

**SUBSTITUTE FOR  
SENATE BILL NO. 684**

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled  
"The revised school code,"  
by amending section 1278b (MCL 380.1278b), as amended by 2014 PA  
209.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1       Sec. 1278b. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section  
2 or section 1278a, beginning with pupils entering grade 8 in 2006,  
3 as part of the requirements under section 1278a the board of a  
4 school district or board of directors of a public school academy  
5 shall not award a high school diploma to a pupil unless the pupil  
6 has successfully completed all of the following credit requirements  
7 of the Michigan merit standard before graduating from high school:

8       (a) At least 4 credits in English language arts that are  
9 aligned with subject area content expectations developed by the

1 department and approved by the state board under this section.

2 (b) At least 3 credits in science that are aligned with  
3 subject area content expectations developed by the department and  
4 approved by the state board under this section, including  
5 completion of at least biology and either chemistry, physics,  
6 anatomy, or agricultural science, or successfully completing a  
7 program or curriculum that provides the same content as the  
8 chemistry or physics benchmarks, as determined by the department. A  
9 student may fulfill the requirement for the third science credit by  
10 completing a department-approved computer science program or  
11 curriculum or formal career and technical education program or  
12 curriculum. The legislature strongly encourages pupils to complete  
13 a fourth credit in science, such as forensics, astronomy, Earth  
14 science, agricultural science, environmental science, geology,  
15 physics, chemistry, physiology, or microbiology.

16 (c) The credit requirements specified in section  
17 1278a(1)(a)(i) to (iv).

18 (2) If a pupil successfully completes 1 or more of the high  
19 school credits required under subsection (1) or under section  
20 1278a(1) before entering high school, the pupil shall be given high  
21 school credit for that credit.

22 (3) For the purposes of this section and section 1278a, the  
23 department shall do all of the following:

24 (a) Develop subject area content expectations that apply to  
25 the credit requirements of the Michigan merit standard that are  
26 required under subsection (1)(a) and (b) and section 1278a(1)(a)(i)  
27 and (ii) and develop guidelines for the remaining credit

1 requirements of the Michigan merit standard that are required under  
2 this section and section 1278a(1)(a), for the online course or  
3 learning experience required under section 1278a(1)(b), and for the  
4 requirements for a language other than English under section  
5 1278a(2). All of the following apply to these subject area content  
6 expectations and guidelines:

7 (i) All subject area content expectations shall be consistent  
8 with the state board recommended model core academic curriculum  
9 content standards under section 1278. Subject area content  
10 expectations or guidelines shall not include attitudes, beliefs, or  
11 value systems that are not essential in the legal, economic, and  
12 social structure of our society and to the personal and social  
13 responsibility of citizens of our society. The subject area content  
14 expectations shall require pupils to demonstrate critical thinking  
15 skills.

16 (ii) The subject area content expectations and the guidelines  
17 must be approved by the state board under subsection (4).

18 (iii) The subject area content expectations shall state in  
19 clear and measurable terms what pupils are expected to know upon  
20 completion of each credit.

21 (iv) The department shall complete the development of the  
22 subject area content expectations that apply to algebra I and the  
23 guidelines for the online course or learning experience under  
24 section 1278a(1)(b) not later than August 1, 2006.

25 (v) The department shall complete development of the subject  
26 area content expectations or guidelines that apply to each of the  
27 other credits required in the Michigan merit standard under

1 subsection (1) and section 1278a(1)(a) not later than 1 year before  
2 the beginning of the school year in which a pupil entering high  
3 school in 2007 would normally be expected to complete the credit.

4 (vi) If the department has not completed development of the  
5 subject area content expectations that apply to a particular credit  
6 required in the Michigan merit standard under subsection (1) or  
7 section 1278a(1)(a) by the date required under this subdivision, a  
8 school district or public school academy may align the content of  
9 the credit with locally adopted standards.

10 (vii) Until all of the subject area content expectations and  
11 guidelines have been developed by the department and approved by  
12 the state board, the department shall submit a report at least  
13 every 6 months to the senate and house standing committees  
14 responsible for education legislation on the status of the  
15 development of the subject area content expectations and  
16 guidelines. The report shall detail any failure by the department  
17 to meet a deadline established under subparagraph (iv) or (v) and  
18 the reasons for that failure.

