SENATE BILL No. 847

March 8, 2016, Introduced by Senators ZORN, BIEDA, BOOHER, HORN, HERTEL, BRANDENBURG, EMMONS, COLBECK and SCHMIDT and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 224 (MCL 257.224), as amended by 2013 PA 179.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 224. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this act
 regarding tabs or stickers, upon registering a vehicle, the
 secretary of state shall issue to the owner 1 registration plate.
 - (2) A registration plate shall display the registration number assigned to the vehicle for which the registration plate is issued; the name of this state, which may be abbreviated; and when the registration plate expires, which may be shown by a tab or sticker furnished by the secretary of state.
 - (3) A registration plate issued for motor vehicles owned and operated by this state; a state institution; a municipality; a privately incorporated, nonprofit volunteer fire department; or a

- 1 nonpublic, nonprofit college or university of this state shall not
- 2 expire at any particular time but shall be renewed when the
- 3 registration plate is worn out or is illegible. This registration
- 4 plate shall be assigned upon proper application and payment of the
- 5 applicable fee and may be used on any eligible vehicle titled to
- 6 the applicant if a written record is kept of the vehicles upon
- 7 which the registration plate is used. The written record shall
- 8 state the time the registration plate is used on a particular
- 9 vehicle. The record shall be open to inspection by a law
- 10 enforcement officer or a representative of the secretary of state.
- 11 (4) A registration plate issued for a vehicle owned by the
- 12 civil air patrol as organized under 36 USC 201 40301 to 208; 40307;
- 13 a vehicle owned by a nonprofit organization and used to transport
- 14 equipment for providing dialysis treatment to children at camp; an
- 15 emergency support vehicle used exclusively for emergencies and
- 16 owned and operated by a federally recognized nonprofit charitable
- 17 organization; a vehicle owned and operated by a nonprofit veterans
- 18 center; a motor vehicle having a truck chassis and a locomotive or
- 19 ship's body which is owned by a nonprofit veterans organization and
- 20 used exclusively in parades and civic events; a vehicle owned and
- 21 operated by a nonprofit recycling center or a federally recognized
- 22 nonprofit conservation organization until December 31, 2000; a
- 23 motor vehicle owned and operated by a senior citizen center; and a
- 24 registration plate issued for buses including station wagons,
- 25 carryalls, or similarly constructed vehicles owned and operated by
- 26 a nonprofit parents' transportation corporation used for school
- 27 purposes, parochial school, society, church Sunday school, or other

- 1 grammar school, or by a nonprofit youth organization or nonprofit
- 2 rehabilitation facility shall be issued upon proper application and
- 3 payment of the applicable tax provided in section 801(1)(g) or (h)
- 4 to the applicant for the vehicle identified in the application. The
- 5 vehicle shall be used exclusively for activities of the school or
- 6 organization and shall be designated by proper signs showing the
- 7 school or organization operating the vehicle. The registration
- 8 plate shall expire on December 31 in the fifth year following the
- 9 date of issuance. The registration plate may be transferred to
- 10 another vehicle upon proper application and payment of a \$10.00
- 11 transfer fee.
- 12 (5) The department shall offer a standard design registration
- 13 plate that complies with the requirements of this act. The standard
- 14 design registration plate shall be of a common color scheme and
- 15 design that is made of fully reflectorized material and shall be
- 16 clearly visible at night. THE STANDARD DESIGN REGISTRATION PLATE
- 17 DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION SHALL HAVE THE PHRASE "GREAT LAKES
- 18 STATE" INSCRIBED BENEATH THE REGISTRATION NUMBERS.
- 19 (6) The department may use the Pure Michigan brand or a
- 20 successor or similar brand that is used in conjunction with this
- 21 state's promotion, travel, and tourism campaigns or marketing
- 22 efforts as part of the standard design for registration plates.
- 23 (7) The registration plate and the required letters and
- 24 numerals on the registration plate shall be of sufficient size to
- 25 be plainly readable from a distance of 100 feet during daylight.
- 26 The secretary of state may issue a tab or tabs designating the
- 27 month and year of expiration.

- 1 (8) The secretary of state shall issue for every passenger
- 2 motor vehicle rented without a driver the same type of registration
- 3 plate as the type of registration plate issued for private
- 4 passenger vehicles.
- 5 (9) A person shall not operate a vehicle on the public
- 6 highways or streets of this state displaying a registration plate
- 7 other than the registration plate issued for the vehicle by the
- 8 secretary of state, except as provided in this chapter for
- 9 nonresidents, or by assignment as provided in subsection (3).
- 10 (10) The registration plate displayed on a vehicle registered
- 11 on the basis of elected gross weight shall indicate the elected
- 12 gross weight for which the vehicle is registered.
- 13 (11) Beginning on January 1, 2015, a registration plate issued
- 14 by the department under this section shall not be renewed 10 years
- 15 after the date that registration plate was issued. The owner of a
- 16 vehicle whose registration plate is no longer eligible for renewal
- 17 under this subsection shall obtain a replacement registration plate
- 18 upon payment of the fee required under section 804. For any
- 19 alphanumeric series that the department has retired from
- 20 circulation, upon request of the owner of a vehicle whose
- 21 registration plate is no longer eligible for renewal under this
- 22 subsection, the department may issue a new registration plate with
- 23 the same registration number as was displayed on the expired
- 24 registration plate as provided under section 803b.
- 25 (12) The secretary of state, in conjunction with the
- 26 department of corrections, the Michigan state police, the Michigan
- 27 sheriffs' association, 1 individual appointed by the speaker of the

- 1 house of representatives, and 1 individual appointed by the senate
- 2 majority leader, shall prepare a report analyzing the viability of
- 3 moving from the current registration plate production process to a
- 4 digital printing of registration plates. The secretary of state
- 5 shall submit the report to the standing committees of the senate
- 6 and house of representatives with primary responsibility for
- 7 transportation issues no later than December 31, 2013.
- 8 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 9 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 10 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 11 unless Senate Bill No. 845
- of the 98th Legislature is enacted into law.
