HOUSE BILL No. 4061

January 18, 2017, Introduced by Rep. Kosowski and referred to the Committee on Education Reform.

A bill to amend 1941 PA 207, entitled "Fire prevention code,"

by amending section 19 (MCL 29.19), as amended by 2014 PA 481.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 19. (1) The chief administrative officer and the teachers of all schools, including state supported schools, and the owner, or owner's representative, of all school dormitories shall have

CONDUCT a fire drill each month DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR and ensure unrestricted emergency egress during school hours and when the school is open to the public. Each teacher in a school, including a state supported school, and the owner or owner's representative of a school dormitory shall comply with these requirements and keep a record of the drills.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (3), a minimum of 8 fire

- 1 drills is required for each school year. If weather conditions do
- 2 not permit fire drills to be held at least NOT LESS THAN once a
- 3 month, then at least NOT FEWER THAN 5 fire drills shall MUST be
- 4 held in the fall of each year and 3 fire drills shall MUST be held
- 5 during the remaining part of the school year.
- **6** (3) A minimum of 5 fire drills is required for each school
- 7 year for a school that operates any of grades kindergarten to 12.
- 8 Three of the fire drills shall MUST be held by December 1 of the
- 9 school year, and 2 shall MUST be held during the remaining part of
- 10 the school year, with a reasonable spacing interval between each
- 11 drill.
- 12 (4) A minimum of 2 tornado safety drills is required for each
- 13 school year at the schools and facilities described in subsection
- 14 (1). At least 1 of the tornado safety drills shall MUST be
- 15 conducted during March of the school year. These drills shall MUST
- 16 be conducted for the purpose of preventing injuries caused by
- 17 severe weather.
- 18 (5) A minimum of THE GOVERNING BODY OF A SCHOOL THAT OPERATES
- 19 ANY OF GRADES KINDERGARTEN TO 12 SHALL ENSURE THAT NOT FEWER THAN 3
- 20 drills in which the occupants OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING are restricted
- 21 to the interior of the SCHOOL building ARE CONDUCTED and THAT the
- 22 SCHOOL building IS secured is required for each school year at a
- 23 school that operates any of grades kindergarten to 12. At least
- 24 DURING THE DRILLS. NOT FEWER THAN 1 of these drills shall MUST be
- 25 conducted by December 1 of the school year, and at least NOT FEWER
- 26 THAN 1 shall MUST be conducted after January 1 of the school year,
- 27 with a reasonable spacing interval between each drill. A drill

- 1 conducted under this subsection shall MUST include security
- 2 measures that are appropriate to an emergency such as the release
- 3 of a hazardous material or the presence of a potentially dangerous
- 4 individual on or near the premises. The governing body of a school
- 5 shall seek input from the administration of the school and local
- 6 public safety officials on the nature of the drills to be conducted
- 7 under this subsection. NOT MORE THAN 5 DAYS AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF
- 8 A DRILL UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE GOVERNING BODY OF A SCHOOL SHALL
- 9 NOTIFY THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE THAT THE DRILL HAS BEEN
- 10 CONDUCTED.
- 11 (6) A school that operates any of grades kindergarten to 12
- 12 shall conduct at least NOT FEWER THAN 1 of the drills required by
- 13 this section during a lunch or recess period, or at another time
- 14 when a significant number of the students are gathered but not in
- 15 the classroom.
- 16 (7) For a school that operates any of grades kindergarten to
- 17 12, the governing body of the school shall ensure that
- 18 documentation of a completed school safety drill is posted on its
- 19 website within NOT MORE THAN 30 school days after the drill is
- 20 completed and is maintained on the website for at least NOT LESS
- 21 THAN 3 years. For a school operated by a school district or
- 22 intermediate school district, the documentation may be posted on
- 23 the district website. The documentation posted on the website shall
- 24 MUST include at least all of the following:
- 25 (a) The name of the school.
- 26 (b) The school year of the drill.
- (c) The date and time of the drill.

