SENATE BILL No. 491

September 16, 2015, Introduced by Senators PAVLOV, COLBECK, HANSEN, BOOHER, PROOS, SHIRKEY and KNOLLENBERG and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending sections 1233b and 1531i (MCL 380.1233b and 380.1531i), section 1233b as amended by 1995 PA 289 and section 1531i as added by 2009 PA 202.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1233b. (1) Except as provided in subsection (3), the
- ${f 2}$ board of a ${f local}$ SCHOOL DISTRICT or intermediate school district
- 3 may engage a full-time or part-time noncertificated, nonendorsed
 - teacher to teach a course in computer science, a foreign language,
- 5 mathematics, biology, chemistry, engineering, physics, robotics,
- 6 WRITING, JOURNALISM, OR HEALTH SCIENCES; IN A DISCIPLINE INCLUDED
- 7 ON THE LISTING OF CRITICAL SHORTAGE DISCIPLINES COMPILED AND
- 8 UPDATED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION UNDER SECTION
- 9 61 OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT ACT OF 1979, 1980 PA

- 1 300, MCL 38.1361; or in another subject area determined by the
- 2 state board to be appropriate to be included under this section and
- 3 so designated by the state board, or any combination of these
- 4 subject areas, in grades 9 through 12.
- 5 (2) Subject to subsection (3), a noncertificated, nonendorsed
- 6 teacher is qualified to teach pursuant to this section if he or she
- 7 meets all of the following minimum requirements:
- 8 (a) Possesses an earned bachelor's degree from an accredited
- 9 postsecondary institution.
- 10 (b) Has a major or a graduate degree in the field of
- 11 specialization in which he or she will teach OR MEETS 1 OF THE
- 12 FOLLOWING:
- 13 (i) FOR TEACHING ENGINEERING OR MATHEMATICS, HAS, IN THE 6-
- 14 YEAR PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE DATE OF HIRE, NOT LESS THAN 5
- 15 YEARS OF OCCUPATIONAL EXPERIENCE IN THE FIELD OF ENGINEERING.
- 16 (ii) FOR TEACHING SCIENCE, HAS, IN THE 6-YEAR PERIOD
- 17 IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE DATE OF HIRE, NOT LESS THAN 5 YEARS OF
- 18 OCCUPATIONAL EXPERIENCE IN A SCIENCE DISCIPLINE.
- 19 (iii) FOR TEACHING BIOLOGY OR HEALTH SCIENCES, HAS, IN THE 6-
- 20 YEAR PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE DATE OF HIRE, NOT LESS THAN 5
- 21 YEARS OF OCCUPATIONAL EXPERIENCE IN A HEALTH DISCIPLINE.
- 22 (iv) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (v), FOR TEACHING A
- 23 FOREIGN LANGUAGE, IS A NATIVE SPEAKER OF THAT FOREIGN LANGUAGE AND
- 24 HAS RESIDED FOR AT LEAST 15 YEARS IN A NATION THAT HAS THAT
- 25 LANGUAGE AS AN OFFICIAL LANGUAGE.
- 26 (v) FOR TEACHING HEBREW, MEETS BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 27 (A) HAS PASSED THE PROFESSIONAL READINESS EXAMINATION

