## **CONTENT**

The bill amends the Open Meetings Act to require a public body to establish procedures to accommodate the absence of any member of the public body due to military duty.

The Act requires all decisions of a public body to be made at a meeting open to the public. The bill requires a public body, except for a meeting of any State legislative body, to establish the following procedures to accommodate the absence of any member of the public body due to military duty:

- -- Procedures by which the absent member may participate in, and vote on, business before the public body, including, if feasible, procedures that ensure two-way communication.
- -- Procedures by which the public is provided notice of the absence of the member and information about how to contact that member sufficiently in advance of a meeting of the public body to provide input on any business that comes before the public body.

The bill will take effect on March 29, 2019.
