## SUBSTITUTE FOR

## SENATE BILL NO. 360

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 17751 (MCL 333.17751), as amended by 2016 PA 49.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 17751. (1) A pharmacist shall not dispense a drug
- 2 requiring a prescription under the federal act or a law of this
- 3 state except under authority of an original prescription or an
- 4 equivalent record of an original prescription approved by the
- 5 board.
- 6 (2) Subject to subsection (5), a pharmacist may dispense a
- 7 prescription written and signed; written or created in an
- 8 electronic format, signed, and transmitted by facsimile; or
- 9 transmitted electronically or by other means of communication by a
- 10 physician prescriber, dentist prescriber, or veterinarian

- 1 prescriber in another state, but not including a prescription for a
- 2 controlled substance as defined in section 7104 except under
- 3 circumstances described in section 17763(e), only if the pharmacist
- 4 in the exercise of his or her professional judgment determines all
- 5 of the following:
- 6 (a) Except as otherwise authorized under section 5110, 17744a,
- 7 or 17744b, if the prescriber is a physician or dentist, that the
- 8 prescription was issued pursuant to an existing physician-patient
- 9 or dentist-patient relationship.
- 10 (b) That the prescription is authentic.
- 11 (c) That the prescribed drug is appropriate and necessary for
- 12 the treatment of an acute, chronic, or recurrent condition.
- 13 (3) A pharmacist or a prescriber shall dispense a prescription
- 14 only if the prescription falls within the scope of practice of the
- 15 prescriber.
- 16 (4) A pharmacist shall not knowingly dispense a prescription
- 17 after the death of the prescriber or patient.
- 18 (5) A pharmacist shall not dispense a drug or device under a
- 19 prescription transmitted by facsimile or created in electronic
- 20 format and printed out for use by the patient unless the document
- 21 is manually signed by the prescriber. This subsection does not
- 22 apply to a prescription that is transmitted by a computer to a
- 23 facsimile machine if that prescription complies with section 17754.
- 24 (6) After consultation with and agreement from the prescriber,
- 25 a pharmacist may add or change a patient's address, A dosage form,
- 26 A drug strength, A drug quantity, directions—A DIRECTION for use,
- 27 or AN issue date with regard to a prescription. A pharmacist shall

- 1 note the details of the consultation and agreement required under
- 2 this subsection on the prescription and shall maintain that
- 3 documentation with the prescription as required in section 17752. A
- 4 pharmacist shall not change the patient's name, controlled
- 5 substance prescribed unless authorized to dispense a lower cost
- 6 generically equivalent drug product under section 17755, or the
- 7 prescriber's signature with regard to a prescription.
- **8** (7) A prescription that is contained within a patient's chart
- 9 in a health facility or agency licensed under article 17 or other
- 10 medical institution and that is transmitted to a pharmacy under
- 11 section 17744 is the original prescription. If all other
- 12 requirements of this part are met, a pharmacist shall dispense a
- 13 drug or device under a prescription described in this subsection. A
- 14 pharmacist may dispense a drug or device under a prescription
- 15 described in this subsection even if the prescription does not
- 16 contain the quantity ordered. If a prescription described in this
- 17 subsection does not contain the quantity ordered, the pharmacist
- 18 shall consult with the prescriber to determine an agreed-upon
- 19 quantity. The pharmacist shall record the quantity dispensed on the
- 20 prescription and shall maintain that documentation with the
- 21 prescription as required in section 17752.
- 22 (8) IF, AFTER CONSULTING WITH A PATIENT, A PHARMACIST
- 23 DETERMINES IN THE EXERCISE OF HIS OR HER PROFESSIONAL JUDGMENT THAT
- 24 DISPENSING ADDITIONAL QUANTITIES OF A PRESCRIPTION DRUG IS
- 25 APPROPRIATE FOR THE PATIENT, THE PHARMACIST MAY DISPENSE, AT ONE
- 26 TIME, ADDITIONAL QUANTITIES OF THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG UP TO THE
- 27 TOTAL NUMBER OF DOSAGE UNITS AUTHORIZED BY THE PRESCRIBER ON THE

- 1 ORIGINAL PRESCRIPTION FOR THE PATIENT AND ANY REFILLS OF THE
- 2 PRESCRIPTION. EXCEPT FOR A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE INCLUDED IN
- 3 SCHEDULE 5 THAT DOES NOT CONTAIN AN OPIOID, THIS SUBSECTION DOES
- NOT APPLY TO A PRESCRIPTION FOR A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE. 4
- 5 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- after the date it is enacted into law.
