## **HOUSE BILL No. 5640**

May 11, 2016, Introduced by Reps. Somerville, Johnson, Garcia and Sheppard and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 3112 (MCL 324.3112), as amended by 2005 PA 33.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 3112. (1) A person shall not discharge any waste or waste effluent into the waters of this state unless the person is in possession of a valid permit from the department.
  - (2) An application for a permit under subsection (1) shall be submitted to the department. Within 30 days after an application for a new or increased use is received, the department shall determine whether the application is administratively complete. Within 90 days after an application for reissuance of a permit is received, the department shall determine whether the application is administratively complete. If the department determines that an

- 1 application is not complete, the department shall notify the
- 2 applicant in writing within the applicable time period. If the
- 3 department does not make a determination as to whether the
- 4 application is complete within the applicable time period, the
- 5 application shall be considered to be complete.
- 6 (3) The department shall condition the continued validity of a
- 7 permit upon the permittee's meeting the effluent requirements that
- 8 the department considers necessary to prevent unlawful pollution by
- 9 the dates that the department considers to be reasonable and
- 10 necessary and to assure ENSURE compliance with applicable federal
- 11 law. and regulations. If the department finds that the terms of a
- 12 permit have been, are being, or may be violated, it may modify,
- 13 suspend, or revoke the permit or grant the permittee a reasonable
- 14 period of time in which to comply with the permit. The department
- 15 may reissue a revoked permit upon a showing satisfactory to the
- 16 department that the permittee has corrected the violation. A person
- 17 who has had a permit revoked may apply for a new permit.
- 18 (4) If the department determines that a person is causing or
- 19 is about to cause unlawful pollution of the waters of this state,
- 20 the department may notify the alleged offender of its determination
- 21 and enter an order requiring the person to abate the pollution or
- 22 MAY refer the matter to the attorney general for legal action, or
- 23 both.
- 24 (5) A person who is aggrieved by an order of abatement of the
- 25 department or by the reissuance, modification, suspension, or
- 26 revocation of an existing permit of the department executed
- 27 pursuant to this section may file a sworn petition with the

- 1 department setting forth the grounds and reasons for the complaint
- 2 and asking for a contested case hearing on the matter pursuant to
- 3 the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201
- 4 to 24.328. A petition filed more than 60 days after action on the
- 5 order or permit may be rejected by the department as being
- 6 untimely.
- 7 (6) Beginning January 1, 2007, all ALL oceangoing vessels
- 8 engaging in port operations in this state shall obtain a permit
- 9 from the department. The department shall issue a permit for an
- 10 oceangoing vessel only if the applicant can demonstrate that the
- 11 oceangoing vessel will not discharge aquatic nuisance species or if
- 12 the oceangoing vessel discharges ballast water or other waste or
- 13 waste effluent, that the operator of the vessel will utilize
- 14 environmentally sound technology and methods, as determined by the
- 15 department, that can be used to prevent the discharge of aquatic
- 16 nuisance species. The department shall cooperate to the fullest
- 17 extent practical with other Great Lakes basin states, the Canadian
- 18 Great Lakes provinces, the Great Lakes panel on aquatic nuisance
- 19 species, the Great Lakes fishery commission, the international
- 20 joint commission, and the Great Lakes commission to ensure
- 21 development of standards for the control of aquatic nuisance
- 22 species that are broadly protective of the waters of the state and
- 23 other natural resources. COMPLIES WITH 33 CFR PART 151, SUBPART C.
- 24 Permit fees for permits under this subsection shall be assessed as
- 25 provided in section 3120. The permit fees for an individual permit
- 26 issued under this subsection shall be the fees specified in section
- 27 3120(1)(a) and (5)(a). The permit fees for a general permit issued

- 1 under this subsection shall be the fees specified in section
- $\mathbf{2}$  3120(1)(c) and (5)(b)(i). Permits under this subsection shall be
- 3 issued in accordance with the timelines provided in section 3120.
- 4 The department may promulgate rules to implement this subsection.
