## **HOUSE BILL No. 6110**

December 7, 2016, Introduced by Rep. Howrylak and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to establish the commission on behavioral health for deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing within the department of health and human services; to prescribe the powers and duties of the commission, certain state departments, the division, and certain state officers; and to provide for an appropriation.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "commission on behavioral health for deaf, deafblind, and hard of
- 3 hearing act".
- 4 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 5 (a) "Behavioral health", "deaf", "deafblind", "hard of
- 6 hearing", and "qualified sign language interpreter" mean those
- 7 terms as defined in section 2 of the division on behavioral health
- 8 for deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing act.

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- 1 (b) "Commission" means the commission on behavioral health for
- 2 deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing established in section 5.
- 3 (c) "Department" means the department of health and human
- 4 services.
- 5 (d) "Division" means the division on behavioral health for
- 6 deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing established in section 3 of
- 7 the division on behavioral health for deaf, deafblind, and hard of
- 8 hearing act.
- 9 Sec. 3. (1) The commission on behavioral health for deaf,
- 10 deafblind, and hard of hearing is established within the
- 11 department. The commission shall direct the division on matters
- 12 pertaining to behavioral health issues for deaf, deafblind, and
- 13 hard of hearing persons.
- 14 (2) The commission shall consist of 13 members appointed by
- 15 the governor. Members of the commission shall be knowledgeable of
- 16 behavior heath. The governor shall appoint members to the
- 17 commission as follows:
- 18 (a) The division director or his or her designee.
- 19 (b) Two deaf persons, appointed from a list of nominees
- 20 submitted by groups that advocate or provide services for deaf
- 21 persons.
- (c) Two deafblind persons, appointed from a list of nominees
- 23 submitted by groups that advocate or provide services for deafblind
- 24 persons.
- 25 (d) Two hard of hearing persons, appointed from a list of
- 26 nominees submitted by groups that advocate or provide services for
- 27 hard of hearing persons.

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- 1 (e) A parent of a deaf, deafblind, or hard or hearing child,
- 2 which child is under 21 years of age and has received behavioral
- 3 health services.
- 4 (f) Five members who are knowledgeable in fields relating to
- 5 deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing behavioral health matters. Not
- 6 fewer than 3 of these 5 shall be fluent in American sign language.
- 7 (3) The commission shall elect 1 of its members as the chair
- 8 of the commission. The division director or his or her designee
- 9 shall serve as secretary to the commission.
- 10 (4) Except for the division director or his or her designee
- 11 and members first appointed, the term of office of each member
- 12 shall be 3 years. Of the members first appointed, 5 shall serve for
- 13 3 years, 4 shall serve for 2 years, and 4 shall serve for 1 year. A
- 14 vacancy on the commission shall be filled in the same manner as the
- 15 original appointment for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- 16 (5) Seven members of the commission constitute a quorum for
- 17 transacting business at a meeting of the commission. Except as
- 18 provided by rule, action by the commission shall be by vote of a
- 19 majority of the members present at a meeting. The commission shall
- 20 meet not less than twice a year at the call of the chairperson.
- 21 (6) The legislature annually shall fix the per diem
- 22 compensation of members of the commission. Expenses of members
- 23 incurred in the performance of official duties shall be reimbursed
- 24 as provided by law for state employees.
- 25 (7) The department shall furnish administrative services to
- 26 the commission and shall provide secretarial and other staff
- 27 necessary to allow the proper exercise of the powers and duties of

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- 1 the commission. The department shall provide adequate office space
- 2 to the commission. The department shall make available the times
- 3 and places of commission meetings and keep minutes of the meetings
- 4 and a record of the actions of the commission.
- 5 (8) The department shall assign professional employees to
- 6 staff the commission to assist the commission in the performance of
- 7 its substantive responsibilities under this act.
- 8 Sec. 4. (1) The business that the commission may perform shall
- 9 be conducted at a public meeting held in compliance with the open
- 10 meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275. Public notice of
- 11 the time, date, and place of the meeting shall be given in the
- manner required by the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261
- **13** to 15.275.
- 14 (2) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or
- 15 retained by the commission in the performance of an official
- 16 function shall be made available to the public in compliance with
- 17 the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 18 Sec. 5. The department shall promulgate, as necessary, rules
- 19 to implement this act according to the administrative procedures
- 20 act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328.
- 21 Sec. 6. The legislature annually shall appropriate a sum
- 22 sufficient to implement this act.
- 23 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 24 date it is enacted into law.
- 25 Enacting section 2. This act does not take effect unless
- 26 Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 6109 (request no. 04279'15 \*)
- 27 of the 98th Legislature is enacted into law.

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
