## **SENATE BILL No. 353**

May 21, 2015, Introduced by Senator O'BRIEN and referred to the Committee on Insurance.

A bill to amend 1956 PA 218, entitled
"The insurance code of 1956,"
by amending section 3406s (MCL 500.3406s), as added by 2012 PA 100.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3406s. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
- 2 AN INSURER THAT DELIVERS, ISSUES FOR DELIVERY, OR RENEWS IN THIS
- 3 STATE an expense-incurred hospital, medical, or surgical group or
- 4 individual policy or certificate delivered, issued for delivery, or
- 5 renewed in this state and OR a health maintenance organization THAT
  - ISSUES OR RENEWS A group or individual contract shall provide
    - coverage for the TIMELY diagnosis of autism spectrum disorders and

- 1 TIMELY treatment of autism spectrum disorders. AN INSURER OR HEALTH
- 2 MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION SHALL ENSURE THAT EACH INSURED OR ENROLLEE
- 3 HAS ACCESS TO IN-NETWORK PARTICIPATING PROVIDERS THAT ARE A
- 4 REASONABLE DISTANCE FROM THE RESIDENCE OF THE INSURED OR ENROLLEE
- 5 AND THAT DO NOT REQUIRE A WAITING TIME THAT IS LONGER THAN ALLOWED
- 6 BY THE NCQA FOR AN APPOINTMENT TO BEGIN THE PROCESS OF OBTAINING A
- 7 DIAGNOSIS OF AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS
- 8 SUBSECTION, A DIAGNOSIS OR A TREATMENT IS CONSIDERED TO BE TIMELY
- 9 IF IT MEETS THE DEFINITION OF TIMELY AS PROVIDED BY THE NCQA. FOR
- 10 THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION, A DISTANCE IS CONSIDERED TO BE
- 11 REASONABLE IF IT MEETS THE DEFINITION OF REASONABLE DISTANCE
- 12 PROVIDED BY THE NCQA.
- 13 (2) An insurer and OR a health maintenance organization
- 14 SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION shall not do any of the following:
- 15 (a) Terminate coverage or refuse to deliver, execute, issue,
- 16 amend, adjust, or renew coverage solely because an individual is
- 17 diagnosed with, or has received treatment for, an autism spectrum
- 18 disorder.
- 19 (b) Limit the number of visits an insured or enrollee may use
- 20 for treatment of autism spectrum disorders covered under this
- 21 section.
- (c) Deny or limit coverage under this section on the basis
- 23 that treatment is educational or habilitative in nature.
- 24 (D) DENY COVERAGE UNDER THIS SECTION TO, OR LIMIT COVERAGE
- 25 UNDER THIS SECTION TO ONLY, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO EXHIBITS PROBLEM
- 26 BEHAVIORS.
- **27 (E)** <del>(d)</del> Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision,

- 1 subject coverage under this section to dollar limits, copays,
- 2 deductibles, or coinsurance provisions that do not apply to
- 3 physical illness generally. Coverage SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (8), AN
- 4 INSURER OR HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION MAY LIMIT COVERAGE under
- 5 this section for treatment of autism spectrum disorders may be
- 6 limited to an insured or enrollee through 18 years of age and may
- 7 be subject **THE COVERAGE** to a maximum annual benefit as follows:
- 8 (i) For a covered insured or enrollee through 6 years of age,
- **9** \$50,000.00.
- 10 (ii) For a covered insured or enrollee from 7 years of age
- 11 through 12 years of age, \$40,000.00.
- 12 (iii) For a covered insured or enrollee from 13 years of age
- 13 through 18 years of age, \$30,000.00.
- 14 (F) ESTABLISH A NETWORK OF PARTICIPATING PROVIDERS FOR THE
- 15 DIAGNOSIS OR TREATMENT OF AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS THAT ONLY
- 16 INCLUDES AUTISM EVALUATION CENTERS APPROVED BY THE INSURER OR
- 17 HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION. THE INSURER OR HEALTH MAINTENANCE
- 18 ORGANIZATION SHALL ESTABLISH A NETWORK OF PARTICIPATING PROVIDERS
- 19 FOR THE TIMELY DIAGNOSIS AND TIMELY TREATMENT OF AUTISM SPECTRUM
- 20 DISORDERS THAT INCLUDES LICENSED PHYSICIANS AND LICENSED
- 21 PSYCHOLOGISTS WHOSE SCOPE OF PRACTICE INCLUDES THE DIAGNOSIS OF
- 22 AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS OR TREATMENT OF AUTISM SPECTRUM
- 23 DISORDERS, AS APPLICABLE, REGARDLESS OF THE PHYSICIAN'S OR
- 24 PSYCHOLOGIST'S AFFILIATION WITH AN APPROVED AUTISM EVALUATION
- 25 CENTER.
- 26 (3)  $\frac{(2)}{}$  This section does not limit benefits that are
- 27 otherwise available to an insured or enrollee under a policy,

