1 SEC. 16283. AS USED IN SECTIONS 16284 TO 16289:

- 5 DISCIPLINARY SUBCOMMITTEE FINDS THAT A HEALTH PROFESSIONAL HAS

- 7 SEC. 16288. THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH A BOARD, MAY
- 8 PROMULGATE RULES TO IMPLEMENT SECTIONS 16284, 16285, AND 16286.
- 9 SEC. 16289. SECTIONS 16284 TO 16288 DO NOT REQUIRE NEW OR
- 10 ADDITIONAL THIRD PARTY REIMBURSEMENT FOR SERVICES RENDERED BY A
- 11 HEALTH PROFESSIONAL THROUGH TELEHEALTH.
- 12 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 13 after the date it is enacted into law.