- 1 DEVELOPED OR SELECTED UNDER SECTION 1531.
- 2 (B) HAS PASSED ANY APPLICABLE SUBJECT AREA EXAMINATION
- 3 DEVELOPED OR SELECTED UNDER SECTION 1531 OR, IF THERE IS NO
- 4 APPLICABLE SUBJECT AREA EXAMINATION, MEETS OTHER REQUIREMENTS
- 5 ESTABLISHED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- 6 (c) If the teacher desires to teach for more than 1 year, has
- 7 passed both a basic skills THE PROFESSIONAL READINESS examination
- 8 and a subject area examination, if a subject area examination
- 9 exists, in the field of specialization in which he or she will
- 10 teach.
- 11 (d) Except in the case of persons INDIVIDUALS engaged to teach
- 12 a foreign language, AND EXCEPT AS MAY BE REQUIRED UNDER SUBDIVISION
- 13 (B), has, in the 5-year period immediately preceding the date of
- 14 hire, not less than 2 years of occupational experience in the field
- 15 of specialization in which he or she will teach. FOR THE PURPOSES
- 16 OF THIS SUBDIVISION, SERVING AS A FULL-TIME INSTRUCTOR IN A FIELD
- 17 OF SPECIALIZATION AT THE COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY LEVEL IS CONSIDERED
- 18 TO BE OCCUPATIONAL EXPERIENCE IN THAT FIELD OF SPECIALIZATION.
- 19 (3) The requirements listed in subsection (2) for a teacher
- 20 engaged to teach pursuant to this section shall be ARE in addition
- 21 to any other requirements established by the board of a local
- 22 SCHOOL DISTRICT or intermediate school district, as applicable.
- 23 (4) Except as provided in subsection (5), the board of a local
- 24 SCHOOL DISTRICT or intermediate school district shall not engage a
- 25 full-time or part-time noncertificated, nonendorsed teacher to
- 26 teach a course described in subsection (1) if the district is able
- 27 to engage a certificated, endorsed teacher.

- 1 (5) If the board of a local SCHOOL DISTRICT or intermediate
- 2 school district is able to engage a certificated, endorsed teacher
- 3 to teach a course described in subsection (1), the local_SCHOOL
- 4 DISTRICT or intermediate school board DISTRICT may employ or
- 5 continue to employ a noncertificated, nonendorsed teacher to teach
- 6 the course if both of the following conditions are met:
- 7 (a) The noncertificated, nonendorsed teacher is annually and
- 8 continually enrolled and completing credit in an approved teacher
- 9 preparation program leading to a provisional teaching certificate.
- 10 (b) The noncertificated, nonendorsed teacher has a planned
- 11 program leading to teacher certification on file with the employing
- 12 school district or intermediate school district, his or her teacher
- 13 preparation institution, and the department of education.
- 14 (6) If the noncertificated, nonendorsed teacher completes 3-2
- 15 years of successful classroom teaching, as determined by regular
- 16 observation and review by school district and teacher preparation
- 17 institution personnel, the department of education and a teacher
- 18 preparation institution shall utilize the teaching experience of a
- 19 noncertificated, nonendorsed teacher for the purpose of waiving
- 20 student teaching as a condition for receiving a continued
- 21 employment authorization in the school district and a provisional
- 22 teaching certificate.
- 23 Sec. 1531i. (1) The superintendent of public instruction shall
- 24 establish a process for a person AN INDIVIDUAL to earn an interim
- 25 teaching certificate under this section that qualifies the person
- 26 INDIVIDUAL to teach in the public schools and to earn a Michigan
- 27 teaching certificate using the process under this section. The

- 1 process shall meet all applicable requirements for an alternative
- 2 teaching certification process under the no child left behind act
- 3 of 2001, Public Law 107-110. The process shall not allow for an
- 4 interim teaching certificate for special education.
- 5 (2) The process established under subsection (1) shall provide
- 6 that the superintendent of public instruction will grant an interim
- 7 teaching certificate to a person AN INDIVIDUAL who meets all of the
- 8 following:
- 9 (a) Is a participant in an alternative teaching program that
- 10 is approved by the superintendent of public instruction. To be
- 11 approved, a program provider shall demonstrate to the satisfaction
- 12 of the superintendent of public instruction that it meets all of
- 13 the following:
- 14 (i) Provides for its participants an intensive training
- 15 program in teaching that is determined by the superintendent of
- 16 public instruction to constitute the equivalent of at least 12
- 17 college credit hours and that includes training in at least all of
- 18 the following subject areas:
- 19 (A) Child development or child psychology.
- 20 (B) Family and community relationships.
- 21 (C) Diverse learners.
- 22 (D) Instructional strategies AND CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT.
- 23 (E) A form of field-based experience in a classroom setting.
- 24 (ii) Has a proven record of producing successful teachers in 1
- 25 or more other states or is modeled after a program that has a
- 26 proven record of producing successful teachers in 1 or more other

27 states.