19 (b) Develop and implement a process for developing the subject  
20 area content expectations and guidelines required under this  
21 section. This process shall provide for all of the following:

22 (i) Soliciting input from all of the following groups:

23 (A) Recognized experts in the relevant subject areas.

24 (B) Representatives from 4-year colleges or universities,  
25 community colleges, and other postsecondary institutions.

26 (C) Teachers, administrators, and school personnel who have  
27 specialized knowledge of the subject area.

1 (D) Representatives from the business community.

2 (E) Representatives from vocational and career and technical  
3 education providers.

4 (F) Government officials, including officials from the  
5 legislature.

6 (G) Parents of public school pupils.

7 (ii) A review of the subject area content expectations or  
8 guidelines by national experts.

9 (iii) An opportunity for the public to review and provide  
10 input on the proposed subject area content expectations or  
11 guidelines before they are submitted to the state board for  
12 approval. The time period allowed for this review and input shall  
13 be at least 15 business days.

14 (c) Determine the basic level of technology and internet  
15 access required for pupils to complete the online course or  
16 learning experience requirement of section 1278a(1)(b), and submit  
17 that determination to the state board for approval.

18 (d) Develop and make available material to assist school  
19 districts and public school academies in implementing the  
20 requirements of this section and section 1278a. This shall include  
21 developing guidelines for alternative instructional delivery  
22 methods as described in subsection (7).

23 (4) The state board shall approve subject area content  
24 expectations and guidelines developed by the department under  
25 subsection (3) before those subject area content expectations and  
26 guidelines may take effect. The state board also shall approve the  
27 basic level of technology and internet access required for pupils

1 to complete the online course or learning experience requirement of  
2 section 1278a(1)(b).

3 (5) The parent or legal guardian of a pupil who has completed  
4 grade 9, a teacher who is currently teaching the pupil, who  
5 currently teaches in or whose expertise is in a subject area  
6 proposed to be modified by the personal curriculum, or who is  
7 determined by the principal to have qualifications otherwise  
8 relevant to developing a personal curriculum, or a school counselor  
9 or school employee qualified to act in a counseling role under  
10 section 1233 or 1233a may request a personal curriculum under this  
11 subsection for the pupil that modifies certain of the Michigan  
12 merit standard requirements under subsection (1) or section  
13 1278a(1)(a). If the request for a personal curriculum is made by  
14 the pupil's parent or legal guardian or, if the pupil is at least  
15 age 18 or is an emancipated minor, by the pupil, the school  
16 district or public school academy shall develop a personal  
17 curriculum for the pupil. A teacher, school counselor, or school  
18 employee qualified to act in a counseling role under section 1233  
19 or 1233a may contact a pupil's parent or legal guardian to discuss  
20 the possibility and potential benefits of a personal curriculum  
21 under this subsection for the pupil. If all of the requirements  
22 under this subsection for completing a personal curriculum are met,  
23 then the board of a school district or board of directors of a  
24 public school academy may award a high school diploma to a pupil  
25 who successfully completes his or her personal curriculum even if  
26 it does not meet the requirements of the Michigan merit standard  
27 required under subsection (1) and section 1278a(1)(a). All of the

1 following apply to a personal curriculum:

2 (a) The personal curriculum shall be developed by a group that  
3 includes at least the pupil, at least 1 of the pupil's parents or  
4 the pupil's legal guardian, and a teacher described in this  
5 subdivision or the pupil's high school counselor or another  
6 designee qualified to act in a counseling role under section 1233  
7 or 1233a selected by the high school principal. In addition, for a  
8 pupil who receives special education services, a school  
9 psychologist should also be included in this group. The teacher  
10 included in the group developing the personal curriculum shall be a  
11 teacher who is currently teaching the pupil, who currently teaches  
12 in or whose expertise is in a subject area being modified by the  
13 personal curriculum, or who is determined by the principal to have  
14 qualifications otherwise relevant to the group. This subdivision  
15 does not require an in-person meeting of the group.

