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HOUSE BILL No. 5637

May 10, 2016, Introduced by Rep. Lucido and referred to the Committee on Elections.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 28.292), as amended by 2016 PA 5.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 2. (1) An official state personal identification card shall contain the following:
 - (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the individual to whom the card is issued.
 - (b) The full legal name, date of birth, sex, residence address
 - OR, UPON THE REQUEST OF THE INDIVIDUAL TO WHOM THE CARD IS ISSUED,
 - MAILING ADDRESS, height, weight, eye color, digital photographic

- 1 image, signature of or verification and certification by the
- 2 applicant, INDIVIDUAL, as determined by the secretary of state, and
- 3 expiration date of the official state personal identification card.
- 4 (c) An indication that the identification card contains 1 or
- 5 more of the following:
- 6 (i) The blood type of the individual.
- 7 (ii) Immunization data of the individual.
- 8 (iii) Medication data of the individual.
- 9 (iv) A statement that the individual is deaf.
- 10 (d) In the case of a holder of an official state personal
- 11 identification card who has indicated his or her wish to
- 12 participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of
- 13 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, a
- 14 heart insignia on the front of the official state personal
- 15 identification card.
- 16 (e) If requested by an individual who is a veteran of the
- 17 armed forces of this state, another state, or the United States,
- 18 other than an individual who was dishonorably discharged from the
- 19 armed forces of this state, another state, or the United States, a
- 20 designation that the individual is a veteran. The designation shall
- 21 be in a style and format considered appropriate by the secretary of
- 22 state. The secretary of state shall require proof of discharge or
- 23 separation of service from the armed forces of this state, another
- 24 state, or the United States, and the nature of that discharge, for
- 25 the purposes of verifying an individual's status as a veteran under
- 26 this subdivision. The secretary of state shall consult with the
- 27 department of military and veterans affairs in determining the

- 1 proof that shall be required to identify an individual's status as
- 2 a veteran for the purposes of this subsection. The secretary of
- 3 state may provide the department of military and veterans affairs
- 4 and agencies of the counties of this state that provide veteran
- 5 services with information provided by an applicant under this
- 6 subsection for the purpose of veterans' benefits eligibility
- 7 referral.
- 8 (f) Physical security features designed to prevent tampering,
- 9 counterfeiting, or duplication of the official state personal
- 10 identification card for fraudulent purposes.
- 11 (2) In conjunction with the application for an official state
- 12 personal identification card, the secretary of state shall do all
- 13 of the following:
- 14 (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:
- 15 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an
- 16 anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public
- 17 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in
- 18 accordance with this section.
- 19 (ii) Information describing the donor registry program
- 20 maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ procurement
- 21 organization or its successor organization under section 10120 of
- 22 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120. The information
- 23 required under this subparagraph includes the address and telephone
- 24 number of Michigan's federally designated organ procurement
- 25 organization or its successor organization as defined in section
- 26 10120 10102 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120.
- 27 333.10102.

- 1 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to have
- 2 his or her name placed on the registry described in subparagraph
- $3 \quad (ii)$.
- 4 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on
- 5 his or her official state personal identification card that he or
- 6 she is willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death
- 7 pursuant to UNDER part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368,
- **8** MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in accordance with this section.
- 9 (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she indicates to the
- 10 secretary of state under this section a willingness to have his or
- 11 her name placed on the donor registry described in subdivision
- 12 (a) (ii), the secretary of state will mark the applicant's record
- 13 for the donor registry.
- 14 (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
- 15 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:
- 16 (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
- 17 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal
- 18 identification card.
- 19 (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally
- 20 appears at a secretary of state branch office.
- 21 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for
- 22 applications processed by electronic means.
- 23 (4) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the
- 24 official state personal identification card. The secretary of state
- 25 shall designate a space on the identification card where the
- 26 applicant may place a sticker or decal of a uniform size as the
- 27 secretary may specify to indicate that the cardholder carries a

