HOUSE BILL No. 5065

November 5, 2015, Introduced by Reps. Sheppard and Vaupel and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding sections 17019, 17519, 20187, and 21418.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 17019. (1) AT THE TIME A PHYSICIAN INFORMS A PATIENT OF
- 2 THE RESULTS OF A PRENATAL TEST THAT HAS DETECTED A LIFE-LIMITING
- 3 CONDITION, THE PHYSICIAN OR A QUALIFIED PERSON ASSISTING THE
- 4 PHYSICIAN SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
 - (A) MAKE AVAILABLE TO THE PATIENT REFERRAL INFORMATION FOR PERINATAL HOSPICE CARE OFFERED BY A PERINATAL HOSPICE PROGRAM CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER SECTION 21418.
- 8 (B) INFORM THE PATIENT THAT THE STATE, UNDER SECTION 2834,
 - RECOGNIZES THE DEATH OF A FETUS THAT HAS COMPLETED AT LEAST 20

- 1 WEEKS OF GESTATION OR WEIGHS AT LEAST 400 GRAMS WITH A CERTIFICATE

- 14 REFERRAL INFORMATION FOR "EARLY ON MICHIGAN".
- 15 (C) REFERRAL INFORMATION FOR PEER SUPPORT GROUPS INCLUDING,
- 16 BUT NOT LIMITED TO, SUPPORT GROUPS FOR PARENTS OF CHILDREN WITH THE
- 17 PRENATALLY DIAGNOSED CONDITION AND ADVOCACY ORGANIZATIONS FOR
- 18 INDIVIDUALS WITH THE PRENATALLY DIAGNOSED CONDITION.
- 19 (D) REFERRAL INFORMATION FOR ADOPTION INCLUDING ADOPTION
- 20 AGENCIES THAT PLACE CHILDREN WITH PRENATALLY DIAGNOSED CONDITIONS
- 21 AND ORGANIZATIONS THAT MAINTAIN REGISTRIES OF FAMILIES WHO WISH TO
- 22 ADOPT CHILDREN WITH PRENATALLY DIAGNOSED CONDITIONS.
- 23 (3) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 24 (A) "LIFE-LIMITING CONDITION" MEANS A MEDICAL CONDITION
- 25 IDENTIFIED BY PRENATAL DIAGNOSTIC TESTING THAT WILL, WITH
- 26 REASONABLE CERTAINTY, RESULT IN THE DEATH OF THE CHILD EITHER
- 27 BEFORE BIRTH OR WITHIN 1 YEAR AFTER BIRTH.

- 1 (B) "PERINATAL HOSPICE CARE" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN

- 3 (C) "PRENATALLY DIAGNOSED CONDITION" MEANS A MEDICAL CONDITION

- 11 SEC. 17519. A PHYSICIAN SHALL COMPLY WITH SECTION 17019.
- 12 SEC. 20187. A HEALTH FACILITY OR AGENCY THAT PROVIDES
- 13 OBSTETRIC CARE AND THAT PROVIDES SOCIAL WORK OR CHAPLAINCY SERVICES
- 14 IN CONJUNCTION WITH ITS HEALTH SERVICES SHALL PROVIDE ITS SOCIAL
- 15 WORKERS AND CHAPLAINS, AS APPROPRIATE, WITH INFORMATION ABOUT
- 16 PERINATAL HOSPICE PROGRAMS CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER
- 17 SECTION 21418.
- 18 SEC. 21418. (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 19 (A) ESTABLISH CRITERIA FOR CERTIFYING AS A PERINATAL HOSPICE
- 20 PROGRAM A HOSPICE THAT PROVIDES PERINATAL HOSPICE CARE. IN
- 21 ESTABLISHING CRITERIA FOR THE CERTIFICATION OF A PERINATAL HOSPICE
- 22 PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT MAY REFERENCE EXISTING CRITERIA ESTABLISHED
- 23 BY RECOGNIZED MEDICAL AUTHORITIES OR ASSOCIATIONS THAT SPECIALIZE
- 24 IN HOSPICE CARE.
- 25 (B) ACCEPT AND REVIEW APPLICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATION FROM A
- 26 HOSPICE SEEKING CERTIFICATION AS A PERINATAL HOSPICE PROGRAM. IF

- 1 PERINATAL HOSPICE PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE A WRITTEN

- 4 (C) POST ON THIS STATE'S WEBSITE, IN A PRINTABLE FORMAT, A
- 5 LIST OF HOSPICES IN THIS STATE THAT HAVE BEEN CERTIFIED BY THE
- 6 DEPARTMENT FOR PROVIDING PERINATAL HOSPICE CARE.
- 7 (2) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 8 (A) "LIFE-LIMITING CONDITION" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN
- 9 SECTION 17019.
- 10 (B) "PERINATAL HOSPICE CARE" MEANS COMPREHENSIVE MEDICAL AND
- 11 SUPPORTIVE CARE TO A PREGNANT WOMAN AND HER FAMILY THAT INCLUDES
- 12 SUPPORT FROM THE TIME OF DIAGNOSIS OF A LIFE-LIMITING CONDITION
- 13 THROUGH THE TIME OF BIRTH AND DEATH OF THE CHILD. PERINATAL HOSPICE
- 14 CARE INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, CARE BY MATERNAL-FETAL
- 15 MEDICAL SPECIALISTS, OBSTETRICIANS, NEONATOLOGISTS, ANESTHESIA
- 16 SPECIALISTS, CLERGY, SOCIAL WORKERS, AND SPECIALTY NURSES.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 18 after the date it is enacted into law.
