A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding section 7333b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 7333B. (1) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION
- 2 (3), WHEN ISSUING A PRESCRIPTION FOR AN OPIATE TO AN ADULT PATIENT
- 3 FOR THE FIRST TIME FOR OUTPATIENT USE, A PRESCRIBER SHALL NOT
- 4 PRESCRIBE THE PATIENT MORE THAN A 7-DAY SUPPLY OF THE OPIATE.
- 5 (2) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (3), A
- 6 PRESCRIBER SHALL NOT AT ANY TIME PRESCRIBE A MINOR PATIENT MORE
- 7 THAN A 7-DAY SUPPLY OF AN OPIATE. A PRESCRIBER WHO PRESCRIBES AN
- 8 OPIATE TO A MINOR SHALL DISCUSS WITH THE PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN
- 9 OF THE MINOR THE RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH OPIATE USE AND THE REASON

- 1 PRESCRIBER, MORE THAN A 7-DAY SUPPLY OF AN OPIATE IS REQUIRED TO