- 1 separate emergency medical information card. The sticker or decal
- 2 may be provided by any person, hospital, school, medical group, or
- 3 association interested in assisting in implementing the emergency
- 4 medical information card, but shall meet the specifications of the
- 5 secretary of state. The sticker or decal also may be used to
- 6 indicate that the cardholder has designated 1 or more patient
- 7 advocates in accordance with section 5506 of the estates and
- 8 protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506. The
- 9 emergency medical information card, carried separately by the
- 10 cardholder, may contain the information described in subsection
- 11 (2)(c), information concerning the cardholder's patient advocate
- 12 designation, other emergency medical information, or an indication
- 13 as to where the cardholder has stored or registered emergency
- 14 medical information. An original identification card or the renewal
- 15 of an existing identification card issued to an individual less
- 16 than 21 years of age shall be portrait or vertical in form and an
- 17 identification card issued to an individual 21 years of age or over
- 18 shall be landscape or horizontal in form. Except as otherwise
- 19 required in this act, other information required on the
- 20 identification card under this act may appear on the identification
- 21 card in a form prescribed by the secretary of state.
- 22 (5) The identification card shall not contain a fingerprint or
- 23 finger image of the applicant.
- 24 (6) Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 25 state shall retain and use an individual's digital photographic
- 26 image and signature described in subsection (1)(b) only for
- 27 programs administered by the secretary of state as specifically

- 1 authorized by law. An individual's digital photographic image or
- 2 signature shall only be used as follows:
- 3 (a) By a federal, state, or local governmental agency for a
- 4 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.
- **5** (b) By the secretary of state for a use specifically
- 6 authorized by law.
- 7 (c) The secretary of state shall forward to the department of
- 8 state police the images of individuals required to be registered
- 9 under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.721
- 10 to 28.736, upon the department of state police providing the
- 11 secretary of state an updated list of those individuals.
- 12 (d) As necessary to comply with a law of this state or the
- 13 United States.
- 14 (7) If an individual presents evidence of statutory blindness
- 15 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued
- 16 or is the holder of an official state personal identification card,
- 17 the secretary of state shall mark the individual's identification
- 18 card in a manner that clearly indicates that the cardholder is
- 19 legally blind.
- 20 (8) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an
- 21 individual who indicates a willingness to have his or her name
- 22 placed on the donor registry described in subsection (2)(a)(ii).
- 23 Information about an individual's indication of a willingness to
- 24 have his or her name placed on the donor registry that is obtained
- 25 by the secretary of state and forwarded under this section is
- 26 exempt from disclosure under section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of
- 27 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.243. As required in section

- 1 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the
- 2 THE secretary of state shall establish and maintain the donor
- 3 registry in a manner that complies with that section 10120 OF THE
- 4 PUBLIC HEALTH CODE, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, and that provides
- 5 electronic access, including, but not limited to, the transfer of
- 6 data to this state's federally designated organ procurement
- 7 organization or its successor organization, tissue banks, and eye
- 8 banks.
- 9 (9) An official state personal identification card may contain
- 10 an identifier for voter registration purposes.
- 11 (10) An official state personal identification card shall
- 12 contain information appearing in electronic or machine readable
- 13 codes needed to conduct a transaction with the secretary of state.
- 14 The information shall be limited to the information described in
- 15 subsection (1)(a) and (b) except for the person's digital
- 16 photographic image and signature or verification and certification,
- 17 state of issuance, and other information necessary for use with
- 18 electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic teller machines
- 19 and shall not contain the individual's driving record or other
- 20 personal identifier. The identification card shall identify the
- 21 encoded information.
- 22 (11) An official state personal identification card shall be
- 23 issued only upon authorization of the secretary of state, and shall
- 24 be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible the
- 25 ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate the
- 26 identification card without ready detection.
- 27 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant

- 1 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each
- 2 original or renewal official state personal identification card
- 3 issued. The department of treasury shall deposit the fees received
- 4 and collected under this section in the state treasury to the
- 5 credit of the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the
- 6 fees credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary
- 7 of state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from
- 8 the Michigan transportation fund created under section 10 of 1951
- 9 PA 51, MCL 247.660, shall not be used to compensate the secretary
- 10 of state for costs incurred and services performed under this
- 11 section.
- 12 (13) An original or renewal official state personal
- 13 identification card expires on the birthday of the individual to
- 14 whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date of issuance
- 15 or on the date the individual is no longer considered to be legally
- 16 present in the United States under section 1, whichever is earlier.
- 17 The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal
- 18 identification card under this act for a period greater than 4
- 19 years. Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 20 state may issue a renewal official state personal identification
- 21 card for 1 additional 4-year period by mail or by other methods
- 22 prescribed by the secretary of state. The secretary of state shall
- 23 require renewal in person by an individual required under section
- 24 5a of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a,
- 25 to maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's license or official
- 26 state personal identification card.
- 27 (14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee under this

