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SENATE BILL No. 1041

September 6, 2016, Introduced by Senator EMMONS and referred to the Committee on Families, Seniors and Human Services.

A bill to amend 1979 PA 218, entitled "Adult foster care facility licensing act," by amending section 24 (MCL 400.724).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 24. (1) A person who believes that this act or a rule promulgated under this act may have been violated may request an investigation of an adult foster care facility. The request shall be submitted to the department in writing or the department shall assist the person in reducing an oral complaint to writing within 7 days after the oral request is made.
 - (2) The substance of the complaint shall be provided to the licensee not earlier than at the commencement of the on-site inspection of the adult foster care facility which—takes place

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- 1 pursuant ACCORDING to the complaint.
- 2 (3) The complaint, a copy of the complaint, or a record
- 3 published, released, or otherwise disclosed to the adult foster
- 4 care facility shall not disclose the name of the complainant or an
- 5 adult resident named in the complaint unless the complainant or an
- 6 adult resident consents in writing to the disclosure or the
- 7 investigation results in an administrative hearing or a judicial
- 8 proceeding, or unless disclosure is considered essential to the
- 9 investigation by the department. If disclosure is considered
- 10 essential to the investigation, the complainant shall be given the
- 11 opportunity to withdraw the complaint before disclosure.
- 12 (4) Upon receipt of a complaint, the department shall
- 13 determine, based on the allegations presented, whether this act or
- 14 a rule promulgated under this act has been, is, or is in danger of
- 15 being violated. The department shall investigate the complaint
- 16 according to the urgency determined by the department. The
- 17 initiation of a complaint investigation shall commence within 15
- 18 days after receipt of the written complaint by the department.
- 19 (5) The department shall inform the complainant of its
- 20 findings. Within 30 days after the receipt of complaint, the
- 21 department shall provide the complainant a copy, if any, of the
- 22 written determination or a status report indicating when these
- 23 documents may be expected. The final report shall include a copy of
- 24 the original complaint. The complainant may request additional
- 25 copies of the documents listed in this subsection and shall
- 26 reimburse the department for the copies pursuant ACCORDING to
- 27 established policies and procedures.

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- 1 (6) The department shall inform the licensee of the
- 2 department's findings at the same time that the department informs
- 3 the complainant pursuant to UNDER subsection (5).
- 4 (7) A written determination concerning a complaint shall be
- 5 available for public inspection, but the name of the complainant or
- 6 adult resident shall not be disclosed without the complainant's or
- 7 adult resident's consent.
- 8 (8) A complainant who is dissatisfied with the determination
- 9 or investigation by the department may request a hearing. A request
- 10 for a hearing shall be submitted in writing to the director within
- 11 30 days after the mailing of the department's findings as described
- 12 in subsection (5). Notice of the time and place of the hearing
- 13 shall be sent to the complainant and the adult foster care
- 14 facility. A complainant who is dissatisfied with the decision of
- 15 the director may appeal by filing with the clerk of the court an
- 16 affidavit setting forth the substance of the proceedings before the
- 17 department and the errors of law upon which the person relies, and
- 18 serving the director with a copy of the affidavit. The circuit
- 19 court of the county in which the complainant resides shall have
- 20 jurisdiction to hear and determine the questions of fact or law
- 21 involved in the appeal.
- 22 (9) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (3) AND SECTION 13(3),
- 23 INFORMATION OR RECORDS THAT THE DEPARTMENT HAS IN ITS POSSESSION
- 24 MAY BE DISCLOSED TO THE EXTENT NECESSARY FOR THE PROPER FUNCTIONING
- 25 OF THE DEPARTMENT OR ANOTHER STATE DEPARTMENT.
- 26 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 27 after the date it is enacted into law.
