SENATE BILL No. 98

February 11, 2015, Introduced by Senator SHIRKEY and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

A bill to amend 1966 PA 331, entitled "Community college act of 1966," by amending sections 105 and 121 (MCL 389.105 and 389.121), as amended by 2012 PA 495.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 105. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Area", in the term "area vocational-technical education program", means the geographical territory of the district, and any territory outside of the district that is designated as the service area of the district by the superintendent of public instruction. A community college is eligible to receive state aid and assistance appropriated by the legislature for the aid and support of junior colleges or community colleges.
 - (b) "Area vocational-education program" means a program of organized systematic instruction designed to prepare the following

- 1 individuals for useful employment in recognized occupations:
- 2 (i) An individual who has completed or left high school and who
- 3 is available for full-time study in preparation for entering the
- 4 labor market.
- 5 (ii) An individual who has already entered the labor market and
- 6 who needs training to achieve stability or advancement in
- 7 employment.
- 8 (iii) An individual enrolled in high school. If a program or
- 9 course is provided for an individual enrolled in high school, the
- 10 superintendent of the school district in which the individual is
- 11 enrolled or his or her designated representative shall request that
- 12 the program or course be provided to the individual.
- 13 (c) "Community college" means an educational institution
- 14 providing collegiate and noncollegiate level education primarily to
- 15 individuals above the twelfth grade age level within commuting
- 16 distance. The term includes an area vocational-technical education
- 17 program that may result in the granting of an associate degree or
- 18 other diploma or certificate. The term does not include an
- 19 educational institution or program that grants baccalaureate or
- 20 higher degrees other than a BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING DEGREE
- 21 OR ANY baccalaureate degree in cement technology, maritime
- 22 technology, energy production technology, or culinary arts, SKI
- 23 AREA MANAGEMENT, WASTEWATER TREATMENT TECHNOLOGY, ALLIED HEALTH,
- 24 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, OR MANUFACTURING TECHNOLOGY.
- 25 (d) "General election" or "general state election" means the
- 26 term general election as defined in section 2 of the Michigan
- 27 election law, MCL 168.2.

- 1 (e) "Michigan election law" means the Michigan election law,
- 2 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.1 to 168.992.
- 3 (f) "Regular election" means that term as defined in section 3
- 4 of the Michigan election law, MCL 168.3.
- 5 (g) "School district" means a school district, a local act
- 6 school district, or an intermediate school district, as those terms
- 7 are defined in the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 to
- 8 380.1852, or a community college district under this act.
- 9 (h) "School district filing official" means the school
- 10 district election coordinator as defined in section 4 of the
- 11 Michigan election law, MCL 168.4, or an authorized agent of the
- 12 school district election coordinator.
- 13 (i) "Special election" means that term as defined in section 4
- 14 of the Michigan election law, MCL 168.4.
- 15 Sec. 121. The board of trustees of the community college
- 16 district has the power to MAY make plans for, to promote, or to
- 17 acquire, construct, own, develop, maintain, and operate a community
- 18 college and an area vocational-technical education program. The
- 19 board of trustees may do all of the following:
- 20 (a) Locate, acquire, purchase, or lease in the name of the
- 21 community college district a site or sites within or without the
- 22 territory of the community college district for college buildings,
- 23 libraries, agricultural farms, athletic fields, playgrounds,
- 24 stadiums, gymnasiums, auditoriums, parking areas, residence halls,
- 25 and supporting facilities as may be necessary; purchase, lease,
- 26 acquire, erect or build and equip buildings, structures, and other
- 27 improvements for college or area vocational-technical education

