February 27, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Cole, Lucido, Sabo and Greimel and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 670 (MCL 257.670), as amended by 2002 PA 534.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 670. (1) A person shall not operate or move a caterpillar

- 2 tractor, shovel, derrick, roller, boiler, machinery, or other 3 structure or object upon rollers, or other equipment or structure,
- 4 which, because of its limited power, or weight, character, or load,
- has a normal operating speed of 4 miles per hour or less, or which has a vertical load or body clearance of less than 9 inches above
- the level surface of the roadway, upon or across the tracks of a
- railroad at grade level without first complying with this section, 8
- 9 except this section shall not apply to the movement of electrically
- propelled cars on fixed rails or to their loads.
 - (2) Notice of the intended crossing described in subsection

- 1 (1) shall be given to the nearest agent or officer of the railroad
- 2 in time to afford protection to its locomotives, trains, or cars at
- 3 the crossing.
- 4 (3) Before making the crossing, the person operating or moving
- 5 the vehicle or equipment shall first stop not less than 15 feet or
- 6 more than 50 feet from the nearest rail of the track and while
- 7 stopped shall listen and look in both directions along the track
- 8 for an approaching RAILROAD train OR OTHER ON-TRACK EQUIPMENT and
- 9 for signals indicating the approach of a RAILROAD train OR OTHER
- 10 ON-TRACK EQUIPMENT, and shall not proceed until the crossing can be
- 11 made safely.
- 12 (4) A crossing shall not be made when warning is given by
- 13 automatic signal or crossing gates or a flagman or otherwise of the
- 14 immediate approach of a railroad train or car.
- 15 (5) A person who violates this section is responsible for a
- 16 civil infraction.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 18 after the date it is enacted into law.
