SENATE BILL No. 382

June 9, 2015, Introduced by Senators HOOD and SCHMIDT and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 2004 PA 46, entitled "Public safety officers benefit act," by amending section 4 (MCL 28.634).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. (1) If a public safety officer dies or is permanently
- 2 and totally disabled as the direct and proximate result of a
- 3 personal injury sustained in the line of duty, the state shall pay
- 4 a benefit of \$25,000.00 to 1 of the following:
 - (a) If the deceased public safety officer leaves a surviving
- 6 spouse, to that surviving spouse.
 - (b) If the deceased public safety officer does not leave a
- 8 surviving spouse, to his or her dependents.

- 1 (c) If the public safety officer does not leave a surviving
- 2 spouse or any surviving dependents, payment shall be made to the
- 3 estate of the deceased public safety officer.
- 4 (d) If the public safety officer is permanently and totally
- 5 disabled, to the spouse, but if there is no spouse, to the
- 6 dependents, and if there are no dependents, then to the entity
- 7 providing care to the permanently and totally disabled public
- 8 safety officer.
- 9 (2) The benefit shall be paid in addition to any other benefit
- 10 that the beneficiary receives due to the death of the public safety
- 11 officer.
- 12 (3) IN ADDITION TO THE BENEFIT UNDER SUBSECTION (1), IF A
- 13 PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICER IS PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED AS THE
- 14 DIRECT AND PROXIMATE RESULT OF A PERSONAL INJURY SUSTAINED IN THE
- 15 LINE OF DUTY, THIS STATE SHALL PROVIDE THE OFFICER, THE OFFICER'S
- 16 SPOUSE, AND ANY DEPENDENT CHILDREN OF THE OFFICER OR THE OFFICER'S
- 17 SPOUSE A MEDICAL BENEFIT PLAN ON TERMS COMPARABLE TO THE MEDICAL
- 18 BENEFIT PLAN OFFERED TO MICHIGAN STATE POLICE TROOPER RETIREES.
- 19 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 20 after the date it is enacted into law.
