 20 (y) "Year-round service" means the ability of a supplier of
- 21 water to provide drinking water on a continuous basis to a living
- 22 unit or facility.
- Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 24 after the date it is enacted into law.
