## SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 6403

## A bill to amend 1953 PA 192, entitled

"An act to create a county department of veterans' affairs in certain counties, and to prescribe its powers and duties; to create the county veteran service fund and to provide for contributions to and expenditures from that fund; and to transfer the powers and duties of the soldiers' relief commission in those counties,"

by amending section 3a (MCL 35.623a), as added by 2018 PA 210.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3a. (1) The county veteran service fund is created within
- 2 the state treasury.
- 3 (2) The state treasurer may receive money or other assets from
- 4 any source for deposit into the fund. The state treasurer shall
- 5 direct the investment of the fund. The state treasurer shall credit
- 6 to the fund interest and earnings from fund investments.
- 7 (3) Money in the fund at the close of the fiscal year shall

- 1 remain in the fund and shall not lapse to the general fund.
- 2 (4) The Michigan veterans affairs agency shall be the
- 3 administrator of the fund for auditing purposes.
- 4 (5) The Michigan veterans affairs agency shall create and
- 5 operate a grant program that provides grants to counties for county
- 6 veteran service operations. The Michigan veterans affairs agency
- 7 shall make grants from the fund, upon appropriation, to each county
- 8 department of veterans' affairs that meets the conditions listed in
- 9 subsection (7) for the sole use of the county's veteran service
- 10 operations. The total disbursement for each grant shall be
- 11 determined by combining the following amounts:
- 12 (a) A base amount of  $\frac{$25,000.00}{50,000.00}$ .
- 13 (b) A per capita amount according to the number of veterans
- 14 residing in each county. The amount in this subdivision shall be
- 15 determined by dividing the amount remaining in the fund after
- 16 accounting for all disbursements under subdivision (a) by the total
- 17 number of veterans residing in this state and multiplying the
- 18 resulting dollar amount by the number of veterans residing in the
- 19 county receiving the grant. Population figures for veterans
- 20 residing in this state and in each county of this state shall be
- 21 obtained from the most recent Geographic Distribution of VA
- 22 Expenditures (GDX) Report published by the United States Department
- 23 of Veterans Affairs.
- 24 (6) BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO THE DISBURSEMENT OF A GRANT
- 25 UNDER SUBSECTION (5):
- 26 (A) THE BASE AMOUNT DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (5) (A) SHALL BE
- 27 PROVIDED IN A LUMP SUM DISTRIBUTION NOT LATER THAN DECEMBER 31 OF

- 1 EACH YEAR. THE INITIAL BASE AMOUNT SHALL BE PROVIDED NOT LATER THAN
- 2 JANUARY 31, 2019.
- 3 (B) If the amount remaining in the fund after accounting for
- 4 all disbursements under subsection (5)(a) is less than the amount
- 5 obtained by multiplying \$1,000.00 by the number of counties
- 6 receiving grants, the Michigan veterans affairs agency shall not
- 7 perform a calculation under subsection (5)(b) and shall not
- 8 disburse the portion of grant funds described under that
- 9 subsection.
- 10 (7) To be eligible for receiving a grant under subsection (5),
- 11 within 1 year of the effective date of the amendatory act that
- 12 added this section, SEPTEMBER 24, 2018, and annually after that
- 13 date, a county department of veterans' affairs must satisfy all of
- 14 the following as certified in a form and manner prescribed by the
- 15 Michigan veterans affairs agency:
- 16 (a) Maintain a minimum level of county funding for veteran
- 17 service operations equal to the level of county funding for veteran
- 18 service operations for the fiscal year preceding the effective date
- 19 of the amendatory act that added this section. SEPTEMBER 24, 2018.
- 20 (b) Establish remote access to the United States Department of
- 21 Veterans Affairs computing systems and require county veteran
- 22 service officers to obtain a PIV card.
- 23 (c) Submit quarterly reports to the Michigan veterans affairs
- 24 agency in accordance with the reporting requirements determined by
- 25 that agency.
- 26 (d) Provide no less than 20 hours per week toward veteran
- 27 service operations.

- 1 (e) Submit financial reports to the Michigan veterans affairs
- 2 agency on a regular basis, as determined by that agency,
- 3 demonstrating that the county department of veterans' affairs
- 4 expended the grant funds received under subsection (5) directly and
- 5 solely on veteran service operations during the period of the
- 6 report. If the Michigan veterans affairs agency determines, by
- 7 audit or otherwise, that a county department of veterans' affairs
- 8 expended the grant funds received under subsection (5) for purposes
- 9 other than veteran service operations, the Michigan veterans
- 10 affairs agency shall reduce the grant disbursement provided to the
- 11 county department of veterans' affairs in the succeeding fiscal
- 12 year by an amount equal to the total of all amounts improperly
- 13 expended.
- 14 (8) As used in this section:
- 15 (a) "Accredited veteran service officer" means an individual
- 16 who has met the qualifications for accreditation under 38 USC 5904
- **17** and 38 CFR 14.629.
- 18 (b) "County veteran service fund" or "fund" means the fund
- 19 created in subsection (1).
- (c) "PIV card" means a personal identity verification card
- 21 issued by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.
- 22 (d) "Veteran service operations" means assistance and
- 23 programming OF ANY KIND to meet the needs of veterans in this
- 24 state. Veteran service operations include, but are not limited to,
- 25 PROVIDING ASSISTANCE, PROGRAMMING, AND SERVICES FOR THE PURPOSE OF
- 26 ASSISTING VETERANS IN THIS STATE AND providing advice, advocacy,
- 27 and assistance to veterans, servicemembers, dependents, or

- survivors by an accredited veteran service officer to obtain United 1
- States Department of Veterans Affairs health, financial, or 2
- memorial benefits for which they are eligible. 3