- 1 section if the applicant is any of the following:
- 2 (a) An individual 65 years of age or older.
- 3 (b) An individual who has had his or her operator's or
- 4 chauffeur's license suspended, revoked, or denied under the
- 5 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, because
- 6 of a mental or physical infirmity or disability.
- 7 (c) An individual who presents evidence of statutory blindness
- 8 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368.
- 9 (d) An individual who presents other good cause for a fee
- 10 waiver.
- 11 (e) An individual who wishes to add or remove a heart insignia
- 12 described in subsection (1)(d).
- 13 (15) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 14 personal identification card shall apply for a renewal official
- 15 state personal identification card if the individual changes his or
- 16 her name.
- 17 (16) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 18 personal identification card shall apply for a corrected
- 19 identification card if he or she changes his or her residence
- 20 address OR MAILING ADDRESS IF THE INDIVIDUAL REQUESTED TO USE A
- 21 MAILING ADDRESS AS THE ADDRESS REQUIRED TO APPEAR ON HIS OR HER
- 22 IDENTIFICATION CARD UNDER SUBSECTION (1) (B). The secretary of state
- 23 may correct the address on an identification card by a method
- 24 prescribed by the secretary of state. A fee shall not be charged
- 25 for a change of residence OR MAILING address, AS APPLICABLE.
- 26 (17) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (15) and
- 27 (16), an individual who has been issued an official state personal

- 1 identification card may apply for a renewal official state personal
- 2 identification card for 1 or more of the following reasons:
- 3 (a) The individual wants to change any information on the
- 4 identification card.
- 5 (b) An identification card issued under this act is lost,
- 6 destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes illegible.
- 7 (18) An individual may indicate on an official state personal
- 8 identification card in a place designated by the secretary of state
- 9 his or her blood type, emergency contact information, immunization
- 10 data, medication data, or a statement that the individual is deaf.
- 11 (19) No later than January 1, 2017, the secretary of state
- 12 shall develop and shall, in conjunction with the department of
- 13 state police, implement a process using the L.E.I.N. or any other
- 14 appropriate system that limits access to law enforcement that would
- 15 allow law enforcement agencies of this state to access emergency
- 16 contact information that the holder of an official state personal
- 17 identification card has voluntarily provided to the secretary of
- 18 state. As used in this subsection, "emergency contact information"
- 19 means the name, telephone number, or address of an individual that
- 20 is used for the sole purpose of contacting that individual when the
- 21 holder of an official state personal identification card has been
- 22 involved in an emergency.
- 23 (20) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state
- 24 that he or she is a minor who has been emancipated under 1968 PA
- 25 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal identification
- 26 card shall bear the designation of the individual's emancipated
- 27 status in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state.

- 1 (21) The secretary of state shall inquire of each individual
- 2 who applies for or who holds an official state personal
- 3 identification card, in person or by mail, whether he or she agrees
- 4 to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101
- 5 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123.
- 6 An individual who has agreed to participate in the donor registry
- 7 shall not be considered to have revoked that agreement solely
- 8 because the individual's official state personal identification
- 9 card has expired. Enrollment in the donor registry constitutes a
- 10 legal agreement that remains binding and in effect after the
- 11 donor's death regardless of the expressed desires of the deceased
- 12 donor's next of kin who may oppose the donor's anatomical gift.
- 13 (22) A valid official state personal identification card
- 14 presented by the individual to whom the card is issued shall be
- 15 considered the same as a valid state of Michigan driver license
- 16 when identification is requested except as otherwise specifically
- 17 provided by law.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 19 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 20 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 21 unless all of the following bills of the 98th Legislature are
- 22 enacted into law:
