SENATE BILL No. 962

May 17, 2016, Introduced by Senator STAMAS and referred to the Committee on Oversight.

A bill to amend 1969 PA 306, entitled "Administrative procedures act of 1969," by amending sections 5, 44, 45, and 45a (MCL 24.205, 24.244, 24.245, and 24.245a), section 5 as amended by 2006 PA 460, section 44 as amended by 2004 PA 23, section 45 as amended by 2013 PA 200, and section 45a as amended by 2011 PA 245, and by adding section 45c.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 5. $\frac{(1)}{}$ AS USED IN THIS ACT:

(A) "License" includes the whole or part of an agency permit, certificate, approval, registration, charter, or similar form of permission required by law. , but LICENSE does not include a license required solely for revenue purposes, or a license or

- 1 registration issued under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300,
- 2 MCL 257.1 to 257.923.
- 3 (B) (2) "Licensing" includes agency activity involving the
- 4 grant, denial, renewal, suspension, revocation, annulment,
- 5 withdrawal, recall, cancellation, or amendment of a license.
- 6 (C) (3)—"Michigan register" means the publication described in
- 7 section 8.
- 8 (D) (4)—"Notice" means a written or electronic record that
- 9 informs a person of past or future action of the person generating
- 10 the record.
- 11 (E) (5)—"Notice of objection" means the record adopted by the
- 12 committee that indicates the committee's formal objection to a
- 13 proposed rule.
- 14 (F) "OFFICE" MEANS, UNLESS EXPRESSLY STATED OTHERWISE, THE
- 15 OFFICE OF PERFORMANCE AND TRANSFORMATION.
- 16 (G) "OFFICE OF REGULATORY REFORM", "STATE OFFICE OF
- 17 ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS AND RULES", AND "OFFICE OF REGULATORY
- 18 REINVENTION" MEAN THE OFFICE.
- 19 (H) (6)—"Party" means a person or agency named, admitted, or
- 20 properly seeking and entitled of right to be admitted, as a party
- 21 in a contested case. In a contested case regarding an application
- 22 for a license, party includes the applicant for that THE license.
- 23 (I) (7) "Person" means an individual, partnership,
- 24 association, corporation, limited liability company, limited
- 25 liability partnership, governmental subdivision, or public or
- 26 private organization of any kind other than the agency engaged in
- 27 the particular processing of a rule, declaratory ruling, or

- 1 contested case.
- 2 (J) (8)—"Processing of a rule" means the action required or
- 3 authorized by this act regarding a rule that is to be promulgated,
- 4 including the rule's adoption, and ending with the rule's
- 5 promulgation.
- 6 (K) (9)—"Promulgation of a rule" means that step in the
- 7 processing of a rule consisting of the filing of a THE rule with
- 8 the secretary of state.
- 9 (1) $\frac{(10)}{(10)}$ "Record" means information that is inscribed on a
- 10 paper or electronic medium.
- 11 Sec. 44. (1) Sections 41 and 42 do not apply to an amendment
- 12 or rescission of a rule that is obsolete or superseded, or that is
- 13 required to make obviously needed corrections to make the rule
- 14 conform to an amended or new statute or to accomplish any other
- 15 solely formal purpose, if a statement to that effect is included in
- 16 the legislative service bureau certificate of approval of the rule.
- 17 (2) Sections 41 and 42 do not apply to a rule that is
- 18 promulgated under the Michigan occupational safety and health act,
- 19 1974 PA 154, MCL 408.1001 to 408.1094, that is substantially
- 20 similar to an existing federal standard that has been adopted or
- 21 promulgated under the occupational safety and health act of 1970,
- 22 Public Law 91-596. , 84 Stat. 1590. However, notice of the proposed
- 23 rule shall MUST be published in the Michigan register at least 35
- 24 days before the submission of the rule to the secretary of state
- 25 pursuant to UNDER section 46(1). A reasonable period, not to exceed
- 26 21 days, shall MUST be provided for the submission of written or
- 27 electronic comments and views following publication in the Michigan

- 1 register.
- 2 (3) SECTIONS 41 AND 42 DO NOT APPLY TO A CHANGE TO A PROPOSED
- 3 RULE BY AN AGENCY DURING PROCESSING OF THE RULE IF THE OFFICE
- 4 DETERMINES UNDER SECTION 45C(3) THAT THE REGULATORY IMPACT AND
- 5 IMPACT ON SMALL BUSINESSES OF THE CHANGED PROPOSED RULE ARE NOT
- 6 MORE BURDENSOME THAN THE REGULATORY IMPACT AND IMPACT ON SMALL
- 7 BUSINESSES OF THE ORIGINAL PROPOSED RULE.
- **8** (4) (3) For purposes of subsection (2), "substantially
- 9 similar" means identical, with the exception of style or format
- 10 differences needed to conform to this or other state laws, as
- 11 determined by the office. of regulatory reform pursuant to section
- 12 45(1).
- Sec. 45. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection,
- 14 an agency shall electronically submit a proposed rule to the
- 15 legislative service bureau for its formal certification. If
- 16 requested by the legislative service bureau, the office of
- 17 regulatory reinvention shall also transmit up to 4 paper copies of
- 18 the proposed rule. The legislative service bureau shall promptly
- 19 issue a certificate of approval indicating whether the proposed
- 20 rule is proper as to all matters of form, classification, and
- 21 arrangement. If the legislative service bureau fails to issue a
- 22 certificate of approval within 21 calendar days after receipt of
- 23 the submission for formal certification, the office of regulatory
- 24 reinvention may issue a certificate of approval. If the legislative
- 25 service bureau returns the submission to the agency before the
- 26 expiration of the 21-calendar-day time period, the 21-calendar-day
- 27 time period is tolled until the rule is resubmitted by the agency.

- 1 The AFTER RESUBMISSION, THE legislative service bureau shall have
- 2 HAS the remainder of the 21-calendar-day time period or 6 calendar
- 3 days, whichever is longer, to consider the formal certification of
- 4 the rule. The office of regulatory reinvention may approve a
- 5 proposed rule if it considers the proposed rule to be legal and
- 6 appropriate.

- 8 given as provided in this act and before the agency proposing the
- 9 rule has formally adopted the rule, the agency shall prepare an
- 10 agency report containing a synopsis of the comments contained in

- 12 and the regulatory impact statement required under subsection (3).
- 13 In the report, the agency shall describe any changes in the
- 14 proposed rules that were made by the agency after the public
- 15 hearing. The office of regulatory reinvention shall transmit by
- 16 notice of transmittal to the committee copies of the rule, the
- 17 agency reports containing the request for rule-making, a copy of
- 18 the regulatory impact statement, and certificates of approval from
- 19 the legislative service bureau and the office. -of regulatory
- 20 reinvention. The office of regulatory reinvention shall also
- 21 electronically submit to the committee a copy of the rule, any
- 22 agency reports required under this subsection, any regulatory
- 23 impact statements required under subsection (3), and any
- 24 certificates of approval required under subsection (1). The agency
- 25 shall electronically transmit to the committee the records
- 26 described in this subsection within 1 year after the date of the
- 27 last public hearing on the proposed rule. unless the proposed rule

- 1 is a resubmission under section 45a(7).
- 2 (3) Except as provided in subsection (6), an agency shall
- 3 prepare and include with a notice of transmittal under subsection
- 4 (2) the request for rule-making and the response from the office,
- 5 of regulatory reinvention, a small business impact statement
- 6 prepared under section 40(1), 40, and a regulatory impact
- 7 statement. The regulatory impact statement shall MUST contain all
- 8 of the following information:
- 9 (a) A comparison of the proposed rule to parallel federal
- 10 rules or standards set by a state or national licensing agency or
- 11 accreditation association, if any exist.
- 12 (b) If requested by the office of regulatory reinvention or
- 13 the committee, a comparison of the proposed rule to standards in
- 14 similarly situated states, based on geographic location,
- 15 topography, natural resources, commonalities, or economic
- 16 similarities.
- 17 (c) An identification of the behavior and frequency of
- 18 behavior that the rule is designed to alter.
- 19 (d) An identification of the harm resulting from the behavior
- 20 that the rule is designed to alter and the likelihood that the harm
- 21 will occur in the absence of the rule.
- 22 (e) An estimate of the change in the frequency of the targeted
- 23 behavior expected from the rule.
- 24 (f) An identification of the businesses, groups, or
- 25 individuals who will be directly affected by, bear the cost of, or
- 26 directly benefit from the rule.
- 27 (g) An identification of any reasonable alternatives to

- 1 regulation pursuant to the proposed rule that would achieve the
- 2 same or similar goals.
- 3 (h) A discussion of the feasibility of establishing a
- 4 regulatory program similar to that proposed in the rule that would
- 5 operate through market-based mechanisms.
- 6 (i) An estimate of the cost of rule imposition on the agency
- 7 promulgating the rule.
- 8 (j) An estimate of the actual statewide compliance costs of
- 9 the proposed rule on individuals.
- 10 (k) A demonstration that the proposed rule is necessary and
- 11 suitable to achieve its purpose in proportion to the burdens it
- 12 places on individuals.
- 13 (l) An estimate of the actual statewide compliance costs of
- 14 the proposed rule on businesses and other groups.
- 15 (m) An identification of any disproportionate impact the
- 16 proposed rule may have on small businesses because of their size.
- 17 (n) An identification of the nature of any report required and
- 18 the estimated cost of its preparation by small businesses required
- 19 to comply with the proposed rule.
- (o) An analysis of the costs of compliance for all small
- 21 businesses affected by the proposed rule, including costs of
- 22 equipment, supplies, labor, and increased administrative costs.
- 23 (p) An identification of the nature and estimated cost of any
- 24 legal consulting and accounting services that small businesses
- 25 would incur in complying with the proposed rule.
- 26 (q) An estimate of the ability of small businesses to absorb
- 27 the costs estimated under subdivisions (n) to (p) without suffering

- 1 economic harm and without adversely affecting competition in the
- 2 marketplace.
- 3 (r) An estimate of the cost, if any, to the agency of
- 4 administering or enforcing a rule that exempts or sets lesser
- 5 standards for compliance by small businesses.
- 6 (s) An identification of the impact on the public interest of
- 7 exempting or setting lesser standards of compliance for small
- 8 businesses.
- 9 (t) A statement describing the manner in which the agency
- 10 reduced the economic impact of the rule on small businesses or a
- 11 statement describing the reasons such a reduction was not feasible.
- 12 (u) A statement describing how the agency has involved small
- 13 businesses in the development of the rule.
- 14 (v) An estimate of the primary and direct benefits of the
- 15 rule.
- 16 (w) An estimate of any cost reductions to businesses,
- 17 individuals, groups of individuals, or governmental units as a
- 18 result of the rule.
- 19 (x) An estimate of any increase in revenues to state or local
- 20 governmental units as a result of the rule.
- 21 (y) An estimate of any secondary or indirect benefits of the
- 22 rule.
- 23 (z) An identification of the sources the agency relied upon ON
- 24 in compiling the regulatory impact statement, including the
- 25 methodology utilized in determining the existence and extent of the
- 26 impact of a proposed rule and a cost-benefit analysis of the
- 27 proposed rule.

- 1 (aa) A detailed recitation of the efforts of the agency to
- 2 comply with the mandate to reduce the disproportionate impact of
- 3 the rule upon small businesses as described in section 40(1)(a) to
- **4** (d).
- 5 (bb) Any other information required by the office. of
- 6 regulatory reinvention.
- 7 (4) The agency shall electronically transmit the regulatory
- 8 impact statement required under subsection (3) to the office of
- 9 regulatory reinvention at least 28 days before the public hearing
- 10 required under section 42. Before 41. THE AGENCY SHALL NOT HOLD the
- 11 public hearing can be held, UNTIL the regulatory impact statement
- 12 must be HAS BEEN reviewed and approved by the office. -of
- 13 regulatory reinvention. The agency shall also electronically
- 14 transmit a copy of the regulatory impact statement to the committee
- 15 before the public hearing and the agency shall make copies
- 16 available to the public at the public hearing. The agency shall
- 17 publish the regulatory impact statement on its website at least 10
- 18 days before the date of the public hearing.
- 19 (5) The committee shall electronically transmit to the senate
- 20 fiscal agency and the house fiscal agency a copy of each rule and
- 21 regulatory impact statement filed with the committee and a copy of
- 22 the agenda identifying the proposed rules to be considered by the
- 23 committee. The senate fiscal agency and the house fiscal agency
- 24 shall analyze each proposed rule for possible fiscal implications
- 25 that, if the rule were adopted, would result in additional
- 26 appropriations in the current fiscal year or commit the legislature
- 27 to an appropriation in a future fiscal year. The senate fiscal

- 1 agency and the house fiscal agency shall electronically report
- 2 their findings to the senate and house appropriations committees

- 16 objection, PROPOSE THAT THE RULE BE CHANGED, OR DECIDE TO INTRODUCE
- 17 BILLS UNDER SUBSECTION (5) within the time period prescribed in
- 18 subsection (1), or if the committee waives the remaining session
- 19 days by concurrent majority, UNDER SUBSECTION (1), the office of
- 20 regulatory reinvention may immediately file the rule, with the
- 21 certificate of approval required under section 45(1), with the

- 10 THE RULE WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNTIL 1 CALENDAR YEAR AFTER
- 11 THE BILLS WERE INTRODUCED.
- 12 (8) (5)—If the—legislation introduced under subsection (3)—(4)
- 13 OR (5) is defeated in either house and if the vote by which the
- 14 legislation failed to pass is not reconsidered in compliance with
- 15 the rules of that house, or if legislation introduced under
- 16 subsection (3) (4) OR (5) is not adopted by both houses within the
- 17 time APPLICABLE period specified in subsection (4), (6) OR (7), the
- 18 office of regulatory reinvention may file the rule with the
- 19 secretary of state. The rule takes effect immediately upon its
- 20 filing ON BEING FILED with the secretary of state unless a later

- 22 (9) (6)—If the—legislation introduced under subsection (3)—(4)

- 25 (12) (9)—An agency shall withdraw any rule pending before the
- 26 committee at the final adjournment of a regular session held in an
- 27 even-numbered year and resubmit that THE rule. A new and untolled

- 2 upon BEGINS ON resubmission of the rule to the committee for
- 3 consideration.
- 4 (13) (10)—As used in this section only, "session day" means a
- 5 day in which both the house of representatives and the senate

- 22 (3) AFTER RECEIVING THE TEXT OF A PROPOSED RULE AS CHANGED
- 23 UNDER SUBSECTION (2), THE OFFICE SHALL REVIEW THE RULE AS CHANGED
- 24 AND DETERMINE WHETHER THE REGULATORY IMPACT OR THE IMPACT ON SMALL
- 25 BUSINESSES OF THE RULE AS CHANGED WOULD BE MORE BURDENSOME THAN THE
- 26 REGULATORY IMPACT OR THE IMPACT ON SMALL BUSINESSES OF THE RULE AS
- 27 ORIGINALLY PROPOSED. IF THE LANGUAGE OF THE RULE AS CHANGED IS

- 1 IDENTICAL TO THE LANGUAGE OF THE CORRESPONDING RULE PROMULGATED AND
- 2 IN EFFECT AT THE TIME OF THE REVIEW, THE REGULATORY IMPACT AND
- 3 IMPACT ON SMALL BUSINESSES OF THE RULE AS CHANGED ARE NOT MORE
- 4 BURDENSOME. THE OFFICE SHALL NOTIFY THE AGENCY OF ITS DETERMINATION
- 5 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 6 (4) IF THE OFFICE'S DETERMINATION UNDER SUBSECTION (3) IS THAT
- 7 THE REGULATORY IMPACT AND THE IMPACT ON SMALL BUSINESSES OF THE
- 8 RULE AS CHANGED WOULD NOT BE MORE BURDENSOME, THE AGENCY IS NOT
- 9 REQUIRED TO PREPARE A NEW AGENCY REPORT UNDER SECTION 45(2) OR
- 10 CONDUCT A NEW PUBLIC HEARING ON THE RULE AS CHANGED. IF THE
- 11 DETERMINATION IS THAT THE REGULATORY IMPACT AND THE IMPACT ON SMALL
- 12 BUSINESSES OF THE RULE AS CHANGED WOULD BE MORE BURDENSOME, THE
- 13 AGENCY SHALL PREPARE A NEW AGENCY REPORT UNDER SECTION 45(2) AND
- 14 CONDUCT A NEW PUBLIC HEARING. INSTEAD OF CONDUCTING THE PUBLIC
- 15 HEARING AS OTHERWISE REQUIRED BY THIS ACT, THE PUBLIC HEARING MAY
- 16 BE CONDUCTED AT A HEARING BY THE COMMITTEE IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 17 PROCEDURES APPLICABLE TO A HEARING OF THE COMMITTEE. HOWEVER, A
- 18 QUORUM OF THE COMMITTEE IS NOT NECESSARY FOR A HEARING UNDER THIS
- 19 SUBSECTION AND THE COMMITTEE SHALL NOT VOTE ON ANY MATTER RELATED
- 20 TO THE RULE AS CHANGED AT THE HEARING.
- 21 (5) AFTER RECEIVING THE OFFICE'S DETERMINATION UNDER
- 22 SUBSECTION (3), THE AGENCY SHALL SUBMIT A SUPPLEMENT TO THE AGENCY
- 23 REPORT UNDER SECTION 45(2) THAT INCLUDES ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 24 (A) A STATEMENT OF THE DETERMINATION OF THE OFFICE UNDER
- 25 SUBSECTION (3) AND WHETHER A NEW AGENCY REPORT UNDER SECTION 45(2)
- 26 AND PUBLIC HEARING ARE REQUIRED.
- 27 (B) AN EXPLANATION FOR THE PROPOSED CHANGED RULE.

- 1 (6) IF AN AGENCY DECIDES TO NOT CHANGE A RULE UNDER SUBSECTION
- 2 (1), THE AGENCY SHALL WITHIN THE 30-DAY PERIOD UNDER SUBSECTION (1)
- 3 NOTIFY THE COMMITTEE OF THE DECISION AND THE REASONS FOR THE
- 4 DECISION AND FILE THE NOTICE WITH THE OFFICE. AFTER THE NOTICE IS
- 5 FILED, THE COMMITTEE HAS 15 SESSION DAYS IN WHICH TO CONSIDER THE
- 6 AGENCY'S DECISION AND TAKE 1 OF THE ACTIONS LISTED IN SECTION
- 7 45A(1).
- 8 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect January