- 1 (iii) Accepts for participation only persons—INDIVIDUALS who
- 2 meet the requirements of subdivision (b).
- 3 (b) Holds a bachelor's , master's, doctorate, or professional
- 4 degree from a regionally accredited college or university with a
- 5 grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or the
- 6 equivalent on another scale, as determined by the superintendent of
- 7 public instruction, OR HOLDS A MASTER'S OR DOCTORATE DEGREE FROM A
- 8 REGIONALLY ACCREDITED COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY.
- 9 (c) Passes both the basic skills PROFESSIONAL READINESS
- 10 examination and the appropriate available subject area examination
- 11 for each subject area in which he or she applies to be certified.
- 12 (3) A person AN INDIVIDUAL earning a provisional AN INTERIM
- 13 TEACHING certificate under this section will be IS subject to
- 14 provisions of administrative rules governing teachers, as
- 15 established by the superintendent of public instruction.
- 16 (4) A person AN INDIVIDUAL who possesses an interim teaching
- 17 certificate under this section may be employed to teach in a public
- 18 school in the same manner as a person AN INDIVIDUAL holding a
- 19 Michigan teaching certificate issued under section 1531 if all of
- 20 the following requirements are met:
- 21 (a) While the person-INDIVIDUAL is teaching under an interim
- 22 teaching certificate, the school district or public school academy
- 23 in which the person-INDIVIDUAL is teaching provides intensive
- 24 observation and coaching in a manner and to the extent prescribed
- 25 by the superintendent of public instruction.
- 26 (b) The person INDIVIDUAL is making satisfactory progress
- 27 toward meeting the requirements for being awarded a Michigan

- 1 teaching certificate under section 1531, as established by the
- 2 superintendent of public instruction under subsection (5).
- 3 (5) The superintendent of public instruction shall develop
- 4 standards for granting a person AN INDIVIDUAL a Michigan teaching
- 5 certificate issued under section 1531 after the person_INDIVIDUAL
- 6 has demonstrated satisfactory teaching performance for 3 years
- 7 under an interim teaching certificate and has met the requirements
- 8 established by the superintendent of public instruction for a
- 9 Michigan teaching certificate.
- 10 (6) The superintendent of public instruction shall promulgate
- 11 rules that he or she considers necessary to implement this section.
- 12 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY RULE TO THE CONTRARY, AN INTERIM TEACHING
- 13 CERTIFICATE ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION IS VALID FOR A PERIOD OF 7
- 14 YEARS FROM THE DATE IT IS ISSUED.
- 15 (7) IF AN INDIVIDUAL SEEKING AN INTERIM TEACHING CERTIFICATE
- 16 UNDER THIS SECTION HAS MORE THAN 1 MASTER'S, DOCTORATE, OR
- 17 PROFESSIONAL DEGREE, OR HAS A BACHELOR'S DEGREE WITH MORE THAN 1
- 18 MAJOR, AND IF HE OR SHE MEETS THE OTHER REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
- 19 SECTION, THEN THE INDIVIDUAL IS ELIGIBLE FOR A SUBJECT AREA
- 20 ENDORSEMENT, IF AVAILABLE, IN EACH OF THE SUBJECT AREAS IN WHICH HE
- OR SHE HOLDS A MASTER'S, DOCTORATE, OR PROFESSIONAL DEGREE OR HAS
- 22 EARNED A MAJOR.
- 23 (8) (7) As used in this section, "basic skills "PROFESSIONAL
- 24 READINESS examination", "elementary certification examination", and
- 25 "subject area examination" mean those terms as defined in RULES
- 26 PROMULGATED UNDER section 1531.
- 27 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days

1 after the date it is enacted into law.