16 (b) The personal curriculum shall incorporate as much of the  
17 subject area content expectations of the Michigan merit standard  
18 required under subsection (1) and section 1278a(1)(a) as is  
19 practicable for the pupil; shall establish measurable goals that  
20 the pupil must achieve while enrolled in high school and shall  
21 provide a method to evaluate whether the pupil achieved these  
22 goals; and shall be aligned with the pupil's educational  
23 development plan developed under subsection (11).

24 (c) Before it takes effect, the personal curriculum must be  
25 agreed to by the pupil's parent or legal guardian and by the  
26 superintendent of the school district or chief executive of the  
27 public school academy or his or her designee.

1 (d) The pupil's parent or legal guardian shall be in  
2 communication with each of the pupil's teachers to monitor the  
3 pupil's progress toward the goals contained in the pupil's personal  
4 curriculum.

5 (e) Revisions may be made in the personal curriculum if the  
6 revisions are developed and agreed to in the same manner as the  
7 original personal curriculum.

8 (f) The English language arts credit requirements of  
9 subsection (1)(a) and the science credit requirements of subsection  
10 (1)(b) are not subject to modification as part of a personal  
11 curriculum under this subsection.

12 (g) The mathematics credit requirements of section  
13 1278a(1)(a)(i) may be modified as part of a personal curriculum if  
14 the pupil successfully completes at least 3-1/2 total credits of  
15 the mathematics credits required under that section before  
16 completing high school, including algebra I and geometry, and  
17 successfully completes at least 1 mathematics credit during his or  
18 her final 2 years of high school. The algebra II credit required  
19 under that section may be modified as part of a personal curriculum  
20 under this subsection if the pupil meets 1 or more of the  
21 following:

22 (i) Successfully completes the same content as 1 semester of  
23 algebra II, as determined by the department.

24 (ii) Elects to complete the same content as algebra II over 2  
25 years, with a credit awarded for each of those 2 years, and  
26 successfully completes that content.

27 (iii) Enrolls in a formal career and technical education



1 program or curriculum and in that program or curriculum  
2 successfully completes the same content as the algebra II  
3 benchmarks assessed on the department-prescribed state high school  
4 assessment, as determined by the department.

5 (iv) Successfully completes 1 semester of statistics,  
6 functions and data analysis, or technical mathematics.

7 (h) The social science credit requirements of section  
8 1278a(1)(a)(ii) may be modified as part of a personal curriculum  
9 only if all of the following are met:

10 (i) The pupil has successfully completed 2 credits of the  
11 social science credits required under section 1278a(1), including  
12 the civics course described in section 1166(2).

13 (ii) The modification requires the pupil to complete 1  
14 additional credit in English language arts, mathematics, or science  
15 or 1 additional credit in a language other than English, or  
16 requires the pupil to complete a formal career and technical  
17 education program. This additional credit must be in addition to  
18 the number of those credits otherwise required under subsection (1)  
19 and section 1278a(1) or under section 1278a(2).

20 (i) The health and physical education credit requirement under  
21 section 1278a(1)(a)(iii) may be modified as part of a personal  
22 curriculum only if the modification requires the pupil to complete  
23 1 additional credit in English language arts, mathematics, or  
24 science or 1 additional credit in a language other than English, or  
25 requires the pupil to complete a formal career and technical  
26 education program. This additional credit must be in addition to  
27 the number of those credits otherwise required under subsection (1)

1 and section 1278a(1) or under section 1278a(2).

2 (j) The visual arts, performing arts, or applied arts credit  
3 requirement under section 1278a(1) (a) (iv) may be modified as part  
4 of a personal curriculum only if the modification requires the  
5 pupil to complete 1 additional credit in English language arts,  
6 mathematics, or science or 1 additional credit in a language other  
7 than English, or requires the pupil to complete a formal career and  
8 technical education program. This additional credit must be in  
9 addition to the number of those credits otherwise required under  
10 subsection (1) and section 1278a(1) or under section 1278a(2).