- 1 contract, or certificate. An insurer or health maintenance
- 2 organization shall utilize evidence-based care and managed care
- 3 cost-containment practices pursuant to the insurer's or health
- 4 maintenance organization's procedures so long as IF that care and
- 5 those practices are consistent with this section. The AN INSURER OR
- 6 HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION MAY SUBJECT coverage under this
- 7 section may be subject to other general exclusions and limitations
- 8 of the policy, contract, or certificate, including, but not limited
- 9 to, coordination of benefits, AFFILIATED OR participating provider
- 10 requirements, restrictions on services provided by family or
- 11 household members, utilization review of health care services
- 12 including review of medical necessity, case management, and other
- 13 managed care provisions.
- 14 (4) (3)—If an insured or enrollee is receiving treatment for
- 15 an autism spectrum disorder, an insurer or health maintenance
- 16 organization may, as a condition to providing the coverage under
- 17 this section, do all of the following:
- 18 (a) Require a review of that treatment consistent with current
- 19 protocols and may require a treatment plan. If requested by the
- 20 insurer or health maintenance organization, the cost of treatment
- 21 review shall be borne by the insurer or health maintenance
- 22 organization.
- 23 (b) Request the results of the autism diagnostic observation
- 24 schedule that has been used in the diagnosis of an autism spectrum
- 25 disorder for that insured or enrollee.
- (c) Request that the autism diagnostic observation schedule be
- 27 performed on that insured or enrollee not more frequently than once

- 1 every 3 years.
- 2 (d) Request that an annual development evaluation be conducted
- 3 and the results of that annual development evaluation be submitted
- 4 to the insurer or health maintenance organization.
- 5 (5) (4) Beginning January 1, 2014, a A qualified health plan
- 6 offered through an American health benefit exchange established in
- 7 this state pursuant to the federal act is not required to provide
- 8 coverage under this section to the extent that it exceeds coverage
- 9 that is included in the essential health benefits as required
- 10 pursuant to the federal act. As used in this subsection, "federal
- 11 act" means the federal patient protection and affordable care act,
- 12 Public Law 111-148, as amended by the federal health care and
- 13 education reconciliation act of 2010, Public Law 111-152, and any
- 14 regulations promulgated under those acts.
- (6) (5) This section does not apply to a short-term or 1-time
- 16 limited duration policy or certificate of no longer than 6 months
- 17 as described in section 2213b.
- 18 (7) (6)—This section does not require the coverage of
- 19 prescription drugs and related services unless the insured or
- 20 enrollee is covered by a prescription drug plan. This section does
- 21 not require an insurer or health maintenance organization to
- 22 provide coverage for autism spectrum disorders to an insured or
- 23 enrollee under more than 1 of its policies, certificates, or
- 24 contracts. If an insured or enrollee has more than 1 policy,
- 25 certificate, or contract that covers autism spectrum disorders, the
- 26 benefits provided are subject to the limits of this section when
- 27 coordinating benefits.