- 1 (d) The type of drill completed.
- 2 (e) The number of completed drills for that school year for
- 3 each type of drill required under subsections (3) to $\frac{(5).(6)}{.}$
- 4 (f) The signature of the school principal or his or her
- 5 designee acknowledging the completion of the drill.
- 6 (g) The name of the individual in charge of conducting the
- 7 drill, if other than the school principal.
- 8 (8) Not later than September 15 of each school year, the chief
- 9 administrator of a school that operates any of grades kindergarten
- 10 to 12, or his or her designee, shall provide a list of the
- 11 scheduled drill days for the school buildings operated by the
- 12 school, school district, intermediate school district, or public
- 13 school academy to the county emergency management coordinator
- 14 appointed under section 9 of the emergency management act, 1976 PA
- 15 390, MCL 30.409. A scheduled drill that is not conducted on a
- 16 scheduled drill day due to conditions not within the control of
- 17 school authorities, such as severe storms, fires, epidemics,
- 18 utility power unavailability, water or sewer failure, or health
- 19 conditions as defined by the city, county, or state health
- 20 authorities, will not result in IS NOT a violation of this section
- 21 as long as IF the school conducts the minimum number of drills
- required under subsections (3), (4), and (5), the school
- 23 reschedules the drill to occur within NOT MORE THAN 10 school days
- 24 after the scheduled date of the canceled drill, and the chief
- 25 administrator notifies the county emergency management coordinator
- 26 of the rescheduled date for the drill. The county emergency
- 27 management coordinator shall provide this information to the

- 1 appropriate local emergency management coordinator appointed under
- 2 that section, SECTION 9 OF THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ACT, 1976 PA
- 3 390, MCL 30.409, if any, and, consistent with applicable federal,
- 4 state, and local emergency operations plans, to the department of
- 5 state police district coordinator and the county sheriff for the
- 6 county or the chief of police or fire chief for the municipality
- 7 where the school is located, or the designee of the sheriff, chief
- 8 of police, or fire chief. The information provided under this
- 9 subsection is exempt from disclosure under the freedom of
- 10 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 11 (9) A public school that operates any of grades kindergarten
- 12 to 12 shall not conduct a drill required under this section at a
- 13 time that would interfere with the conduct of a state-mandated
- 14 assessment.
- 15 (10) The state fire marshal, a fire chief, or a firefighter in
- 16 uniform acting under orders and directions of the fire chief may
- 17 cause fire drills to be held in school houses, school dormitories,
- 18 and other public buildings as the state fire marshal considers
- 19 advisable. The state fire marshal may order the installation of
- 20 other protective apparatus or equipment that conforms to recognized
- 21 and approved modern practices.
- 22 (11) The department of state police emergency management and
- 23 homeland security division shall develop a model to be used by a
- 24 school in conducting a drill under subsection (5).
- 25 (12) The governing body of a school that operates any of
- 26 grades kindergarten to 12 shall adopt and implement a cardiac
- 27 emergency response plan for the school. The cardiac emergency

- 1 response plan shall MUST address and provide for at least all of
- 2 the following:
- 3 (a) Use and regular maintenance of automated external
- 4 defibrillators, if available.
- 5 (b) Activation of a cardiac emergency response team during an
- 6 identified cardiac emergency.
- 7 (c) A plan for effective and efficient communication
- 8 throughout the school campus.
- 9 (d) If the school includes grades 9 to 12, a training plan for
- 10 the use of an automated external defibrillator and in
- 11 cardiopulmonary resuscitation techniques.
- 12 (e) Incorporation and integration of the local emergency
- 13 response system and emergency response agencies with the school's
- **14** plan.
- 15 (f) An annual review and evaluation of the cardiac emergency
- 16 response plan.
- 17 (13) As used in this section:
- 18 (a) "School" does not include a postsecondary educational
- 19 institution as defined in section 19a.
- 20 (b) "School dormitory" does not include a postsecondary
- 21 educational institution dormitory as defined in section 19a.
- 22 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 23 after the date it is enacted into law.
