SUMMARY:

House Bill 4160, enacted as Public Act 112 of 2017, revised the Michigan Vehicle Code to add Section 676b to allow a person to solicit contributions on behalf of a charitable or civic organization during daylight hours in a traffic intersection under specific conditions ¹ That bill defined "charitable or civic organization" to mean a nonprofit organization qualified under sections 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(4) of the federal Internal Revenue Code or a veterans' organization that has tax-exempt status under the Internal Revenue Code.

<u>House Bill 4888</u> would amend Section 676b of the Michigan Vehicle Code to expand the definition of applicable "charitable or civic organization" to also include a nonprofit organization qualified under section 501(c)(7), 501(c)(8) or 501(c)(10) of the federal Internal Revenue Code, namely social and recreational clubs, and fraternal societies or organizations.
