

SENATE BILL No. 283

April 21, 2015, Introduced by Senator CASPERSON and referred to the Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
by amending section 505 (MCL 324.505).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 505. (1) The department, in pursuing the state's policy
2 of propagating fish for the purpose of stocking the streams and
3 lakes of the state, shall accept federal fish stock for such
4 programs, and shall apply for all federal fish stock programs that
5 do not commit the state to future expenditures.

6 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL STOCK AT LEAST 191,859 SPRING WALLEYE
7 FINGERLINGS WITHIN FISH STOCKING PRIORITY REGIONS USING THE AVERAGE
8 STOCKING LEVELS IN THOSE REGIONS FROM 1985 TO 2001 AND THE
9 FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

10 (A) THE MINIMUM STOCKING RATE SHALL BE 50 SPRING WALLEYE
11 FINGERLINGS PER SURFACE ACRE UNTIL A LEGAL SIZED ADULT WALLEYE

1 POPULATION OF A MINIMUM OF 25 INDIVIDUAL WALLEYE OF EACH AGE GROUP
2 IN THE POPULATION ESTIMATE SAMPLE IS SUSTAINED FOR 5 YEARS.

3 (B) FOR AN INDIVIDUAL LAKE IN WHICH THE WALLEYE POPULATION IS
4 SIGNIFICANTLY LOWER THAN THE AVERAGE FOR THE FISH STOCK PRIORITY
5 REGION, THE STOCKING RATE SHALL BE A MINIMUM OF 75 SPRING WALLEYE
6 FINGERLINGS PER ACRE.

7 (C) FOR AN INDIVIDUAL LAKE WITH A HIGHLY COMPROMISED WALLEYE
8 POPULATION, THE STOCKING RATE SHALL BE A MINIMUM OF 100 SPRING
9 WALLEYE FINGERLINGS PER ACRE.

10 (3) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:

11 (A) "FINGERLING" MEANS A FISH BETWEEN 1.50 AND 2 INCHES IN
12 LENGTH.

13 (B) "FISH STOCKING PRIORITY REGION" MEANS A REGION THAT MEETS
14 BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:

15 (i) THE REGION CONSISTS OF 2 OR MORE CONTIGUOUS COUNTIES WITH
16 A COMBINED POPULATION OF NOT LESS THAN 34,000 AND NOT MORE THAN
17 41,000 RESIDENTS.

18 (ii) THE REGION CONTAINS AT LEAST 130 INLAND LAKES.

19 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
20 after the date it is enacted into law.