11 (k) If the parent or legal guardian of a pupil requests as  
12 part of the pupil's personal curriculum a modification of the  
13 Michigan merit standard requirements that would not otherwise be  
14 allowed under this section and demonstrates that the modification  
15 is necessary because the pupil is a child with a disability, the  
16 school district or public school academy may allow that additional  
17 modification to the extent necessary because of the pupil's  
18 disability if the group under subdivision (a) determines that the  
19 modification is consistent with both the pupil's educational  
20 development plan under subsection (11) and the pupil's  
21 individualized education program. If the superintendent of public  
22 instruction has reason to believe that a school district or a  
23 public school academy is allowing modifications inconsistent with  
24 the requirements of this subdivision, the superintendent of public  
25 instruction shall monitor the school district or public school  
26 academy to ensure that the school district's or public school  
27 academy's policies, procedures, and practices are in compliance

1 with the requirements for additional modifications under this  
2 subdivision. As used in this subdivision, "child with a disability"  
3 means that term as defined in 20 USC 1401.

4 (l) If a pupil transfers to a school district or public school  
5 academy from out of state or from a nonpublic school, the pupil's  
6 parent or legal guardian may request, as part of the pupil's  
7 personal curriculum, a modification of the Michigan merit standard  
8 requirements that would not otherwise be allowed under this  
9 section. The school district or public school academy may allow  
10 this additional modification for a transfer pupil if all of the  
11 following are met:

12 (i) The transfer pupil has successfully completed at least the  
13 equivalent of 2 years of high school credit out of state or at a  
14 nonpublic school. The school district or public school academy may  
15 use appropriate assessment examinations to determine what credits,  
16 if any, the pupil has earned out of state or at a nonpublic school  
17 that may be used to satisfy the curricular requirements of the  
18 Michigan merit standard and this subdivision.

19 (ii) The transfer pupil's personal curriculum incorporates as  
20 much of the subject area content expectations of the Michigan merit  
21 standard as is practicable for the pupil.

22 (iii) The transfer pupil's personal curriculum requires the  
23 pupil to successfully complete at least 1 mathematics course during  
24 his or her final year of high school enrollment. In addition, if  
25 the transfer pupil is enrolled in the school district or public  
26 school academy for at least 1 full school year, both of the  
27 following apply:

1 (A) The transfer pupil's personal curriculum shall require  
2 that this mathematics course is at least algebra I.

3 (B) If the transfer pupil demonstrates that he or she has  
4 mastered the content of algebra I, the transfer pupil's personal  
5 curriculum shall require that this mathematics course is a course  
6 normally taken after completing algebra I.

7 (iv) The transfer pupil's personal curriculum includes the  
8 civics course described in section 1166(2).

9 (m) If a pupil is at least age 18 or is an emancipated minor,  
10 the pupil may act on his or her own behalf under this subsection.

11 (n) This subsection does not apply to a pupil enrolled in a  
12 high school that is designated as a specialty school under section  
13 1278a(5) and that is exempt under that section from the English  
14 language arts requirement under subsection (1)(a) and the social  
15 science credit requirement under section 1278a(1)(a) (ii).

16 (o) The department or a school district or public school  
17 academy shall not limit or discourage the number of pupils with a  
18 personal curriculum on any basis other than the best interests of  
19 each individual pupil.

20 (p) A school district or public school academy annually shall  
21 notify each of its pupils and a parent or legal guardian of each of  
22 its pupils that all pupils are entitled to a personal curriculum  
23 under this subsection. The annual notice shall include an  
24 explanation of what a personal curriculum is and state that if a  
25 personal curriculum is requested, the public school or public  
26 school academy will grant that request. The school district or  
27 public school academy shall provide this annual notice to parents

1 and legal guardians by sending a written notice to each pupil's  
2 home or by including the notice in a newsletter, student handbook,  
3 or similar communication that is sent to a pupil's home, and also  
4 shall post the notice on the school district's or public school  
5 academy's website.

6 (6) If a pupil receives special education services, the  
7 pupil's individualized education program, in accordance with the  
8 individuals with disabilities education act, title VI of Public Law  
9 91-230, shall identify the appropriate course or courses of study  
10 and identify the supports, accommodations, and modifications  
11 necessary to allow the pupil to progress in the curricular  
12 requirements of this section and section 1278a, or in a personal  
13 curriculum as provided under subsection (5), and meet the  
14 requirements for a high school diploma.