- 1 buildings, libraries, agricultural farms, athletic fields,
- 2 playgrounds, stadiums, gymnasiums, auditoriums, parking areas,
- 3 residence halls, and supporting facilities as may be necessary;
- 4 enter into installment purchase contracts for real or personal
- 5 property; pay for real or personal property out of the funds of the
- 6 community college district provided for that purpose; sell or
- 7 exchange any real or personal property of the community college
- 8 district that is no longer required for school purposes, and give
- 9 proper deeds, bills of sale, or other instruments passing title to
- 10 the real or personal property.
- 11 (b) Establish and carry on schools and departments or courses
- 12 of study and other educational programs as may be consistent with
- 13 the purposes of this act, and take over and succeed to the
- 14 operation of a community college or vocational-technical department
- 15 or departments previously operated by school districts within the
- 16 community college district.
- 17 (c) Establish, equip, and maintain agricultural, trade, and
- 18 other vocational-technical departments and have general control
- 19 over them for community college or area vocational-technical
- 20 program purposes.
- 21 (d) Establish education programs and grant a—baccalaureate
- 22 degree DEGREES in cement technology, maritime technology, energy
- 23 production technology, or culinary arts, SKI AREA MANAGEMENT,
- 24 WASTEWATER TREATMENT TECHNOLOGY, ALLIED HEALTH, INFORMATION
- 25 TECHNOLOGY, OR MANUFACTURING TECHNOLOGY. HOWEVER, THE BOARD OF
- 26 TRUSTEES MAY NOT ELIMINATE ANY ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAMS IT
- 27 OPERATES AT THE TIME IT ESTABLISHES A BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAM

- 1 UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION UNLESS THE BOARD DEMONSTRATES THAT THERE IS
- 2 A LACK OF STUDENT DEMAND FOR THAT ASSOCIATE DEGREE.
- 3 (E) ESTABLISH A NURSING EDUCATION PROGRAM THAT GRANTS BACHELOR
- 4 OF SCIENCE IN NURSING DEGREES. ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO THE
- 5 ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING
- 6 DEGREE PROGRAM UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION:
- 7 (i) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL NOT ELIMINATE ANY ASSOCIATE
- 8 DEGREE PROGRAMS THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE OFFERS AT THE TIME IT
- 9 ESTABLISHES A BACHELOR DEGREE PROGRAM UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION UNLESS
- 10 THE BOARD DEMONSTRATES THAT THERE IS A LACK OF STUDENT DEMAND FOR
- 11 THAT ASSOCIATE DEGREE.
- 12 (ii) THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL NOT OPERATE AN EDUCATIONAL
- 13 PROGRAM THAT GRANTS BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING DEGREES UNLESS
- 14 THE PROGRAM IS APPROVED BY THE MICHIGAN BOARD OF NURSING UNDER
- 15 SECTION 17241 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH CODE, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 16 333.17241.
- 17 (iii) BEFORE THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE BEGINS OFFERING BACHELOR OF
- 18 SCIENCE IN NURSING DEGREES, AND WHILE IT OFFERS THOSE DEGREES, THE
- 19 COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL HOLD A NATIONAL PROFESSIONAL NURSING
- 20 ACCREDITATION, HOLD CANDIDACY STATUS FOR THAT ACCREDITATION, OR
- 21 HAVE APPLIED FOR THAT ACCREDITATION, FROM THE COMMISSION ON
- 22 COLLEGIATE NURSING EDUCATION OR THE ACCREDITATION COMMISSION FOR
- 23 EDUCATION IN NURSING.
- 24 (iv) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL NOT EXPAND A BACHELOR OF
- 25 SCIENCE DEGREE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION UNLESS
- 26 THE JOB PLACEMENT RATE AND RATE OF ACCEPTANCE INTO GRADUATE DEGREE
- 27 PROGRAMS FOR NURSING FOR GRADUATES OF THE PROGRAM EQUALS OR EXCEEDS

- 1 THE AVERAGE OF THE RATES FOR JOB PLACEMENT AND ACCEPTANCE INTO
- 2 GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS OF ALL OF THE PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES IN THIS
- 3 STATE THAT OPERATE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING DEGREE PROGRAMS.
