HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION KK

April 27, 2016, Introduced by Reps. Kosowski, Geiss, Plawecki, Santana, Moss and Kivela and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution of 1963, by amending section 26 of article IV, to impose a limit on the amount of time the house of representatives has to vote on a bill on final passage.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the state of Michigan, That the following amendment to the state constitution of 1963, to impose a limit on the amount of time the house of representatives has to vote on a bill on final passage, is proposed, agreed to, and submitted to the people of the state:

ARTICLE IV

Sec. 26. No A bill shall **NOT** be passed or become a law at any regular session of the legislature until it has been printed or reproduced and in the possession of each house for at least five

- 2 final passage thereof. No OF THAT BILL. A bill shall NOT become a
- 3 law without the concurrence of a majority of the members elected to
- 4 and serving in each house. ON THE FINAL PASSAGE OF A BILL IN THE
- 5 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
- 6 SHALL OPEN THE VOTING BOARD FOR FIVE MINUTES FOR A RECORD ROLL CALL
- 7 VOTE, AFTER WHICH TIME THE VOTING BOARD SHALL BE CLOSED AND THE
- 8 VOTE SHALL BE RECORDED. On the final passage of bills, A BILL, the
- 9 votes and names of the members voting thereon ON THE BILL shall be
- 10 entered in the journal.
- 11 Resolved further, That the foregoing amendment shall be
- 12 submitted to the people of the state at the next general election
- in the manner provided by law.