15 (7) The board of a school district or board of directors of a  
16 public school academy that operates a high school shall ensure that  
17 each pupil is offered the curriculum necessary for the pupil to  
18 meet the curricular requirements of this section and section 1278a.  
19 The board or board of directors may provide this curriculum by  
20 providing the credits specified in this section and section 1278a,  
21 by using alternative instructional delivery methods such as  
22 alternative course work, humanities course sequences, career and  
23 technical education, industrial technology courses, or vocational  
24 education, or by a combination of these. School districts and  
25 public school academies that operate career and technical education  
26 programs are encouraged to integrate the credit requirements of  
27 this section and section 1278a into those programs.

1           (8) If the board of a school district or board of directors of  
2 a public school academy wants its high school to be accredited  
3 under section 1280, the board or board of directors shall ensure  
4 that all elements of the curriculum required under this section and  
5 section 1278a are made available to all affected pupils. If a  
6 school district or public school academy does not offer all of the  
7 required credits, the board of the school district or board of  
8 directors of the public school academy shall ensure that the pupil  
9 has access to the required credits by another means, such as  
10 enrollment in a postsecondary course under the postsecondary  
11 enrollment options act, 1996 PA 160, MCL 388.511 to 388.524;  
12 enrollment in an online course; a cooperative arrangement with a  
13 neighboring school district or with a public school academy; or  
14 granting approval under section 6(6) of the state school aid act of  
15 1979, MCL 388.1606, for the pupil to be counted in membership in  
16 another school district.

17           (9) If a pupil is not successfully completing a credit  
18 required for graduation under this section and section 1278a, or is  
19 identified as being at risk of withdrawing from high school, then  
20 the pupil's school district or public school academy shall notify  
21 the pupil's parent or legal guardian or, if the pupil is at least  
22 age 18 or is an emancipated minor, the pupil, of the availability  
23 of tutoring or other supplemental educational support and  
24 counseling services that may be available to the pupil under  
25 existing state or federal programs, such as those programs or  
26 services available under section 31a of the state school aid act of  
27 1979, MCL 388.1631a, or under the no child left behind act of 2001,

1 Public Law 107-110.

2 (10) To the extent required by the no child left behind act of  
3 2001, Public Law 107-110, the board of a school district or public  
4 school academy shall ensure that all components of the curricular  
5 requirements under this section and section 1278a are taught by  
6 highly qualified teachers. If a school district or public school  
7 academy demonstrates to the department that the school district or  
8 public school academy is unable to meet the requirements of this  
9 section because the school district or public school academy is  
10 unable to hire enough highly qualified teachers, the department  
11 shall work with the school district or public school academy to  
12 develop a plan to allow the school district or public school  
13 academy to hire enough highly qualified teachers to meet the  
14 requirements of this section.

15 (11) The board of a school district or board of directors of a  
16 public school academy shall provide the opportunity for each pupil  
17 to develop an educational development plan during grade 7, and  
18 shall ensure that each pupil reviews his or her educational  
19 development plan during grade 8 and revises it as appropriate  
20 before he or she begins high school. **THE BOARD OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT**  
21 **OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL ALSO ENSURE**  
22 **THAT EACH PUPIL REVIEWS AND REVISES HIS OR HER EDUCATIONAL**  
23 **DEVELOPMENT PLAN AS APPROPRIATE DURING EACH YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL.** An  
24 educational development plan shall be developed, reviewed, and  
25 revised by the pupil under the supervision of the pupil's school  
26 counselor or another designee qualified to act in a counseling role  
27 under section 1233 or 1233a selected by the school principal and

1 shall be based on high school readiness scores and a career  
2 pathways program or similar career exploration program. An  
3 educational development plan shall be designed to assist pupils to  
4 identify career development goals as they relate to academic  
5 requirements. During the process of developing and reviewing a  
6 pupil's educational development plan, the pupil shall be advised  
7 that many of the curricular requirements of this section and  
8 section 1278a may be fulfilled through career and technical  
9 education. **IN ADDITION, DURING THE PROCESS OF DEVELOPING AND**  
10 **REVIEWING AN EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN, THE PUPIL SHALL BE**  
11 **PROVIDED WITH ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:**

12 (A) INFORMATION ON VARIOUS TYPES OF CAREERS AND CURRENT AND  
13 PROJECTED JOB OPENINGS IN THIS STATE AND THOSE JOBS' ACTUAL AND  
14 PROJECTED WAGES.