- 1 (8) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADJUST THE COVERAGE LIMITS ALLOWED
- 2 UNDER SUBSECTION (2)(E) BY MARCH 31 EACH YEAR IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 3 THE ANNUAL AVERAGE PERCENTAGE INCREASE OR DECREASE IN THE UNITED
- 4 STATES CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR THE 12-MONTH PERIOD ENDING THE
- 5 PRECEDING DECEMBER 31.
- 6 (9)  $\frac{(7)}{}$  As used in this section:
- 7 (a) "Applied behavior analysis" means the design,
- 8 implementation, and evaluation of environmental modifications,
- 9 using behavioral stimuli and consequences, to produce significant
- 10 improvement in human behavior, including the use of direct
- 11 observation, measurement, and functional analysis of the
- 12 relationship between environment and behavior.
- 13 (b) "Autism diagnostic observation schedule" means the
- 14 protocol available through western psychological services for
- 15 diagnosing and assessing autism spectrum disorders or any other
- 16 standardized diagnostic measure for autism spectrum disorders that
- 17 is approved by the commissioner, DIRECTOR if the commissioner
- 18 DIRECTOR determines that the diagnostic measure is recognized by
- 19 the health care industry and is an evidence-based diagnostic tool.
- 20 (c) "Autism spectrum disorders" means any of the following
- 21 pervasive developmental disorders as defined by the diagnostic and
- 22 statistical manual:
- 23 (i) Autistic disorder.
- 24 (ii) Asperger's disorder.
- 25 (iii) Pervasive developmental disorder not otherwise specified.
- 26 (d) "Behavioral health treatment" means evidence-based
- 27 counseling and treatment programs, including applied behavior

- 1 analysis, that meet both of the following requirements:
- 2 (i) Are necessary to develop, maintain, or restore, to the
- 3 maximum extent practicable, the functioning of an individual.
- 4 (ii) Are provided or supervised by a board certified behavior
- 5 analyst or a licensed psychologist so long as IF the services
- 6 performed are commensurate with the psychologist's formal
- 7 university training and supervised experience.
- 8 (e) "Diagnosis of autism spectrum disorders" means
- 9 assessments, evaluations, or tests, including the autism diagnostic
- 10 observation schedule, performed by a licensed physician or a
- 11 licensed psychologist to diagnose whether an individual has 1 of
- 12 the autism spectrum disorders.
- 13 (f) "Diagnostic and statistical manual" or "DSM" means the
- 14 diagnostic and statistical manual of mental disorders published by
- 15 the American psychiatric association PSYCHIATRIC ASSOCIATION or
- 16 other manual that contains common language and standard criteria
- 17 for the classification of mental disorders and that is approved by
- 18 the commissioner, DIRECTOR if the commissioner DIRECTOR determines
- 19 that the manual is recognized by the health care industry and the
- 20 classification of mental disorders is at least as comprehensive as
- 21 the manual published by the American psychiatric association
- 22 PSYCHIATRIC ASSOCIATION on the effective date of this section.APRIL

- 24 (G) "NCOA" MEANS THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE FOR QUALITY ASSURANCE.
- 25 (H) <del>(g)</del> "Pharmacy care" means medications prescribed by a
- 26 licensed physician and related services performed by a licensed
- 27 pharmacist and any health-related services considered medically

- 1 necessary to determine the need or effectiveness of the
- 2 medications.
- 3 (I) (h)—"Psychiatric care" means evidence-based direct or
- 4 consultative services provided by a psychiatrist licensed in the
- 5 state in which the psychiatrist practices.
- 6 (J) (i) "Psychological care" means evidence-based direct or
- 7 consultative services provided by a psychologist licensed in the
- 8 state in which the psychologist practices.
- 9 (K) (j) "Therapeutic care" means evidence-based services
- 10 provided by a licensed or certified speech therapist, occupational
- 11 therapist, physical therapist, or social worker.
- 12 (l) (k) "Treatment of autism spectrum disorders" means
- 13 evidence-based treatment that includes the following care
- 14 prescribed or ordered for an individual diagnosed with 1 of the
- 15 autism spectrum disorders by a licensed physician or a licensed
- 16 psychologist who determines the care to be medically necessary:
- 17 (i) Behavioral health treatment.
- 18 (ii) Pharmacy care.
- 19 (iii) Psychiatric care.
- 20 (iv) Psychological care.
- 21 (v) Therapeutic care.
- 22 (M) (I)—"Treatment plan" means a written, comprehensive, and
- 23 individualized intervention plan that incorporates specific
- 24 treatment goals and objectives and that is developed by a board
- 25 certified or licensed provider who has the appropriate credentials
- 26 and who is operating within his or her scope of practice, when IF
- 27 the treatment of an autism spectrum disorder is first prescribed or

- 1 ordered by a licensed physician or licensed psychologist as
- 2 described in subdivision  $\frac{(k)}{(l)}$ .
- 3 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 4 after the date it is enacted into law.
