A bill to amend 2004 PA 378, entitled "Public body law enforcement agency act," by amending sections 6 and 7 (MCL 28.586 and 28.587).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 6. (1) A law enforcement agency created under this actshall comply with all of the following:
- 3 (a) The agency shall be funded by the appropriation of public4 funds only.
 - (b) The agency shall maintain liability insurance.
 - (c) The agency shall establish and abide by written policies pertaining to all of the following:
 - (i) The authority of its law enforcement officers, including the extent of those officers' authority to enforce the criminal laws of this state and other state laws, local ordinances, and