15 (B) AN OPPORTUNITY TO EXPLORE CAREERS SPECIFIC TO A PUPIL'S  
16 INTERESTS AND IDENTIFY CAREER PATHWAYS AND GOALS FOR ACHIEVING  
17 SUCCESS IN THOSE CAREERS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE LEVEL  
18 AND TYPE OF EDUCATIONAL PREPARATION NECESSARY TO ACCOMPLISH THOSE  
19 GOALS.

20 (C) AN OPPORTUNITY TO DEVELOP A TALENT PORTFOLIO. A TALENT  
21 PORTFOLIO SHALL BE DEVELOPED AND REVISED THROUGHOUT THE  
22 IMPLEMENTATION OF A PUPIL'S EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN. A TALENT  
23 PORTFOLIO SHALL INCLUDE, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, A RECORD OF THE  
24 PUPIL'S EXPERIENCES, PROFICIENCIES, CERTIFICATIONS, OR  
25 ACCOMPLISHMENTS THAT DEMONSTRATE TALENTS OR MARKETABLE SKILLS. THE  
26 DEPARTMENT, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF TALENT AND  
27 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, SHALL DEVELOP AND MAKE AVAILABLE TO THE



**1 PUBLIC SCHOOLS MODEL INFORMATION MATERIALS THAT DISTRICTS OR PUBLIC**  
**2 SCHOOL ACADEMIES MAY USE TO COMPLY WITH THIS SUBDIVISION.**

3 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, if a  
4 school district or public school academy is unable to implement all  
5 of the curricular requirements of this section and section 1278a  
6 for pupils entering grade 9 in 2007 or is unable to implement  
7 another requirement of this section or section 1278a, the school  
8 district or public school academy may apply to the department for  
9 permission to phase in 1 or more of the requirements of this  
10 section or section 1278a. To apply, the school district or public  
11 school academy shall submit a proposed phase-in plan to the  
12 department. The department shall approve a phase-in plan if the  
13 department determines that the plan will result in the school  
14 district or public school academy making satisfactory progress  
15 toward full implementation of the requirements of this section and  
16 section 1278a. If the department disapproves a proposed phase-in  
17 plan, the department shall work with the school district or public  
18 school academy to develop a satisfactory plan that may be approved.  
19 However, if legislation is enacted that adds section 1290 to allow  
20 school districts and public school academies to apply for a  
21 contract that waives certain state or federal requirements, then  
22 this subsection does not apply but a school district or public  
23 school academy may take action as described in subsection (13).  
24 This subsection does not apply to a high school that is designated  
25 as a specialty school under section 1278a(5) and that is exempt  
26 under that section from the English language arts requirement under  
27 subsection (1)(a) and the social science credit requirement under

1 section 1278a(1) (a) (ii) .

2 (13) If a school district or public school academy does not  
3 offer all of the required credits or provide options to have access  
4 to the required credits as provided under subsection (8) and if  
5 legislation is enacted that adds section 1290 to allow school  
6 districts and public school academies to apply for a contract that  
7 waives certain state or federal requirements, then the school  
8 district or public school academy is encouraged to apply for a  
9 contract under section 1290. The purpose of a contract described in  
10 this subsection is to improve pupil performance.

11 (14) This section and section 1278a do not prohibit a pupil  
12 from satisfying or exceeding the credit requirements of the  
13 Michigan merit standard under this section and section 1278a  
14 through advanced studies such as accelerated course placement,  
15 advanced placement, dual enrollment in a postsecondary institution,  
16 or participation in the international baccalaureate program or an  
17 early college/middle college program.

18 (15) Not later than April 1 of each year, the department shall  
19 submit an annual report to the legislature that evaluates the  
20 overall success of the curriculum required under this section and  
21 section 1278a, the rigor and relevance of the course work required  
22 by the curriculum, the ability of public schools to implement the  
23 curriculum and the required course work, and the impact of the  
24 curriculum on pupil success, and that details any activities the  
25 department has undertaken to implement this section and section
