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## **HOUSE BILL No. 5580**

April 20, 2016, Introduced by Rep. Kosowski and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled

"Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 674 (MCL 257.674), as amended by 2000 PA 268.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 674. (1) A vehicle shall not be parked, except if
  necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance
  with the law or the directions of a police officer or trafficcontrol device, in any of the following places:
- 5 (a) On a sidewalk.
  - (b) In front of a public or private driveway.
    - (c) Within an intersection.
    - (d) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
    - (e) On a crosswalk.
  - (f) Within 20 feet of a crosswalk, or if there is not a crosswalk, then within 15 feet of the intersection of property

- 1 lines at an intersection of highways.
- 2 (g) Within 30 feet of the approach to a flashing beacon, stop
- 3 sign, or traffic-control signal located at the side of a highway.
- 4 (h) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30
- 5 feet of a point on the curb immediately opposite the end of a
- 6 safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by an official
- 7 sign or marking.
- 8 (i) Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing.
- 9 (j) Within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to a fire station
- 10 and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to a fire station
- 11 within 75 feet of the entrance if properly marked by an official
- 12 sign.
- 13 (k) Alongside or opposite a street excavation or obstruction,
- 14 if the stopping, standing, or parking would obstruct traffic.
- (l) On the roadway side of a vehicle stopped or parked at the
- 16 edge or curb of a street.
- 17 (m) Upon a bridge or other elevated highway structure or
- 18 within a highway tunnel.
- 19 (n) At a place where an official sign prohibits stopping or
- 20 parking.
- 21 (o) Within 500 feet of an accident at which a police officer
- 22 is in attendance, if the scene of the accident is outside of a city
- 23 or village.
- 24 (p) In front of a theater.
- 25 (q) In a place or in a manner that blocks immediate egress
- 26 from an emergency exit conspicuously marked as an emergency exit of
- **27** a building.

- 1 (r) In a place or in a manner that blocks or hampers the
- 2 immediate use of an immediate egress from a fire escape
- 3 conspicuously marked as a fire escape providing an emergency means
- 4 of egress from a building.
- 5 (s) In a parking space clearly identified by an official sign
- 6 as being reserved for use by disabled persons that is on public
- 7 property or private property available for public use, unless the
- 8 individual is a disabled person as described in section 19a or
- 9 unless the individual is parking the vehicle for the benefit of a
- 10 disabled person. In order for the vehicle to be parked in the
- 11 parking space the vehicle shall display 1 of the following:
- 12 (i) A certificate of identification or windshield placard
- 13 issued under section 675 to a disabled person.
- 14 (ii) A special registration plate issued under section 803d to
- 15 a disabled person.
- 16 (iii) A similar certificate of identification or windshield
- 17 placard issued by another state to a disabled person.
- (iv) A similar special registration plate issued by another
- 19 state to a disabled person.
- 20 (v) A special registration plate to which a tab for persons
- 21 with disabilities is attached issued under this act.
- 22 (t) In a clearly identified access aisle or access lane
- 23 immediately adjacent to a space designated for parking by persons
- 24 with disabilities.
- 25 (u) On a street or other area open to the parking of vehicles
- 26 that results in the vehicle interfering with the use of a curb-cut
- 27 or ramp by persons with disabilities.

- 1 (V) IN A PARKING SPACE CLEARLY IDENTIFIED BY AN OFFICIAL SIGN
- 2 AS A CHARGING STATION FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLES, UNLESS ALL OF THE
- 3 FOLLOWING ARE SATISFIED:
- 4 (i) THE VEHICLE IS AN ELECTRIC VEHICLE.
- 5 (ii) THE VEHICLE IS CONNECTED TO THE CHARGING STATION WHILE
- 6 PARKED IN THE PARKING SPACE.
- 7 (W)  $\frac{(v)}{(v)}$  Within 500 feet of a fire at which fire apparatus is
- 8 in attendance, if the scene of the fire is outside a city or
- 9 village. However, volunteer fire fighters responding to the fire
- 10 may park within 500 feet of the fire in a manner not to interfere
- 11 with fire apparatus at the scene. A vehicle parked legally previous
- 12 to the fire is exempt from this subdivision.
- 13 (X) (w) In violation of an official sign restricting the
- 14 period of time for or manner of parking.
- 15 (Y)  $\frac{(x)}{(x)}$  In a space controlled or regulated by a meter on a
- 16 public highway or in a publicly owned parking area or structure, if
- 17 the allowable time for parking indicated on the meter has expired,
- 18 unless the vehicle properly displays 1 or more of the items listed
- **19** in section 675(8).
- 20 (Z) (y)—On a street or highway in such a way as to obstruct
- 21 the delivery of mail to a rural mailbox by a carrier of the United
- 22 States postal service.
- (AA)  $\frac{(z)}{(z)}$  In a place or in a manner that blocks the use of an
- 24 alley.
- 25 (BB) (aa)—In a place or in a manner that blocks access to a
- 26 space clearly designated as a fire lane.
- 27 (2) A person shall not move a vehicle not owned by the person

- 1 into a prohibited area or away from a curb a distance that makes
- 2 the parking unlawful.
- 3 (3) A bus, for the purpose of taking on or discharging
- 4 passengers, may be stopped at a place described in subsection
- 5 (1)(b), (d), or (f) or on the roadway side of a vehicle illegally
- 6 parked in a legally designated bus loading zone. A bus, for the
- 7 purpose of taking on or discharging a passenger, may be stopped at
- 8 a place described in subsection (1)(n) if the place is posted by an
- 9 appropriate bus stop sign, except that a bus shall not stop at such
- 10 a place if the stopping is specifically prohibited by the
- 11 responsible local authority, the state transportation department,
- 12 or the director of the department of state police.
- 13 (4) A person who violates this section is responsible for a
- 14 civil infraction.
- 15 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 16 after the date it is enacted into law.
