## **CONTENT**

The bill would amend the Social Welfare Act to specify that an eligible individual could receive medically necessary treatment for opioid use disorder.

The Social Welfare Act lists medical services that may be provided under the Act, including hospital, physician, nursing home, pharmaceutical, and psychiatric services. Under the bill, an eliqible individual could receive medically necessary acute medical detoxification for opioid use disorder, medically necessary inpatient care at an approved facility, or care in an appropriately licensed substance use disorder residential treatment facility.
